## A Journey through the *Spiritual Hall of Fame*

### Hebrews 11 - Part 4

#### Section 1

##### Think about this:

1. Read Colossians 3:2. Both Jacob and Joseph were focused on the Exodus long before it happened. Are you making decisions based on your current comfort, or are you living with an “eternal exit” in mind?

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2. Joseph died before the promise was fulfilled, yet he was certain of the outcome. What is an “unfinished” prayer in your life that you can still trust God to answer, even if the timing isn’t yours?

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3. Jacob worshipped while leaning on the top of his staff. It’s a picture of dependence. Do you find it harder to trust God when you are strong and capable, or when you are forced to lean on Him?

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#### Section 2

##### Think about this:

1. Hebrews 11:23 begins with the faith of Moses’ parents, who were “not afraid of the king’s edict.” Are there areas where “worldly fear” is keeping you from protecting or nurturing the “holy things” God has placed in your care?

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2. Moses had to refuse his Egyptian status to embrace his identity as a child of God. What worldly labels or comforts are you being asked to “refuse” so that you can fully step into your spiritual calling?

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3. Moses compared the treasures of Egypt to the reproach of Christ and chose the latter. When you look at your life’s priorities, do you truly value God’s approval more than the temporary things of the world, such as comfort, status, or security?

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4. Verse 27 says he persevered because “he saw Him who is invisible.” In the middle of your wilderness seasons, what practical steps can you take to keep your eyes on the invisible God rather than the visible obstacles?

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### Section 3

#### Think about this:

1. What do you need to do to renew your mind and transform your thinking from how you “Feel” about something to what you know about God by asking yourself, “What does the Word/or God say about this?”

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
