

You'll hear how he fused Indian classical traditions with Western orchestral sounds to create a brand-new musical world.



A highly sought-after violinist, conductor and composer, Suraj authentically transcribes and performs Bollywood songs. He has amassed an international following on his YouTube channel "Suraj Nagaraj Violin" and his online music store "Nagaraj Music".

Sagar Nagaraj is an Australian-Indian violinist. He is the Artistic Director and Concertmaster of the Rosemont Chamber Orchestras and 1st Violin of the Rosemont String Quartet.

Having come through the Sydney and Australian Youth Orchestras, Sagar understands the importance of education and the profound impact of providing young musicians with opportunities.

In 2018, Sagar toured with the Australian World Orchestra across India, performing in Chennai, Mumbai, and in Kerala, sparking the idea for the Australian Indian Orchestra.


