GÜNEŞ MURAT TEZCÜR

Director

Güneş Murat Tezcür (Ph.D., University of Michigan, 2005) is the Director of the School of Politics and Global Studies at the Arizona State University. He is a scholar of comparative politics who explores political violence and politics of identity with a focus on Iranian, Kurdish, and Turkish human geography. His scholarship has appeared in many leading scholarly journals. His most recent book is Liminal Minorities: Religion and Mass Violence in Muslim Societies (Cornell University Press, 2024). He is also the editor of The Oxford Handbook of Turkish Politics (Oxford University Press, 2022) and Kurds and Yezidis in the Middle East: Shifting Identities, Borders, and the Experience of Minority Communities (I.B. Tauris, 2021). Prior to joining ASU in 2023, he was the Jalal Talabani Endowed Chair and Director at the School of Politics, Security, and International Affairs at the University of Central Florida.

GUEST SPEAKER



GREG STANTON

Congressman Arizona CD4

Throughout his career, Greg Stanton has worked tirelessly to deliver results for Arizona families. Serving as Phoenix mayor from 2012 to 2018, he focused on building an economy rooted in innovation and trade. Under his leadership, Phoenix created thousands of quality jobs and recently saw the highest wage growth in the nation.

Greg has earned a reputation for working across the aisle to get things done. His biggest accomplishments in Phoenix were passed with bipartisan support: the City's investment in the biosciences and higher education, support for small businesses, and national recognition for leadership on LGBT equality. In 2015, Stanton won reelection and successfully led one of the most ambitious transportation initiatives in the country—a bipartisan, voter-backed plan to extend Phoenix's light rail system, expand bus service, and improve thousands of miles of roadways over the next 35 years.

During his time in Congress, Stanton has focused on planning for the state's water future, investing in public transportation and infrastructure, building Arizona's economy of the future and lowering costs for working families.

Stanton is a member of the Transportation & Infrastructure Committee and the Foreign Affairs Committee.

Before his election as mayor, Greg served nine years on the Phoenix City Council and as Arizona's Deputy Attorney General. He attended Marquette University on the Harry S. Truman Scholarship, and earned a law degree from the University of Michigan.



JUNELLE CAVERO Arizona State Representative

appointed to the Arizona Cavero House Junelle was Representatives last April and re-elected in November 2024. She worked on six Democratic presidential campaigns, including Barack Obama, Hillary Clinton and Bernie Sanders. A national political consultant, small business owner and longtime community advocate, Cavero will add to the Arizona legislative caucus more than 25 years' of experience in federal government affairs, nonprofit management, political campaigns and business development.

Prior to creating Blue Knot Strategies and serving as the Executive Director of Emerge Arizona, she fought for WWII Filipino Veterans equity, served the Registrar at Americans International War Crimes Tribunal in the Hague, and worked on HealtheVet (HeV), the largest medical record program in the world at the US Department of Veteran Affairs. Today, she is an executive at My Code Media, the largest multicultural digital media company in the country, representing over 900 publications worldwide. She resides in South Phoenix with her family.



DAVID SCHEFFER Diplomat

David J. Scheffer is Professor of Practice in the School of Politics and Global Studies at Arizona State University's Washington, D.C., center. He also leads the national security programming of ASU's Leadership, Diplomacy and National Security Lab and its atrocity crimes projects. Scheffer was the Mayer Brown/Robert A. Helman Professor of Law (2006–20) at Northwestern University Pritzker School of Law and is director emeritus of its Center for International Human Rights. He was senior vice president of the U.N. Association of the U.S.A. (2002-2003) and vice-president of the American Society of International Law (2020–22). He held visiting professorships at Georgetown University Law Center (2003-2004) and George Washington University Law School (2004-2005), and the International Francqui Professorship at Katholieke Universiteit Leuven in Belgium in 2022. Scheffer was the UN Secretary-General's Special Expert on UN assistance to the Khmer Rouge Trials (2012–18) and the Tom A. Bernstein Genocide Prevention Fellow at the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum's Simon-Skjodt Center for the Prevention of Genocide (2019–21).

Scheffer was the first U.S. ambassador at large for war crimes issues (1997–2001), led the U.S. delegation to the UN talks establishing the International Criminal Court (ICC), and negotiated the creation of four other war crimes tribunals. During the first term of the Clinton Administration, he served as senior advisor and counsel to the U.S. Permanent Representative to the United Nations, Dr. Madeleine Albright, and on the Deputies Committee of the National Security Council.

Scheffer authored the award-winning All the Missing Souls: A Personal History of the War Crimes Tribunals (2011) and The Sit Room: In the Theater of War and Peace (2018). Scheffer earned degrees from Harvard College, Oxford University (where he was a Knox Fellow), and Georgetown University Law Center, and is a member of the New York, District of Columbia, and Supreme Court bars. He received the American Bar Association's 2024 Eleanor Roosevelt Prize for Global Human Rights Advancement, 2020 Dr. Jean Mayer Global Citizenship Award of Tufts University, 2019 Champion of Justice Award of the Center for Justice and Accountability, and 2013 Berlin Prize.


