14TH ANNUAL SESSION

This year's theme "Balancing Global Rights and Responsibilities" highlights the profound volatility of global affairs and how that weighs against the responsibility of member states to protect their citizens while promoting justice for all in the international community. Today, war and conflict are as prevalent as ever. But in the pursuit of stability, attention to advancing rights for minority groups, combating environmental crises, and building equitable infrastructure is dwindling. Nations are at a loss on how to prioritize these different agendas while maintaining global security.

SunMUN hopes to tackle these complex issues in its seven committees of General Assembly, UN Environmental Programme, the Economic & Social Council, Human Rights Council, Security Council and a double delegated Historical Committee of the "First All-Russian Congress of Soviets". CHRISTINE MARSH Arizona State Senator

Christine Marsh's roots run deep in her legislative district, as she not only grew up there but still resides just a few blocks away from her childhood home. She is a dedicated mother of two sons, has previously served as a foster parent, and currently holds positions on the Senate Education, Transportation, and Judiciary Committee.

In her first term in the Senate, she got straight to work on solving the problems which impact everyday Arizonans. She shepherded lifesaving harm reduction legislation through the state legislature to legalize testing strips for fentanyl. She also led the fight against what would have been incredibly dangerous cuts to our public schools.

Even with her responsibilities in the State Senate, Christine remains committed to her teaching profession and maintains her daily running routine in the nearby Mountain Preserve. Her outstanding contributions to education were recognized in 2016 when she was honored as Arizona Teacher of the Year.

This prestigious title afforded her the opportunity to traverse the state, gaining firsthand insights into the challenges faced by Arizona's students and communities and bring that knowledge to the State Legislature.



GUEST SPEAKER

ADRIAN FONTES

Secretary of State

In 2022, Adrian Fontes was elected as Arizona's 21st Secretary of State. Secretary Fontes is a proud Arizona native, an honorable veteran of the United States Marine Corps, and the father of three daughters, who has spent a lifetime fighting for justice and defending our Democracy.

Secretary Fontes served on active duty from 1992 to 1996 and was nominated for a meritorious commission. His service to our country taught him the importance of dedication, discipline, and sacrifice to forcefully fight for the American dream.

After graduating from law school, Secretary Fontes spent his career advocating for justice and fighting for those who are disadvantaged — first as a prosecutor with the Denver District Attorney and then at the Maricopa County Attorney's office. He later led the International Prosecution Unit at the Arizona Attorney General's Office. He practiced law for 15 years before running for office in 2016 when he was elected Maricopa County Recorder.

As Recorder, Secretary Fontes revolutionized the election system by ensuring that every eligible Arizonan had the access they needed to vote. Adrian enhanced ballot tracking technology and increased process transparency, winning recognition and awards from election organizations across the country.

In 2020, at the height of the Covid-19 crisis and amidst violent protests, Maricopa County saw record voter turnout, as well as record numbers of new voters registered for both parties. Secretary Fontes later testified before Congress to inform them of threats facing election officials.

Secretary Fontes is committed to preserving integrity in our elections, making voting easier for registered voters, and ensuring that Arizona's business community has a non-partisan partner in the Secretary's office.

David A. Merkel is an accomplished American geo-strategist and former government official with expertise in diverse regions, including Europe, Eurasia, Southeast Asia, the Middle East, and Africa. He held senior positions in various U.S. government departments, including the White House, Department of State, and Treasury. Merkel played a pivotal role in negotiating key agreements and shaping U.S. foreign policy. Notably, he served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for European and Eurasian Affairs, negotiating the US-Ukraine Strategic Partnership and contributing to regional stability.

Merkel's government service was marked by honors, including the Exceptional Service Award. He also provided expertise to international organizations and received the NATO Star award for his contributions to European security. Beyond government roles, he actively participates in academic and advisory boards, reflecting his commitment to education and global diplomacy.

Merkel's academic background includes a B.B.A. in Economics from the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) and an M.Sc. with Merit in International Strategy and Diplomacy. He is a regular contributor to prestigious publications, further enhancing his influence in international affairs.


