MISSIONARY: DR. HECTOR NEWMAN



Born and raised in La Ceiba, Honduras, Hector accepted Jesus as his Savior at the age of 16. His family emigrated to the U.S. in 1966 where he finished his High School education.

Receiving a call from the Lord into the ministry, Hector earned a bachelor's degree in theology, a Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees. He was ordained in 1976 with the American Baptist Churches. Hector pastored in Boston before returning to Honduras as a missionary in 2001, he founded the International Community of Love Church.

Since then he has been used of the Lord to plant over 25 churches, various schools, and the El Arca Camp and Retreat Center.

MEDICAL OUTREACH

In general, medical treatment in Honduras is significantly cheaper compared to the United States and other developed countries. However, the cost of medical treatment can vary depending on the level of care needed, the location of the hospital or clinic, and the availability of medical equipment and supplies. In urban areas such as Tegucigalpa and San Pedro Sula, private hospitals and clinics offer high-quality medical treatment, but the cost of care can still be relatively expensive. On the other hand, public hospitals and clinics offer more affordable healthcare services, but they may have limited resources and longer wait times.

In rural areas, medical facilities and services may be more basic, and patients may need to travel to urban centers for more specialized care. It is important to note that medical insurance is not widely used in Honduras, and most medical expenses are paid out of pocket.



As a result, our ministry has set up free medical brigades in poverty stricken areas to provide assistance with common medical issues that can be treated.

MINISTRIES:

Orfelina works with families in the northern regions of Honduras to help them understand how to transform their families and communities through agriculture. The list of things she does is mindboggling: Checking on local farmers' harvest. Monitoring water projects. Teaching the women in the community how to prepare more nutritious meals for their families. Chatting up community leaders for support. Running workshops for things like creating organic fertilizers and sprays.

But Orfelina doesn't just work with farmers and their families, she supports and encourages them. Visiting them in their homes. Bringing God's light to everyone she meets. And all of this is made possible through your giving to One Great Hour of Sharing. Because of your giving, projects like these and thousands more around the world are changing lives. 
