Please register with BASS prior to team registration to provide your BASS number on your registration.

\$50-\$75 Boat Captain Support

\$50-\$75 will be collected from each Angler at the meeting prior to the tournament in that month to help supplement the costs for the boat captains. This helps pay for fuel on the vehicle and boat. The captain fee will depend on the distance traveled from Cedar Rapids. Captain fee will be announced the month prior. The captain fee will be paid to the club director, prior to the tournament. If the captain refuses the payment, the funds will return to the club account. Please remember, the captain fee does not cover our volunteers expenses. This is simply a token of appreciation for their time and commitment to our club.
Each non-boater must pay this fee to the club director prior to the tournament, in order to fish.

\$60.00 - Team Jersey

A team jersey must be worn at our tournaments. The jersey may be from years past if a new jersey is not purchased. You may not wear a jersey from another team, or your personal jersey.



Team Expectations

• Meeting attendance

- You must attend 4 regular meetings, but encourage you to attend as many as you can. Meetings will not be streamed via Zoom or otherwise.
- Tournament attendance
 - You must attend a minimum of three regular season tournaments to participate in the state tournament with Eastern Iowa Bassmasters.
 - After the first four tournaments, high school and junior anglers may pair up for the remaining tournaments in preparation for the State tournament. You must attend a minimum of two of the first four tournaments in order to select your partner for the rest of the season.

• Volunteer opportunity attendance

- You must attend 2 volunteer opportunities but encourage you to attend more.
- Sponsorships
 - As a non-profit, we operate entirely on sponsorships. We ask that each angler reach out to friends, family, or businesses for support. There is no specific expectation, but we do ask for your help. If you have a connection for a potential sponsorship but would like the club director to make that contact, please let us know. We encourage you to draft a letter or an email to send to friends and family. Your club director can also provide a letter for you to use to help you get started. We do not do club fundraisers, as of yet.

We understand that there are many other life events. We do our very best to communicate all up and coming events to plan well in advance.

Award Opportunities

In November of each year we will award an Angler of the Year for both the Junior and High School division. Member of the Year is also awarded for both divisions. Additionally, a Big Bass award is given for the largest bass of the season as well. Both the Angler of the Year and Member of the Year award is determined on a points system. These points not only come from your tournament performance, but also club attendance. There may be other opportunities throughout the season to earn additional points as well, which will be determined by the club director. For a full explanation of the points system, please speak with one of our board members, Jake Gondek and review the provided documentation on award eligibility.



Boats

Not everyone has a boat. We do everything we can to find volunteers to accommodate those that do not have a boat. If we do not have enough boats we will draw names for those that need a spot. Those that did not have a spot for the current tournament will be 1st to have a spot at the next tournament. All anglers without a boat are still welcome to fish from the banks at the event. We will not fish three from a boat. The third angler will fish from the shore line. We are always looking for volunteers for boats and captains.

All high school members must provide their own boat captain for each tournament. Please speak with your club director for ideas on finding a captain if you need assistance. Additionally, once you have been in the club for two years at the Junior level, you also will be asked to provide your own captain.

Boaters Certification

If you are 18 or over operating as your own captain, and participating as an angler, you *must* complete an approved Boaters Safety Course and submit proof to the director.

Boat Requirements

- 16 foot or longer
- Steering wheel (No stick steering)
- Working livewell with aerator/re-circulators
- Operable kill switch and lanyard

There are no exceptions to the boat requirements

Tournament Rules

We follow all Bassmaster High School Rules. The tournament director holds the final decision on rules.

Eastern Iowa Bassmasters Points system

Eastern Iowa Bassmasters presents two major awards in each division every year: Angler of the Year and Member of the Year. Each award has specific criteria, which will be outlined below.

Our organization is divided into two divisions: **High School** and **Juniors**. At the end of the year, we will recognize one **Angler of the Year** and one **Member of the Year** from each division. It is also possible for an individual to earn both awards in the same year

Angler of the Year:

To earn **Angler of the Year** in your division, you must achieve the highest total bag weight by the end of the season. Bag weights will be recorded across our seven scheduled tournaments throughout the year. However, weights from fishing trails, state, and national tournaments will not be included in the final total. In the event of a tie, the angler with the highest Big Bass weight will be declared the winner.

Updated bag weights will be posted on our website the Sunday following each tournament. These totals will remain visible until the final two tournaments, at which point they will be removed to maintain the suspense until the end-of-year banquet.

Member of the Year:

To earn **Member of the Year,** you must accumulate the **highest number of points** in your division. Maximizing your points requires active participation in monthly club meetings, volunteer events, and fishing tournaments. While tournament performance contributes to your score, the point system prioritizes overall involvement. This means you can achieve Member of the Year without being Angler of the Year. There are 3 ways to earn points in the club.

- 1. Participating in fishing tournaments (max of 100)
- 2. Participating in monthly meetings (100)
- 3. Participating in club volunteer events (200)
- 4. Big Bass (20 first time)



1. Fishing tournament points system (100):

Fishing tournaments have a maximum of **100 points**. Your ranking is determined by total bag weight, with first place earning **100 points**, second place receiving **99 points**, and so on. If you participate in a tournament but don't bring in any fish, you'll tie for last place and receive the same number of points as others in the same situation. Similarly, if multiple anglers have **identical bag weights**, they will tie for that placement and receive the **same number of points**. See the example below for clarificatio

Example fishing tournament points:

- First place (4.5lbs) 100 points
- Second place (3.5lbs, tied)- 99 point
- Second place (3.5lbs, tied) 99 points
- 3rd place (3.2lbs) 97 points*
- 4th place (3.0lbs) 96 points
- No fish caught 95 points
- No fish caught 95 points

* The position for "**98 points**" is skipped because of the tie. If there were three 2nd place ties then the position for "**98** and **97** points" would be skipped. 3rd place would receive **96** points.

2. Monthly meeting points system (100):

Attending a monthly club meeting is just as valuable as winning a tournament, as both are worth the same number of points. This system encourages anglers to participate in both **club meetings** and **tournaments**. In a tournament, only **one angler per division** will earn **100 points** for placing first. However, **everyone** who attends a club meeting will receive **100 points**, encouraging active participation in both aspects of the club.

3. Club volunteer event points system (200):

Community volunteer events are a vital part of our club. Without the support of sponsors and the community, we wouldn't have the funding needed to operate. To emphasize their importance, each volunteer event is worth **200 points**—making it the **best opportunity** to earn points throughout the year.

4. Big Bass (20 first time):

The Big Bass award goes to the angler who catches the largest bass, regardless of division. Your first Big Bass win of the season earns you **20 points**. If you win again in the same season, it's worth **10 points**. For a third win and beyond, each additional Big Bass earns you **5 points**.

- First Big Bass 20 Points
- Second Big Bass win 10 Points
- 3rd or more Big Bass 5 Points each
