ANGLER/BOAT CAPTAIN PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT

1. COMPLIANCE

This Angler/Boat Captain Participation Agreement and the 2026 Bassmaster High School Series Tournament Rules, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference, (the Participation Agreement and Official Rules collectively referred to herein as the "Agreement") sets forth the terms and conditions upon which I will be permitted to participate in any or all Bassmaster High School Series Tournament Events (the "Tournament Series") during the 2026 calendar year. By signing this Agreement, the undersigned (referred to as "I", "Competitor", or "Angler" or "Boat Captain"), hereby agree to be bound by and comply with the provisions thereof. I also agree to abide by and comply with the B.A.S.S. Angler Code of Conduct and all other guidelines, regulations, payment schedules and instructions communicated to me in writing by B.A.S.S. I affirm that I am a member in good standing with B.A.S.S. and that I am physically fit and that there are no health-related reasons or problems which preclude my participation in the Tournament Series.

2. RELEASE OF LIABILITY; INDEMNIFICATION

2.1 I expressly assume all risks associated with my participation in the Tournament Series and for myself, my executors, administrators, heirs, next of kin, successors and assigns, I hereby waive, release and discharge B.A.S.S., LLC, agents employees, owners, its respective affiliates and subsidiaries (collectively "B.A.S.S."), the hosts, sponsors and Tournament Series officials (collectively "Released Parties") from any and all losses, liabilities, claims, damages and expenses (including without limitation, attorney's fees and related costs) of any kind (hereinafter "Claims") arising out of or in connection with my participation in the Tournament Series including but not limited to Claims involving, death, disability, personal injury and/or property damage. I hereby agree to INDEMNIFY, DEFEND, HOLD HARMLESS AND PROMISE NOT TO SUE the Released

Parties for any and all Claims arising as a result of my participation in this Tournament, whether brought by me or my agents/legal representatives or by third parties relating to my participation in this Tournament. I acknowledge that this Tournament may carry with it the potential for death, serious injury, illness and/or possible exposure to COVID-19 or other communicable diseases and personal loss. The risks may include, but are not limited to, those caused by water conditions, temperature, weather, equipment, actions of other people including, but not limited to, participants, volunteers and spectators. This release of liability shall be construed broadly to provide a release and waiver to the maximum extent permissible under applicable law.

2.2 I shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Released Parties against all Claims, whether or not a lawsuit or other proceeding is filed, to the extent that they arise out of: (1) my breach of the terms of this Agreement; (2) gross negligence or willful misconduct by me, my agents or those acting on my behalf; (3) my violation of any applicable law, ordinance, rule or regulation, including but not limited to all rules and guidelines applicable to Tournament Series events; (4) breach of any warranty provided by me to Released Parties hereunder. I shall provide B.A.S.S. with prompt notice of any claim and give complete control of its defense and settlement to B.A.S.S. I shall also cooperate in all reasonable respects with B.A.S.S., its insurance company, the Released Parties (as applicable) and their legal counsel in the defense of such a claim. If I fail to promptly indemnify and defend a covered claim, the Released Parties shall have the right to defend themselves, and in such case, I shall promptly reimburse the Released Parties for all of their associated costs and expenses.

3. GRANT OF RIGHTS

3.1 For good and valuable consideration, including but not limited to B.A.S.S. allowing the angler participation in the Tournament, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I hereby irrevocably grant permission to B.A.S.S., the successors and assigns of each of the foregoing, and each of their respective agents, licensees, designees, and assigns and those other parties acting under such parties' permission or upon their authority (collectively, with B.A.S.S., the "Licensees"), in perpetuity, a worldwide, non-exclusive, royalty-free, fully paid-up license and non-revocable right to reproduce, display, exhibit, publish, broadcast, distribute, and otherwise use, and permit others to use, my name, image, nickname, initials, symbols, likeness, signature, photograph, voice, statements, performances, actions, biographical material, and any and all attributes of my personality and appearance (collectively, my "Identity") in materials created in connection with my participation in the Tournament Series and related events and activities of B.A.S.S. (collectively, the "Materials"), alone or in combination with any other materials, in connection with any B.A.S.S.-authorized production, collectibles, merchandise or publication, including, but not limited to, in connection with the promotion of B.A.S.S., the Tournament Series and any other events or programs staged by B.A.S.S., in any and all manner and media now known or hereafter devised, including without limitation, in print, within television programs, motion pictures, websites, social media channels, including without limitation, physical or digital trading cards or other collectible merchandise, public

relations materials and for any other lawful purpose in B.A.S.S.'s sole discretion. For clarity, the foregoing shall also include the right to use my Identity in connection with the publicity, advertising, promotion, exhibition or other exploitation of the Materials, including, but not limited to, my appearance at and / or performance during the Tournament Series and related events and activities and my inclusion within any of the Materials. I agree to promptly and fully comply with all filming, camera location and other rules, guidelines and instructions of B.A.S.S. during each Tournament Series.

3.2 I hereby represent and warrant that I have the right to grant these rights and that my granting these rights will not infringe upon the rights of any third party. I represent and warrant that I have or shall obtain all necessary rights and permissions from all applicable third parties (i.e., those sponsoring or affiliated with me or my team and boat) to effectuate the grant of rights set forth in this paragraph 3 (collectively, the "Third Party Rights"). I will ensure that these Third Party Rights grant (or otherwise authorize or permit) B.A.S.S. and the other Licensees the right to utilize such third-party logos, insignia, trade dress or other intellectual property (collectively "Third Party IP") shown in any Materials featuring me, or otherwise in connection with B.A.S.S.'s use of my Identity as set forth in paragraph 3.1 (for example, on apparel worn by me or on items used by me), and neither B.A.S.S. nor any other Licensee shall be required to seek approvals from such Third Parties for such uses of the Third-Party IP. I agree to defend, hold harmless and indemnify B.A.S.S. and each of the Licensees from and against, any and all third-party claims, damages, costs (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of claims alleging that I do not have the right to grant the foregoing license and permission with respect to Third Party IP.

3.3 I acknowledge that the Licensees have no obligation to use any or all of the Materials or my Identity. I hereby waive any right that I may have to inspect or approve any finished product or the use to which it is applied and I agree no further approval is required for the Licensees to use any Materials or my Identity and that the Licensees will not be liable to me for any distortion or illusionary effect resulting from the exhibition, publication or broadcast of the Materials or my Identity. I acknowledge and agree that no further payment or consideration will be due to me for any of the Licensees' use of the Materials or my Identity as authorized herein.

3.4 I acknowledge that all right, title, and interest in and to the Materials, including without limitation all copyrights and trademark rights, shall be the sole and exclusive property of B.A.S.S. and that B.A.S.S. has the unlimited right in perpetuity and throughout the universe to edit, modify, distribute and otherwise use such Materials. With regard to the Licensees' exploitation of the rights granted hereunder, I, on behalf of myself and my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, hereby irrevocably (a) release, discharge and waive all claims, demands, losses and liabilities of any nature against the Licensees that I, my personal representatives, agents, heirs, executors, administrators and assigns had, now have, or hereafter may have, including, but not limited to, claims in the nature of copyright or other intellectual property infringement, defamation, disparagement, slander, false light, violation of the right of privacy or publicity, or the like, and (b) covenant

not to make any claims against any of the Licensees with respect to the rights granted hereunder.

3.5 During the Tournament Series, and subject to compliance with B.A.S.S. guidelines, B.A.S.S. hereby grants to the undersigned Angler/Boat Captain, the right to create, use and publish Angler created materials (“Angler Materials”) such as still photos and video shot by Angler, solely on Angler’s website and social media channels.

4. INSURANCE

I represent and warrant that I now have or will obtain prior to the Tournament Series, boat owners liability insurance (including coverage for third party property damage and bodily injury) with no “tournament exclusion,” having a minimum limit of \$300,000 per occurrence. The insurance will be primary and noncontributory to any insurance procured by B.A.S.S. Additionally, the insurance must be issued by a reputable insurer rated A or better by A.M. Best and Company. Policy must include international waters, or a separate policy for international waters must be obtained if I choose to fish international waters during applicable B.A.S.S. events. I shall provide B.A.S.S. with a certificate of insurance covering the term of the Tournament series prior to my participation in any Tournament Series event or at any time requested by B.A.S.S.

5. MISCELLANEOUS

5.1 Contingency Programs. Contingency programs are sponsor-funded programs developed to reward Anglers based on a predefined set of criteria. Participation in contingency programs is at the Angler’s discretion.

5.2 Other Events. If Angler or Boat Captain elects to participate in other B.A.S.S.-sanctioned tournaments, Angler will be required to execute a Participation Agreement containing the applicable rules and regulations, code of conduct and Tournament Series specific content such as wrapped boat and jersey guidelines.

5.3 Additional Requirements. Angler/Boat Captain agrees to participate in programs recommended or developed by B.A.S.S. that promote the growth of the sport and to fully support programs intended to raise awareness of my individual angler brand and identity.

6. LEGAL

6.1 Credibility assessment administered via Polygraph. By registering and signing the Participation Agreement, Angler and/or Boat Captain agrees to submit to a credibility assessment at any time during the Tournament series and abide by its conclusion and hereby waives any expectation of privacy relation to his participation in the Tournament series.

6.2 Communication. Angler/Boat Captain must provide B.A.S.S. with a current email address. Angler agrees that delivery of any notice, communication, guideline or

instruction to Angler via email shall constitute notice to Angler and shall comply with any notice requirements set forth herein. Angler must also provide a United States provider personal cell number capable of receiving text messages from B.A.S.S.

6.3 Governing Law, Venue and Jurisdiction. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in all respects in accordance with the substantive laws of the state of Alabama, without regard to its choice of law and/or conflicts of law principles.

6.4 Miscellaneous. If any provision of this Agreement is determined to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall in no way affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision herein. This Agreement along with the Code of Ethics, Official Rules, etc. sets forth the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous oral and/or written representations, discussions, negotiations, understandings and/or agreements relating to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may not be modified except by an instrument in writing signed by both parties. In signing this document, I am not relying on any promises, representations or other statements that are not contained in this Agreement.

6.5 Electronic Signature. The execution of this document by electronic mail or by any other electronic or digital means shall be deemed to constitute effective execution of this document. Any signature transmitted by facsimile, email or other electronic or digital means shall be deemed an original signature for all purposes.

6.6 Arbitration. Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement, or the breach, invalidity, enforceability, arbitrability, or interpretation thereof, shall be settled by arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association in accordance with its Commercial Arbitration Rules, and judgment on the award, which shall be rendered by a single arbitrator, may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. B.A.S.S. and the Angler agree that no arbitrator shall have authority to conduct a class or collective proceeding, or to join or consolidate any claim with the claim of another person. To the extent permitted by applicable law, all claims must be brought solely in B.A.S.S.'s or the Angler's individual capacity, and not as a plaintiff or class member in any purported class or collective proceeding. All mediations arising under this provision shall take place in Birmingham, Alabama, and the Angler consents to that forum and waives all objections to the propriety or convenience of that arbitration forum.

6.7 Requirement for Consent of Parent or Guardian. If I am under the age of majority in the state in which I reside, I understand that I must have the consent of my parent or guardian to participate in the Tournament Series. I agree to provide accurate and complete information to B.A.S.S. to facilitate B.A.S.S.'s efforts to secure such consent. I acknowledge that my failure to provide accurate information or secure consent from my parent or guardian may result in my disqualification from the Tournament Series.

Content Usage Guidelines

B.A.S.S. holds the content rights to the tournaments it owns and operates. However, B.A.S.S. grants certain exceptions, including the following content rights, to tournament participants:

- Anglers may use video or still images, shot by the angler during a tournament, for promotional or marketing purposes on the Angler's owned website and social media channels. During tournaments B.A.S.S. may ask to mount a POV streaming camera in a competitor's boat (the footage may be used in B.A.S.S.'s web or TV coverage). B.A.S.S. may also request the non-boater or a Partner operate these, or other (POV, smartphone or other) cameras. A competitor is required to comply, even if he already has a personal camera mounted in his boat. Refusing to comply may result in a penalty.
- If a competitor has a personal camera person or crew following him on the water, that person or team must not get in the way of Bassmaster photographers or videographers who are covering the tournament. Off the water, they must follow the general guidelines of any media covering the tournament as set forth by B.A.S.S. Communications.
- B.A.S.S. also encourages anglers to send photos, videos and updates to update@bassmaster.com for exposure on Bassmaster.com and our social media pages.
- In social media, you may use our hashtag #bassmaster or tag @bass_nation on Instagram to amplify and spread your post to our millions of fans. B.A.S.S. also encourages anglers to tag B.A.S.S. in relevant content so that we are able to share (where applicable). For an updated list of B.A.S.S. social visit: bassmaster.com/social

B.A.S.S. reserves the right to modify or revoke these exceptions for any reason, and, upon request, Anglers must modify or remove any content violating these exceptions

B.A.S.S. wants to help promote both your brand and the sport of professional bass fishing through its multimedia assets. If there are stories written about you or by you appearing on Bassmaster.com, B.A.S.S. grants permission to link to these stories, and any others on our website, from your website or social media pages. You may also grab photos from Bassmaster.com to promote yourself. Please do credit Bassmaster.com.

I UNDERSTAND I MUST SIGN AND DATE THIS AGREEMENT PRIOR TO PARTICIPATING IN THIS EVENT, AND THAT IF I AM UNDER THE AGE OF MAJORITY IN THE STATE IN WHICH I RESIDE, I MUST OBTAIN THE CONSENT OF A PARENT OR GUARDIAN TO ENTER INTO THIS AGREEMENT. MY REGISTRATION IS NOT COMPLETE UNTIL B.A.S.S. ACKNOWLEDGES RECEIPT AND ACCEPTANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT, RECEIVES THE CONSENT OF MY PARENT OR GUARDIAN (IF APPLICABLE) AND RECEIVES ALL OTHER NECESSARY DOCUMENTS. THE TOURNAMENT OFFICIALS RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DENY MY PARTICIPATION IN THE TOURNAMENT SERIES OR ANY COMPONENT

THEREOF FOR ANY REASON AND, UPON SUCH DENIAL, TO REFUND THE DEPOSIT OR ENTRY FEE.

I ATTEST THAT I HAVE READ AND HAVE UNDERSTOOD THIS THE PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT AND THE TOURNAMENT OFFICIAL RULES. I UNDERSTAND THAT BY SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT, WHICH CONTAINS LIABILITY AND OTHER RELEASE LANGUAGE, I HAVE GIVEN UP SUBSTANTIAL RIGHTS. I HAVE VOLUNTARILY SIGNED THIS AGREEMENT. I ACKNOWLEDGE THAT PRIOR TO SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT, I HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO CONSULT WITH AN ATTORNEY TO REVIEW THE TERMS CONTAINED HEREIN. I HAVE VOLUNTARILY SIGNED THIS AGREEMENT.

BASSMASTER HIGH SCHOOL SERIES

OFFICIAL RULES

Effective January 1, 2026

1. RULES AND PENALTIES:

A. The following rules shall apply to all B.A.S.S. High School Series Tournament Events, with the following exceptions: (i) rules for special tournaments may differ from those contained herein and (ii) these rules may be changed by B.A.S.S. immediately upon notice by B.A.S.S. to its members, which notice may be published on the B.A.S.S. internet site at Bassmaster.com. Interpretation and enforcement of these rules shall be left exclusively to the Tournament Director or his/her designee at a tournament. In the event of a rule violation, the Tournament Director or a rules committee may impose such sanctions as deemed appropriate by them, including without limitation, disqualification, forfeiture of prize, and prohibition from participation in subsequent tournaments. Subject to the appeal process set forth in Paragraph 21 below, the decision of the Tournament Director, his/her designee or the rules committee shall be final in all matters.

B. Except for very serious rules violations, as determined by B.A.S.S., such as the no-information and off-limits rules and any rules that might lead to disqualification of an angler from participation in the High School Series tournaments or other B.A.S.S. circuits, rules violations must be reported to tournament officials within 24 hours of the final flight check-in on the day of the alleged violation.

C. Penalties for rules violations may include the following:

- (a) Reduction of practice hours or competition hours for current and/or future events as determined by the Tournament Director.
- b) Loss of one or more fish in question. All such fish must be marked verified by either your partner or boat captain. If not verified the entire catch may be disqualified.
- (c) Loss of catch for the day of the violation.
- (d) Disqualification from the tournament in question.

- (e) Disqualification from future B.A.S.S. events, which may be from a specific number of events, a specific period of time or may be a lifetime disqualification.
- (f) Any different or additional penalties determined by the Tournament Director.

2. PARTICIPANTS AND ELIGIBILITY:

A. Participation in this tournament series is by invitation only. You must be a student currently enrolled in high school, in good academic standing and a member of your institution's fishing team or an official community club on file with B.A.S.S. Only one club from each institution is allowed. Certain schools allow eighth-grade students to compete. If your institution allows eighth-grade students to compete, a letter must be submitted with a faculty member's signature stating this permission. Seventh-grade students are not allowed to compete in Bassmaster High School Series Tournament Events. Competitors will be considered an "incoming student" into the next grade once they have completed their final exams in their current grade. They will then be able to participate in events once the aforementioned criteria have been met and they are in the admissible grade bracket to compete. Graduating seniors will be extended a grace period and allowed to compete in the summer months once their senior year has been completed. They will not be allowed to fish in any events that are qualifying for the next calendar school year. This is a team event. This tournament is open only to current members of official high school clubs, recognized by said high school or an official community club. Students must belong to the same official high school club or official community club to compete as a team in this tournament. If extenuating circumstances exist that prohibit you from having a partner in the tournament, then a request must be submitted to B.A.S.S. and your State Youth Director in writing for approval. B.A.S.S. reserves the right to accept or deny such request.

B. Multiple clubs from the same institution, including community clubs, are not allowed. Anglers must fish in the community club nearest to their place of residence. Community clubs can incorporate multiple institutions. Students from those institutions must all be a member of the same community club.

C. Each participating team must have a coach (boat captain). Boat captains must be of the age that would place them out of high school. Each team is subject to the boat captain coaching rules. All the rules in this document and the coaching rules document must be followed. Failure to follow these rules may result in penalties as laid out in this document.

D. Employees, officers and directors of B.A.S.S. or its parent, subsidiary and affiliated companies and members of their immediate families (spouse, parents, children and siblings, regardless of where they live) are ineligible. Proof of grade or graduation date, to the satisfaction of tournament officials, is the responsibility of the potential competitor. Any candidate for competition who, in the judgment of the Tournament Director, is disabled

in such a manner as to unfairly hinder his/her partner or endanger the safety and well-being of his/her partner or themselves shall not be eligible.

E. DURING THE OFFICIAL PRACTICE AND COMPETITION DAYS OF ANY B.A.S.S. TOURNAMENT, NO COMPETITOR MAY OPERATE A BOAT UNLESS THAT CONTESTANT HAS DOCUMENTED PROOF OF A MINIMUM OF \$300,000, PER OCCURRENCE, IN BOAT OWNERS' LIABILITY INSURANCE (see Angler Participation Agreement for full details) COVERING THE BOAT BEING USED IN THE TOURNAMENT. PROOF OF INSURANCE MUST BE WITH THE BOAT BEING USED AND MUST COVER ALL PASSENGERS IN THAT BOAT. RANDOM CHECKS WILL BE CONDUCTED AND ANY COMPETITOR WHO DOES NOT HAVE PROOF OF IN-FORCE INSURANCE meeting all requirements listed in Angler Participation Agreement may be disqualified. EACH POLICY MUST SHOW AN EFFECTIVE START AND EXPIRATION DATE. Tournament officials have sole authority to determine if insurance policies meet B.A.S.S. requirements.

F. A PROPERLY COMPLETED AND ELECTRONICALLY SIGNED TOURNAMENT RULES AND WAIVER MUST BE SUBMITTED TO B.A.S.S. TOURNAMENT ADMINISTRATIVE TEAM BEFORE THE REGISTRATION ENTRY DUE DATE FOR THE EVENT(S) IN WHICH YOU ARE COMPETING. YOU ARE ONLY REQUIRED TO COMPLETE ONE TOURNAMENT RULES AND WAIVER PER YEAR FOR THE COLLEGE SERIES. THE TOURNAMENT RULES AND WAIVER FORM CAN BE FOUND ONLINE AT: BASSMASTER.COM/HIGH-SCHOOL. All competitors must complete a W-9 and, when required, a Form 590 or W-8 BEN provided by B.A.S.S. (one time). Any new entries received after the entry due date will be subject to a \$50 late fee per team. ENTRY FEES ARE NONREFUNDABLE AND NONTRANSFERABLE REGARDLESS OF DATE OF CANCELLATION ONCE YOU HAVE BEEN CONFIRMED IN A TOURNAMENT. ANGLERS WHO ARE ON THE WAITLIST WILL BE REFUNDED THE ENTRY FEE IF YOU HAVE NOT BEEN CONFIRMED IN THE TOURNAMENT FOR WHICH YOU REGISTERED.

The Tournament Director reserves the right to discontinue acceptance of applications prior to deadline and also the right to extend the acceptance date.

As a participant in B.A.S.S. tournaments, you agree, if you qualify and are invited to be a competitor in the Bassmaster Classic High School Exhibition conducted by B.A.S.S., to use during the Bassmaster Classic High School Exhibition, any and all official products and equipment so specified and provided by B.A.S.S.

3. ANGLER CODE OF CONDUCT:

A. Anglers and boat captains participating in any B.A.S.S.-sanctioned event shall observe this code of conduct and the applicable rules for the specific event in which they are participating. Anglers, parents and family members of anglers shall, at all times, conduct themselves in a manner becoming of professional anglers that will not reflect

unfavorably on B.A.S.S., its members, officers or representatives, tournaments or sponsors. To this end, anglers, parents, coaches, faculty members, friends and family members of anglers shall use their best efforts to demonstrate professionalism and integrity in support of the sport of professional fishing. Any angler, parents and family members of anglers who violate any of the provisions of the Angler Code of Conduct may be subject to forfeiture of tournament winnings, suspension from competing in individual B.A.S.S.-sanctioned events, permanent ban from competition or any combination thereof deemed appropriate by B.A.S.S.

B. Anglers are frequently in the public eye and are considered role models; therefore, it is imperative that tournament competitors demonstrate good sportsmanship in fishing. Sportsmanship is defined as fair play, respect for opponents and polite behavior while competing in the sport.

C. Following are examples of unacceptable behavior by competitors in B.A.S.S. events that will be cause for penalties as outlined in this document.

- Heated public disagreements with B.A.S.S. officials, other competitors and fans and volunteers during an event.
- Public attacks through media, including social media, upon the integrity of B.A.S.S. rules, B.A.S.S. officials or fellow competitors (including any protests).
- Public comments that an angler knows, or should reasonably know, will harm the reputation (i.e., slander or libel) of B.A.S.S., B.A.S.S. officials, sponsors or fellow competitors (including but not limited to competitors filing protests).
- Displays of anger and displeasure for reasons related to fishing competition where members of the public, including other anglers, spectators and the media, are present.
- Publicly questioning or criticizing a tournament official or official decision, ruling or penalty except through the proper channels.
- Any sharing of non-public information marked as confidential or private communications with B.A.S.S.
- Abuse (physical, verbal, threatening or slanderous) of tournament officials, volunteers, fellow competitors or others connected with a B.A.S.S. event, including comments on social media.
- Offensive or slanderous comments with racial, cultural or sexual overtones regarding event officials, event personnel or fellow anglers.
- Intentionally interfering with an angler's ability to compete.

D. Any disqualification, suspension or other disciplinary action imposed by any tournament or fishing organization may result in disqualification from competition and the rejection of an application for participation in a B.A.S.S. tournament.

Angler Code of Conduct Penalty Guidelines

When a Bassmaster High School Series angler is found to have violated the Angler Code of Conduct, the following potential fines will be imposed at B.A.S.S.'s sole discretion, in addition to any other penalties that may be deemed appropriate by B.A.S.S. The level of a penalty imposed will be determined based on not just the type of violation, but also the severity of the outcomes related to the incident, as well as the number of previous similar violations. Code of conduct violations are not appealable.

- Level 1 offense Not less than \$100 nor more than \$150
- Level 2 offense Not less than \$250 nor more than \$500
- Level 3 offense Possible suspension or ban from the Bassmaster High School Series and other levels of B.A.S.S. competition.

4. PRACTICE AND COMPETITION:

A. There will be an off-limits period of two days prior official practice. Opens tournament unless specified by the Tournament Director. The Off-limits Period, Official Practice, and Official Tournament Waters will be posted on the Official Information Sheets listed at www.bassmaster.com. Special off-limits and practice periods for the National Championship and Bassmaster Classic will be announced by B.A.S.S.

B. Official practice days may begin at 12:01 a.m. two days prior to the start of competition. No competitors will be allowed on tournament waters after registration until the first day of competition, except under Paragraph 5.D. below. Unless otherwise specified, all official times are time zone-specific to the local host community. The competitor must know and observe these dates. During practice and competition, anglers cannot solicit, gather or intentionally receive any information from anyone other than another competitor in the tournament. NO EXCEPTIONS. Competitors may only fish with other competitors during official practice and competition. Flying over tournament waters, other than a ticketed commercial airline, is prohibited during official practice and competition unless approved by the Tournament Director. The use of drones for the purposes of locating or catching fish or to gain a competitive advantage is prohibited in both official practice and competition. During the official practice competitors are not allowed to livewell or keep any bass unless they have permission from tournament officials.

C. During official practice, no practicing at night, defined as beginning at 30 minutes after local sunset and ending 30 minutes before local sunrise, including running to and from a fishing location. In practice and competition, when running in low-light conditions, running lights should be in operation.

D. Anglers and or boat captains renting boat slips may launch boats and proceed immediately to slip location. Testing of engines after the weigh-in is only allowed with permission from the Tournament Director. NO EXCEPTIONS. During the official practice and during the tournament, a competitor may not "SKIN DIVE" OR "SCUBA DIVE" in the tournament waters.

E. No competitor and or boat captain may buy or barter a fishing location for use during any off-limits, official practice or competition day. Once daily cuts are announced at the post-weigh-in rules meeting, competitors not making the cut are no longer considered in the tournament. Competitors making the cut may not receive information under Paragraph 5.B. above.

F. During the official competition days of the tournament a competitor may not make cell calls for the purpose of locating or catching fish on tournament waters. Cell phones may be used for emergency situations. Competitors are allowed to call lockmasters for locking purposes only. Competitors are allowed to use smartphones for global maps, weather, notes, Bassmaster.com updates, etc.; however, using smartphones during competition to log into daily tournament blogs or participate in social media is not permitted.

G. A designated tournament official must be granted access to the competitor's boat at any time during the official practice or competition days. Failure to grant such access may result in immediate disqualification.

H. During off-limits, official practice, and competition, competitors may not place brush, or other physical attractors, including chum of any kind, in tournament waters nor can another person do so on their behalf.

I. Each competitor agrees to report to the Tournament Director immediately any violation or infraction of any tournament rules. Failure to report violations, suggestions to another competitor that they violate these rules or false verification of weigh-in forms may be cause for disqualification. Official protests must be filed in accordance with Paragraph 1 ("Rules and Penalties"). All parties of interest will be provided a copy.

Each competitor agrees to report to the Tournament Officials immediately any violation or infraction of any tournament rules. Failure to report violations, suggestions to another competitor that they violate these rules or false verification of weigh-in forms may be cause for disqualification. Official protests must be filed in accordance with Rule 1. All parties of interest will be provided a copy. By signature on the official tournament entry form, each competitor agrees to submit to a credibility assessments test and abide by its conclusion should he/she be accused of any rule violation.

The B.A.S.S. Tournament Officials, rules committee, or such person designated by the Tournament Director, shall have the discretion to determine the need for a credibility assessment. Failure of a credibility assessment is appealable. However, the appeals process including any retest will be case dependent and at the sole discretion of B.A.S.S. The B.A.S.S. Tournament Officials or their designee shall be responsible for selecting and training qualified examiners to administer and interpret the results, perform an

independent quality control review, and establishing, in consultation with the expert administrator, the scope of the questions which may be asked during the tests. The B.A.S.S. Tournament Officials or their designee shall have sole responsibility selecting the location, date, and time of the test. The competitor shall make himself/herself available at the location selected by the Tournament Officials and shall cooperate in all respects with such test. Anglers taking credibility assessments may be responsible for any and all costs incurred. Random credibility assessments tests may be administered on site during the course of any Bassmaster High School Series Event.

REGISTRATION/CHECK-IN:

Each competitor must register/check in in person with official B.A.S.S. staff at the time and place designated in the schedule of events. Failure to register/check-in in person during the prescribed hours may result in a \$100 fine, or other penalties. Any competitor who has not contacted the B.A.S.S. Tournament Staff 15 minutes after the closing of the posted on-site registration/check-in period, may be disqualified from participating in the tournament. It shall be each competitor's responsibility to either check the schedule of events for registration time and location or obtain times from the B.A.S.S. Tournament Department.

5. SAFETY:

A. Safe boat conduct must be observed at all times by competitors. During the official practice and competition, each competitor must wear a Coast Guard-approved chest-type life preserver anytime the combustion engine is running. This preserver must be strapped, snapped, or zippered securely, worn outside the outermost layer of clothing and maintained in that condition until the combustion engine is out of gear or shut off. Inflatable life vest indicators should be checked daily. Violation of this rule may be the reason for disqualification. PFDs are allowed as long as U.S. Coast Guard regulations are met. The Coast Guard requires that Inflatable PFDs be worn at all times unless there is an equal number of non-inflatable Coast Guard-approved PFDs on board. Anglers must carry two Coast Guard-approved chest-type life preservers per boat.

B. When boating in low-visibility situations (i.e., fog, heavy rain) during both practice and competition, competitors must operate their boats at a safe speed and in a safe manner as determined by tournament officials.

C. Radar units permanently mounted in the boat, subject to approval by B.A.S.S., may be approved for competition.

D. It is suggested the boater have a safety check with their partner each day prior to launch to familiarize the location of all safety equipment.

E. It is required that each contestant prior to official practice successfully complete a boating safety certification, or possess a USCG Captain's license. Boating safety courses are available online and should carry an endorsement by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators or NASBLA.

F. Tournament officials have the right to delay, shorten or cancel the start of an official tournament day because of bad weather or other factors that would endanger the safety of the competitors. Tournament waters may also be restricted at any time because of bad weather. Weather delays on full-field days resulting in half of the tournament day being lost (first flight takeoff and check-in), shall result in cancellation. Full fields may be carried over to cut days. In the event of cancelled day(s), Bassmaster High School Series Tournament Events will be extended no more than one day after the schedule conclusion date.

G. B.A.S.S. reserves the right to impose boat speed limits during any or all tournaments. Whether or not to impose a speed limit, the area covered by the speed limit, and/or the actual speed limit imposed, shall be left exclusively to the discretion of the Tournament Officials. This will never result in speed limits in excess of those posted on local waters. Additionally, a safe operating speed is impacted by a number of factors and should be maintained at all times and is the sole responsibility of the Competitor.

H. IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY SITUATION, COMPETITORS SHOULD CALL 911 FIRST AND, ONCE SAFE, THEN NOTIFY TOURNAMENT OFFICIALS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

I. COMPETITORS ARE ALLOWED TO LEAVE THE BOAT AND SEEK SAFE SHELTER IN BAD WEATHER WHERE DANGER MAY BE IMMINENT. COMPETITORS SHOULD ALWAYS USE THEIR BEST JUDGMENT IN THESE SITUATIONS.

6. SPORTSMANSHIP:

A. Competitors in B.A.S.S. tournaments are expected to follow high standards of sportsmanship, courtesy, safety and conservation. Any infraction of these fundamental sporting principles may be deemed cause for disqualification.

B. Use of alcohol or drugs (other than those purchased over-the-counter or prescribed by a licensed physician – as long as such prescribed drug does not impede the ability to operate a vehicle) by any competitor during official practice or the tournament will not be tolerated and shall be cause for automatic disqualification at B.A.S.S. officials sole discretion. No alcoholic beverages or prohibited drugs shall be allowed in the boats during the official practice or competition days or when in the weigh-in area.

C. Maximum courtesy must be practiced at all times, especially with regard to boating and angling in the vicinity of noncompetitors who may be on tournament waters. Any act of a competitor which reflects unfavorably upon efforts to promote fisheries conservation, clean waters and courtesy may be reason for disqualification.

D. All competitors are bound by the prevailing statutes and regulations of the various states in which they fish. Some regulations may differ from these rules resulting in

finest, citations or other penalties at the discretion of law enforcement and may or may not result in tournament penalties. Competitors are responsible for research of fishing and boating regulations. In both official practice and competition, competitors are required to have all licenses and permits required on the tournament waters in which they fish.

E. Chemical substance addiction or abuse, conviction of a felony or other crimes involving moral turpitude or other conduct reflecting unfavorably upon efforts to promote safety, sportsmanship, fair competition and compliance with tournament rules shall be grounds for rejecting any application for participation and/or for disqualification after circumstances are reviewed by the Tournament Director. Any disqualification, suspension from or other disciplinary action regarding any tournament or fishing organization shall be grounds for rejecting any application for participation in a B.A.S.S. tournament and/or disqualification from a B.A.S.S. tournament after circumstances are reviewed by the Tournament Director. Code of Conduct violations will expire five (5) years from the violation date.

7. TACKLE AND EQUIPMENT:

A. No "live bait," "dead bait," or "prepared bait" will be permitted during official practice and competition, with the exception of pork strips or rinds.

B. Only ONE casting, spin casting or spinning rod (10-foot-maximum length from butt of handle to rod tip) and reel may be used at any one time. A hung or snagged lure that is not in or on the water is not considered in use and may be set aside while another is in use. Other rigs as specified above may be in the boat ready for use; however, only ONE is permitted in use at any given time. If a competitor breaks his/her line while setting the hook or retrieving a fish, he/she is allowed to make an attempt with the rod being used or with his/her hands to secure the visible line and land the fish for it to be counted as legal. He/she may NOT hook the line with another lure, rod and reel or other device. If a fish in your possession exits the boat, you are allowed to attempt to grab it with your hands. Once you resume fishing, that fish must be caught in a legal and sporting manner. If a fish in your possession exits the boat, you are allowed to make an attempt to grab it with your hands. Once you resume fishing, that fish must be caught in a legal and sporting manner.

C. No competitor may intentionally snag or foul-hook a bass to be counted in their daily catch. Anyone guilty of intentionally snatching or snagging visible fish will have their catch disqualified. When knowingly fishing for bedding bass using any means (whether visually, blind-casting, using forward facing live sonar or any other method), to be counted as a legal fish, each bass must be hooked inside the mouth. With the fish's mouth closed naturally, you must not be able to see where the hook point enters the fish for it to be considered hooked inside the mouth. Anglers must verify the fish is hooked in the mouth with another person in the boat or their POV camera. Otherwise in such type events credibility assessment exams may ask this question. Any fish hooked in the mouth where the hook did not enter through the mouth, but entered through the gills, must be released.

D. All competitors are bound by the prevailing statutes and regulations of the various states in which they fish. Some regulations may differ from these rules resulting in fines, citations or other penalties at the discretion of law enforcement and may or may not result in tournament penalties. Competitors are responsible for research of fishing and boating regulations. In both official practice and competition, competitors are required to have all licenses and permits required on the tournament waters in which they fish. Competitors, including those who have been “cut” from competition in an event, are allowed to share baits and tackle with one another at any time.

8. HORSEPOWER REGULATIONS:

Maximum horsepower for all outboard motorboats used in official tournament practice and in tournament competition will be 250 horsepower. Horsepower cannot exceed the limitations set by the U.S. Coast Guard. When required, each boat must have a U.S. Coast Guard horsepower-rating plate attached to the boat by the manufacturer. The horsepower of the outboard engine must NOT exceed the rating specified on this plate nor the horsepower maximum set by B.A.S.S. Each competitor agrees to submit, by their signature on the official entry form, the boat, electronics data and outboard motor used in the tournament, to an inspection by factory-trained personnel if there is reason to suspect the horsepower is in excess of the rating. Normal maintenance of engines is allowed. Changing or altering standard factory parts of a competitor’s engine to increase the horsepower over the factory horsepower rating, is forbidden and will result in disqualification. Falsifying information on entry forms, or altering the horsepower-rating numbers on the engine is also cause for immediate disqualification from B.A.S.S. tournaments. Posted speed limits and those imposed by B.A.S.S. must be observed and all boats must be operated in a safe manner. Violations of speed limits may result in penalties listed under Rule 1 above.

9. BOAT AND MOTOR:

These restrictions apply during official practice and competition. For the safety of all competitors, all boats must be equipped with an approved type of operable ignition kill switch and lanyard. Only one manufacturer’s lanyard may be used and must be attached to the driver’s body any time the combustion engine is operating and in gear. Any time the combustion engine is operating and in gear there must be a driver in the driver’s seat in full control of the boat, and all competitors must be seated with their feet on the floor of the vessel. Fishing boats that are 16 feet or more in length may be used and must be equipped with wheel steering. No other steering device will be permitted. Any raised platforms or decks cannot be higher than the gunnels of the boat. Standing on the outboard engine or seats while fishing is not allowed. Trolling motor brackets and electronics are not considered “raised platforms”. Each competitor’s boat shall be restricted to one (1) electric motor to be mounted at the bow of the boat. Electric motor(s) mounted at the stern of the boat are prohibited. Each competitor may keep a spare trolling motor in the boat in case one malfunctions. An electric trolling motor may be used for slow maneuvering. However, trolling as a method of fishing is prohibited. The “Long-Lining” or “Strolling” technique is NOT allowed in either practice or competition and defined as

intentionally using a trolling motor or outboard to mechanically extend a cast. No exceptions. All bladder tanks and any other type of auxiliary gas tanks that are not installed by the boat manufacturer are prohibited. Additional gas tanks that are factory options and installed by a manufacturer's authorized dealer are permitted. Boats that do not have factory-installed gas tanks are restricted to a maximum of 18 gallons of gasoline in tanks that meet U.S. Coast Guard regulations. Gas tanks must be properly secured or strapped in a boat. No portable gas tanks or containers capable of holding gasoline can be placed anywhere on the tournament waters or shoreline for use by any tournament competitor. No "barges" or similar craft will be permitted. No boat equipped with "stick steering" shall be permitted. "Stick steering" shall be as defined by the Tournament Director. Jet drive engines, and surface drive engines and tunnel hull boats are not allowed during both official practice and competition. Any boat/hull designs other than standard mass produced units are only allowed at the discretion of tournament officials.

10. BASIC BOAT EQUIPMENT:

During official practice and competition, every boat must have all required Coast Guard safety equipment and a functional bilge pump. During official competition, every boat must have livewell space, properly aerated, to adequately maintain alive, a limit catch of bass by both competitors using the boat. B.A.S.S. recommends livewells be maintained at full level and aerators/recirculators on manual. Tournament officials shall have the sole responsibility for determining whether aeration and capacity is proper and adequate.

11. ELECTRONICS:

All electronics must be mounted in a way not to obstruct the competitor's line of sight while piloting the boat on plane. It is recommended that console electronics be mounted in a manner where the tops of graphs are no higher than 26 inches from the steering column where it exits the console, and bow electronics be mounted in a manner where the tops of graphs are no higher than 18 inches from the front deck.

Competitors will be required to allow B.A.S.S. to access their electronics for media purposes. Failure to allow access may result in a penalty. If B.A.S.S. is unable to access the unit in the bow of the boat, the angler will be required to mirror through console electronics with an unobstructed view.

12. BOAT IDENTIFICATION:

Prior to each day's start, each boat must be given an inspection check by a tournament official. Each day, each boat may be given a number, which must remain with the boat. This number must be displayed upon the request of tournament officials and at each check-in.

13. PERMITTED FISHING LOCATIONS:

Tournament waters shall be established by the Tournament Director for each tournament. Each competitor must obtain this information from the B.A.S.S. Tournament Department. Any water within these boundaries that is legally and obviously posted "Off-

Limits” or “No Fishing,” as well as the live-bass-release area established by the Tournament Director, will be off-limits to tournament competitors and will be announced at the tournament briefing. Only the water open to all public fishing will be considered tournament waters. Waters deemed off-limits by authorities or tournament officials should be treated like a wall. No boats or casting behind that boundary while fishing. All angling must be done from the boat. In states where landowners have the legal authority to claim private property, these areas must be posted or they will be considered tournament waters unless instructed otherwise by tournament officials at any time during the event. If forced to leave, a competitor must report the incident to tournament officials as soon as possible. Any water to which a competitor is barred access becomes off-limits to all competitors.

Prior to 8 a.m. local time the day before the tournament is scheduled to begin, any questionable areas must be brought to the attention of tournament officials to be considered tournament waters. Questionable areas will be off-limits until a determination can be made with authorities and may be announced in the briefing or via text for all to know unless determined otherwise by tournament officials.

Tournament officials reserve the right to restrict or enhance tournament waters based on conversations with local authorities. Competitors are not allowed to cut, remove, displace or engage in any type of structure removal from private property (dry land) during off-limits, official practice or competition. The removal of official commercial, local state, or federal barricades at any time to make an area more accessible by boat or gain access for fishing is prohibited. Moving structures, including the sawing of logs or other obstructions in the water, is only allowed if laws permit. No competitor may place any object that may impede or cause danger to boaters.

14. COMPETITORS MUST REMAIN IN BOAT:

During the competition days, competitors must not depart the boat to land fish or to make the boat more accessible to fishing waters. You are not allowed to use a winch, pulley, come along, cable, rope or similar device/tools to gain access to tournament waters. Competitors may not shift a majority of their weight outside of the boat and onto a dock or other object outside of the boat for the purpose of landing a bass or accessing a fishing spot. While keeping the majority of weight in the boat, anglers are allowed, for boat protection, to push or shove off objects while landing a fish and still be counted as legal. Boats must remain in tournament waters during tournament days. Competitors must leave from and return to official checkpoints by boat. Both competitors must remain in the boat at all times, except in case of dire emergency or with permission from the Tournament Director. Exceptions spelled out in this Paragraph and Paragraphs 7 (“Safety”), and 18 (“Catch and Release”). In such an emergency, or with permission of the Tournament Director, competitors may be removed from their boat either to a boat operated by other competitors or a rescue boat designated by the Tournament Director. Partners must remain together at all times. In breakdown situations and with a tournament official’s permission, competitors may transfer their boat’s (competitors) fish to another competitor’s boat and ride to check-in, and they may leave their Boat Captain with the disabled boat. In such

cases, the anglers must stay with their catches at all times, and the assisting boat's partners should verify the catch. Any high school team whose boat is disabled that rides with another competitor or rescue boat to weigh-in is not allowed to fish. In the event of a needed restroom break or refueling situation at a marina gas pump, contestants are allowed to leave the boat. If a competitor violates any of the above conditions (to contact a tournament official by phone or other means, or to report an emergency or breakdown), both competitors must cease fishing at this point and their catch must be verified by a tournament official in order to be counted in the tournament. If, after the emergency situation is resolved by tournament officials, enough time is left for the competitors to resume fishing, a restart will be allowed, the competitors will continue and their catch will be counted. This applies only to dire emergency situations as determined by the Tournament Director or his/her designee. Towing boats on trailers during tournament hours is prohibited, except by the direction of tournament officials. Competitors are allowed to leave the boat to retrieve a lure. All fishing by that competitor must cease until back in the boat before making another cast.

15. OFFICIAL CHECKPOINTS:

There shall be only one official checkpoint for check-out in the morning and one official check-in point in the afternoon; which points shall be designated at the tournament briefing. Failure to go through boat check and check-out in the morning or failure to check in at the check-in point in the afternoon may result in disqualification. At the time of check-out, all competitors and their boats shall be in full conformity with all rules set forth by the Tournament Director. At check-in, all boats shall identify themselves by means of the numbers described in Paragraph 13 ("Boat Identification") and proceed immediately to the designated weigh-in area. Partners must stay together, through the weigh-in process if both are weighing bass.

16. SCORING:

Tournament standings, contingency awards and final winners shall be determined by the pound-and-ounce weight of each competitor's catch during the competition days of the tournament. Only Largemouth, Smallmouth, Spotted, Redeye, or Shoal bass will be weighed. The limit shall be five (5) fish of the above species and varieties per day, unless otherwise specified by tournament officials (example: hot weather/fish care concerns). At no time shall a competitor have in his/her possession more than the tournament limit. If a competitor determines they have over the limit they must immediately reduce his/her catch to the tournament limit with a live bass of their choice from their catch. Each returned bass will result in a 2-pound penalty to be deducted from their daily score. In this case, competitors must attempt to notify tournament officials and, if unsuccessful, must notify officials at check-in. Once a competitor checks in they must present all legal bass to tournament officials at the verification table. If competitors at the verification table have more than the tournament limit, the competitor will reduce with live bass to the tournament limit and each returned bass will result in a 2-pound penalty to be deducted from their daily score. If a competitor has his/her fish verified, weighed and, upon returning to the boat, discovers additional fish over the tournament limit that were not presented to

officials he/she then must notify tournament officials within one hour of final flight check-in to receive a 2 -pound penalty for each bass discovered. Anglers who do not remove fin clips prior to fish check will be assessed a 4-ounce penalty per clip. Failure to notify officials after one hour of final flight check-in time will result in the loss of the day's catch. Anglers who present fish at the verification table with fin clips attached will be assessed a 4-ounce penalty per clip. Man-made or foreign object(s) connected to a bass, outside of natural causes, will not be weighed and shall be removed by tournament officials. Competitors are not allowed to replace anything attached to a bass or regurgitated by a bass to be included as part of their catch. The official length for bass shall be determined by the Tournament Director and announced at the tournament briefing. In most cases it will be the longest state limit covering the tournament waters. Only bass as described above which measure the official length or more on the longest straight line shall be weighed. Bass presented for weigh-in which fail to measure the official length shall result in a penalty of 1 pound for each such bass, which shall be deducted from the total score of the competitor. Any bass that appears to have been mangled, mashed, mauled or otherwise altered will be weighed and credited only at the discretion of tournament officials. After competitors check in at the official checkpoint they MUST present all LEGAL fish in their possession to a tournament official to be counted, measured and weighed. Once a competitor's catch is measured, counted and verified by a tournament official, that competitor may not return to the boat until their catch has been weighed and recorded. Bass must not be placed on a stringer at any time during the tournament. Culling tags or clips are allowed. Specially designed bags which increase survival rate will be furnished by the Tournament Director and must be used for the weigh-in.

17. CATCH AND RELEASE:

CULLING OF DEAD BASS IS PROHIBITED. For each legal dead bass presented to weigh in officials, the competitor shall be penalized 4 oz. to be deducted from their daily score. The Tournament Director, or his/her designees, shall have sole authority for assessing penalty points. In addition, the Tournament Director, or his/her designees, may reduce tournament hours or tournament limits for fish care purposes. It is suggested in warm weather tournaments anglers keep extra ice for fish care. Contestants are allowed to obtain ice and other items for fish care from competitors and/or non-competitors. The verification table will open one hour prior to check in time of the first flight. Anglers may be allowed to weigh-in early with the permission from the Tournament Director. SMALL DIP NETS FOR CULLING PURPOSES ARE ENCOURAGED. It is recommended competitors keep all bass in live wells during the culling process. Placing bass on the boat carpet during culling is not an advised practice. Only non-penetrating culling clips and culling beams are allowed for use. Any clip or device that penetrates or is designed to penetrate the skin or mouth of a fish is not allowed. Proper fizzing technique is suggested when needed. For instructions on acceptable fizzing practices please contact B.A.S.S. officials.

18. LATE PENALTY:

Competitors who are not at the official check-in point as described in Paragraph 16 ("Official Checkpoints") at the appointed time shall be penalized at the rate of one pound per minute late, to be deducted from the total weight of his/her catch that day, including any weight to be counted toward a "big bass award." Any competitor more than 15 minutes late shall lose all credit for that day's catch. There shall be no excuse for tardiness, and in no case shall a competitor be allowed to make up "lost time." After proper recognition at the check-in point, competitors will be allowed ample time to proceed to the weigh-in site; however, all fishing must cease upon checking in. After the tournament begins, fishing the tournament waters is prohibited except during tournament hours. Exact starting and check-in times will be announced at the tournament briefing. It is each competitor's responsibility to confirm check-in times each day on the daily pairings.

19. TIES:

A. In case of a tie for first-place weight at the end of the tournament, there will be a sudden-death fish-off between the tied competitors under the direction and special rules established by tournament officials.

B. All other ties will be resolved in the following order: (1) team with heaviest single-day catch during competition; (2) if the tie is not broken, the next tiebreaker will be the individual with the second-heaviest single-day catch during competition; (3) if the tie is not broken, the next tiebreaker will be the team with the largest number of legal fish weighed during competition; (4) if the tie is not broken, the next tiebreaker will be the team with the largest number of legal live fish weighed during competition; (5) for first place only, if the tie is not broken, the largest fish will be the fifth tiebreaker. If the tie is not broken by applying the foregoing procedures, the tie will remain a tie and monetary prizes for each competitor will be awarded in an equal amount between the tied competitors. Angler of the Year points will be awarded for the place of the tied position, and each competitor will be awarded equal points. In the instance where merchandise is involved, it will be awarded as determined by tournament officials. Ties for any cut will be resolved in the same order explained above and, if the tie is not broken, will be awarded as determined by tournament officials.

20. RULES VIOLATIONS AND APPEALS COMMITTEE:

Appeals for penalties assessed under Rule 1 (b), (c), (d), (e) & (f) must be presented in writing to the Tournament Officials within 48 hours from the time of the ruling being appealed. An appeals committee will be established by B.A.S.S., which shall be comprised of one B.A.S.S. employee not affiliated with the Tournament Department, and two current or recently retired Bassmaster anglers who were not competitors in the event in question. Appeals hearings shall take place within fourteen (14) business days, if possible, from the date of receipt of the written appeal. All parties must make themselves available at prescribed time of hearing. If competitors admit to a rules violation, they may not file an appeal of either the finding that they have violated the rules or the penalty imposed for the violation. Decisions of the appeals committee shall be final.

Names of the ruling committee members are to remain confidential and must not be disclosed to the public.

Competitors are allowed to compete while under appeal. Should an angler fishing under appeal make a cut, the next angler below the cut will be invited to compete on the cut day with the clear understanding that any prize money and points they might earn will be contingent upon the outcome of the appeal. If the appealing angler wins their appeal, the additional angler below the cut will revert to the points and prize money they were due at the end of fishing prior to the cut day. Final standings will not be official until all appeals hearings are final and ruled upon. However, all standings above that of any appealing angler, as well as any adjusted final standings may be declared official. Standings, including AOY points and monetary awards, may be adjusted after appeals final ruling and all affected anglers shall comply with all details of the final ruling.

A. Competitors are allowed to compete under appeal for penalties assessed under Paragraph 1.C. ("Penalties"), Sections (v) and (vi) until final ruling by the appeals committee.

B. Competitors are allowed to compete while under appeal. Field sizes after cuts would include any appealing angler making the cut for the next round of competition for that event. Final standings will not be official until all appeals hearings are final and ruled upon. However, all standings above that of any appealing angler, as well as any adjusted final standings, may be declared official. Standings, including points and monetary awards, may be adjusted after the appeals committee's final ruling, and all affected anglers shall comply with all details of the final ruling.

C. To protect the integrity of the appeals process, the names of the ruling committee members, witnesses, and/or other involved parties are to remain confidential and must not be disclosed to the public through the appeals process.

21. PATCHES AND/OR SIGNAGE:

Anglers are encouraged to wear their own clothing which may bear patches, logos and other signage promoting the angler's sponsors. B.A.S.S. may, however, restrict the use of logos, signage, etc., that promote or advertise products which are, in B.A.S.S.'s sole judgment, in competition with the products or services of official B.A.S.S. sponsors, or which are, in B.A.S.S.'s sole judgment, in poor taste. B.A.S.S. will provide as much advance notice as possible to the competitors in such instances. By signing this document, each angler agrees to wear an official B.A.S.S. shield (2 1/4 x 2 3/4 inches) on either left/right chest, with the top of the shield hitting the left/right collarbone during competition, including the weigh-in. This shield may be embroidered. In addition, if B.A.S.S. provides any ancillary clothing or products (such as life vests) bearing the logos of B.A.S.S. or the official sponsors of B.A.S.S., each competitor shall wear such clothing or utilize such products in a manner requested by B.A.S.S.

22. B.A.S.S. SPONSOR BOATS:

When using B.A.S.S. sponsor boats, anglers are responsible for the physical care of the boat. Damage incurred, determined to be excessive or wanton by the Tournament Director, shall result in the angler being responsible for all costs of repair.

23. TAXES:

Where and when state laws require income taxes be paid on cash awards to nonresidents, the taxes will be automatically deducted prior to the awards being presented to the winners. Anglers/observers are responsible for all applicable taxes on both cash and merchandise awards. Various states require withholding tax on merchandise be paid upon the awarding of certificates, and anglers awarded merchandise certificates in these states are responsible for remitting their tax to B.A.S.S. Failure to meet those obligations may result in reduction of Angler of the Year points, fines and/or disqualification from all future B.A.S.S. events.

24. WAIVER AND RELEASE:

As a condition of participation in each tournament, each competitor must execute a waiver and release of liability, and a name and likeness release and consent to the use of an electronic or digital signature in the execution thereof.

B.A.S.S. High School Coach Rules

Coaches may only fall in the following criteria:

- Official faculty member of the student's institution
- Close family friend/State Nation member
- Parent of the students' High School B.A.S.S. Club

If a potential coach is a local guide? then they will be ineligible for the tournament;
BjA;S;Sj reserves the right to deny any Coach;

During Official Practice* coaches MAY:

1. Coach
2. Give advice
3. Teach by example
4. Fish
5. Run the trolling motor
6. Land fish with or without a net

During Competition

Coaches MAY:

1. Coach
2. Assist with culling

3. Give advice
4. Verbally explain techniques, (e.g., “how to”)

Coaches **MAY NOT:**

1. Fish
2. Teach by example
3. Tie knots
4. Land fish with or without a net
5. Run the trolling motor

During Official Practice* or Competition, anytime the combustion engine is running, coaches MUST be seated in the driver’s seat in full control of the boat.

*Official practice days only are those days immediately preceding competition days, in which B.A.S.S. has identified as the “official practice days”.
