She is married and has a son, a daughter and one grandson. Now retired she enjoys spending time with family, traveling, cooking, reading, gardening and researching genealogy. Recently she discovered her 91 year old mother's Czech heritage after having her do a DNA test. Her mother was adopted and never knew who her birth parents were. Linda has spent time over the last few years researching her genealogy, discovering and meeting many new family members.

Kenneth Breaux - Kenneth graduated from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette and was commissioned as a Naval officer and later Commander of a Reserve Training Group. After working as a corporate training developer, planner and project manager he retired from EDS. In retirement he created a not-for-profit MIA Recovery Network which serves as a global focal point for working towards the identification and recovery of 78,000 remaining WWII missing in action. He has authored two books: *Courtesies of the Heart* and *TRANSFORMING! How Managers Become Leaders*.

Jenna Hays McEachern - Jenna is currently doing research for a book about her Irish grandmother, who was born in New York, orphaned at age 2, and sent to East Bernard, Tx on an Orphan Train. Jenna grew up in El Campo and West Columbia, Tx, where her mother taught school and her father was the head football coach. Jenna became a Longhorn football fan at the age of nine, and eventually realized her dream of being a cheerleader at The University of Texas. While studying photojournalism, McEachern worked in The University of Texas Sports Information Department, so once again she was surrounded by the culture of football. Her three published books - What It Means to be a Longhorn, 100 Things Longhorn Fans Should Know Before They Die, and DKR: The Royal Scrapbook - are about Longhorn football. Jenna and her husband, Randy McEachern, former University of Texas quarterback, still live in Austin and have three adult children.

Sarah Vitek - Sarah was born in Burlington, Tx and grew up enjoying Czech and German music. Originally she was told she was German but discovered she has some Czech blood.
