MEDITATION

FOURTH (4th) SUNDAY OF EASTER, YEAR A. "GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY" by Rev. Fr. Modeste Digwou

Every year, on this 4th Sunday of Easter, the very famous parable of the Good Shepherd is read, in fragments. Contrary to certain mawkish and "bleating" representations, it does not evoke a peaceful pastoral scene: it is a weapon of combat. Jesus intended it for the Pharisees, his bitter opponents who accused him of being "possessed by Satan" (8:48) and who, together with the chief priests, were determined to have him killed as soon as possible. Jesus affirms the function that his Father has entrusted to him: to become the unique and definitive guide of men. And we must never forget that "the Pharisees" do not refer only to the group of Jewish adversaries of Jesus but to a mentality, a behavior, a hypocritical piety. And this dreadful drift can be found in any religion...including that of Jesus!

The only true guide of humanity

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever enters the sheepfold and does not go through the gate, but climbs in through another place, he is a thief and a bandit. He who enters through the gate is the shepherd, the shepherd of the sheep.

The doorkeeper opens it for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls each of them by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice. They will never follow a stranger, but will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers." I make my voice heard: Jesus' only weapon is his Word, the Good News that he never stopped proclaiming. In front of all audiences, in the city as well as in the villages, he speaks without guile, without intellectual pretension; he respects everyone, he does not violate consciences, he appeals to the freedom of each person. Besides, **He** is the word, the logos, the meaning, the reason.

I call my brewers, each by his name: Jesus does not enlist a mass, he does not hold any electoral speech to bait the crowd with random promises. His Word calls each one "by name", that is to say in a personal way: such a disciple will find a family, such another will leave everything to follow him on a difficult road, such another will carry a heavy handicap. But each one, in his own way, feels called and has a vocation. Jesus does not boast of his own qualities: those who trust him are those whom the Father gives him (10:29; 17:2-6-9), he receives them as gifts from his Father. They are "his sheep": his love for them is such that they are never alienated.

The Shepherd walks at their lead: Jesus is not a leader hiding in the back and sending his troops to the front. The Gospel shows him always walking at the head of his disciples, the first to be taunted, criticized, and insulted. And when danger threatens, he is the one who advances towards Judas and the troops who have come to arrest him. "I am the one; let these men go" (18:8). When it is a question of giving his life, it is he alone who offers himself.

MEDITATION (continued)

The brewers follow him because they know his voice: the disciples are not pilgrims in the Holy Land looking for unlikely remnants of Jesus. To follow him means to listen to what he says and to obey his Will in all faithfulness. Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, we think we know the Scriptures, but we don't. If the first Christians called themselves "disciples", it was not because they accepted a "discipline" but because they wanted to "learn" better and better the message of a Voice that commanded radical refusals and forced them to distance themselves from their surroundings.

They never follow a stranger because they don't know his voice. Bombarded by seductive messages, solicited by promises of happiness and fulfillment, the true disciple develops his instinct of faith which allows him to discern among all the Voice of his Lord. On the religious, social, and political levels, he flushes out the lies, he sniffs out the traps, he refuses to be led by the nose. For the disciple of Jesus is anything but "a sheep of Panurge".

Jesus the door to freedom and life

Jesus used this parable to address them, but they did not understand what he was talking about. So Jesus spoke again: "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep. All those who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the door. If anyone enters through me, he will be saved: he will be able to go in and out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal, slaughter, and destroy. I have come so that people may have life, life in abundance.

And today's page ends with one of the most magnificent statements of Jesus, Shepherd and Gatekeeper:

"I have come that men may have life, life in superabundance".

CATECHESIS

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK OR EXTREME **UNCTION: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?** by Rev. Fr. Modeste Digwou

We no longer say 'extreme unction' but 'sacrament of the sick", we often hear in our parishes. But do these two expressions designate the same reality?

Formerly called 'extreme unction', it was the Second Vatican Council that redefined the sacrament of the sick. Today, the Church considers it to be a sacrament of life, to accompany those who are suffering, rather than the "last" of the sacraments, long associated with death. "The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC §1514) states: "The Anointing of the Sick is not only the sacrament of those who are at the end of their lives. It was the liturgical reform of 1972 that transformed the anointing into a sacrament of accompaniment, in response to the instruction received from St. James in his epistle:

Cuarto Domíngo de Pascua

MEDITACIÓN CUARTO (4°) DOMINGO DE PASCUA, AÑO A. **"DOMINGO DEL BUEN PASTOR"** por el Rev. P. Modeste Digwou

Cada año, en este 4º domingo de Pascua, se lee en fragmentos la famosa parábola del Buen Pastor. Contrariamente a ciertas representaciones malhumoradas y "baladas", no evoca una escena pastoral pacífica: es un arma de combate. Jesús lo pretendía para los fariseos, sus acérrimos oponentes que lo acusaron de estar "poseído por Satanás" (8:48) y que, junto con los principales sacerdotes, estaban decididos a matarlo lo antes posible. Jesús afirma la función que su Padre le ha confiado: convertirse en guía único y definitivo de los hombres. Y nunca debemos olvidar que "los fáriseos" no se refieren sólo al grupo de adversarios judíos de Jesús, sino a una mentalidad, un comportamiento, una piedad hipócrita. Y esta terrible deriva se puede encontrar en cualquier religión... incluyendo el de Jesús!

La única guía verdadera de la humanidad

Jesús dijo a los fariseos: "Amén, amén, os digo que el que entra en el redil y no pasa por la puerta, sino que sube por otro lugar, es ladrón y bandido. El que entra por la puerta es el pastor, el pastor de las ovejas.

El portero se lo abre y las ovejas escuchan su voz. Él llama a cada uno de ellos por su nombre y los conduce. Cuando ha expulsado a todos los suyos, se adelanta a ellos, y las ovejas lo siguen, porque conocen su voz. Nunca seguirán a un extraño, sino que huirán de él, porque no conocen la voz de los extraños". Hago oír mi voz: la única arma de Jesús es su Palabra, la Buena Nueva que nunca dejó de proclamar. Frente a todos los públicos, tanto en la ciudad como en los pueblos, habla sin engaño, sin pretensiones intelectuales; Respeta a todos, no viola las conciencias, apela a la libertad de cada persona. Además, Él es la palabra, el logos, el significado, la razón.

Llamo a mis cerveceros, cada uno por su nombre: Jesús no recluta una misa, no tiene ningún discurso electoral para atraer a la multitud con promesas al azar. Su Palabra llama a cada uno "por su nombre", es decir, de manera personal: tal discípulo encontrará una familia, tal otro dejará todo para seguirlo en un camino difícil, tal otro llevará una pesada desventaja. Pero cada uno, a su manera, se siente llamado y tiene una vocación. Jesús no se jacta de sus propias cualidades: los que confían en él son aquellos que el Padre le da (10,29; 17,2-6-9), los recibe como dones de su Padre. Son "sus ovejas": su amor por ellas es tal que nunca se alienan.

El Pastor camina a su ejemplo: Jesús no es un líder escondido en la parte de atrás y enviando sus tropas al frente. El Evangelio lo muestra siempre caminando a la cabeza de sus discípulos, los primeros en ser burlados, criticados e insultados. Y cuando el peligro amenaza, él es el que avanza hacia Judas y las tropas que han venido a arrestarlo. "Yo soy el indicado; deja ir a estos hombres" (18:8). Cuando se trata de dar la vida, sólo él se ofrece.

MEDITACIÓN (continuado)

Los cerveceros lo siguen porque conocen su voz: los discípulos no son peregrinos en Tierra Santa en busca de restos improbables de Jesús. Seguirlo significa escuchar lo que dice y obedecer su Voluntad con toda fidelidad. Al igual que los discípulos en el camino a Emaús, creemos que conocemos las Escrituras, pero no las conocemos. Si los primeros cristianos se llamaban a sí mismos "discípulos", no era porque aceptaran una "disciplina", sino porque querían "aprender" cada vez mejor el mensaje de una Voz que ordenaba negativas radicales y los obligaba a distanciarse de su entorno. Nunca siguen a un extrañoque usa beca, no conocen su voz. Bombardeado por mensajes seductores, solicitados por promesas de felicidad y realización, el verdadero discípulo desarrolla su instinto de fe que le permite discernir entre todos la Voz de su Señor. A nivel religioso, social y político, elimina las mentiras, olfatea las trampas, se niega a dejarse llevar por la nariz. Porque el discípulo de esús es cualquier cosa menos "una oveja de Panurge". Jesús la puerta a la libertad y a la vida Jesús usó esta parábola para dirigirse a ellos, pero ellos no entendieron de lo que estaba hablando. Entonces Jesús habló de nuevo: "Amén, amén, os digo: Yo soy la puerta de las ovejas. Todos los que vinieron antes que vo son ladrones y ladrones, pero las ovejas no los escucharon. Yo soy la puerta. Si alguien entra a través de mí, será salvo: podrá entrar y salir y encontrar pasto. El ladrón viene sólo para robar, matar y destruir. He venido para que la gente tenga vida, vida en abundancia. Y la página de hoy termina con una de las declaraciones más magníficas de Jesús, Pastor y Portero: "He venido para que los hombres tengan vida, vida en superabundancia".

"Is one of you ill? Let him call the elders in charge of the Church: they will pray over him after having anointed him with oil in the name of the Lord. This prayer inspired by faith will save the sick person: the Lord will raise him up and, if he has committed sins, he will receive forgiveness" (Jas 5:14-15). The ritual of the anointing of the sick, promulgated by Paul VI on November 30, 1972, thus modifies the sacramental formula of the Council of Trent, which gave the sacrament its name of extreme unction, modifying its previous name: the first Christians already called it "anointing of the sick" or "sacrament of the dying". The nature of the sacrament, however, has not changed: the Council of Trent already declared that extreme unction "is administered as a true remedy" ("On the Sacraments", §II), without being reserved "for the moment when all hope of recovery is lost".

*The sacrament of the sick: a special help in times of trial

Thus, the Church tells us, "the sacrament of the sick is intended to give special help to a Christian facing the difficulties of a serious illness or old age. However, any baptized person can receive this sacrament several times, each time he or she is afflicted with a serious illness, whether mental or physical.

And since the sacraments are the acts that make visible an invisible reality, just as the sacrament of reconciliation signifies the forgiveness of sins, the sacrament of the sick is what manifests the presence of God at the side of the one who suffers in trial, whether it be illness or old age. "The appropriate time to receive the sacrament is when the faithful begin to be in danger of death because of physical weakness or old age," the Council states.

*A grace of comfort, peace and courage

"Sacramentals are the sacred signs instituted by the Church whose purpose is to prepare men to receive the fruit of the sacraments and to sanctify the various circumstances of life" (CCC §1677). The celebration of this sacrament is based on the use of sacramentals: the laying on of hands and the anointing with oil, consecrated by the bishop during the Chrism Mass. This oil penetrates the skin to spread its good odor and strengthen the body. "By this holy anointing, may the Lord in his great goodness comfort you with the grace of the Holy Spirit," the celebrant proclaims as he smears the forehead and palms of the patient. These gestures recall those that Jesus himself taught his disciples, when he washed the eyes of the blind, straightened the lame or healed the sick.

By repeating Christ's gestures, the priest, through the Lord who consecrated him, makes visible the grace of comfort, peace and courage to the suffering person, to sustain him in the face of the temptations of discouragement and in the anguish of death.
