

REFLECTION

“If you wish, you can make me clean.”
Mk 1:40

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The liturgy of this Sunday focuses on leprosy and the attitude of the one who bears the sore of leprosy whom we generally call the leper.

In fact, in the Old Testament time, before Jesus’ coming, leprosy was looked at like a shameful sickness, a consequence of sin and God’s punishment. Anyone who had this sickness was declared unclean by the priest and therefore cut off from the community. When he was to appear where there are people, he would cry out “unclean, unclean”, so that people would run away from him and allow him to pass. We can therefore, see that leprosy was cutting off lepers from every relation with God and with their fellow men. In short, those with leprosy could no longer live an authentic human life because of their sickness. They could no longer interact with people in society like before. We can thus imagine how they could feel all the more as they knew they were going to suffer that fate the whole of their life since their sickness was incurable. It is within this context that we should understand the leper of the gospel who comes to Jesus, kneels down before him and say:” If you wish you can make me clean.” (Mk 1:40) This attitude of the leper should be taken note of.

For the leper who should not appear in public, to come before Jesus and kneel down, begging him to make him clean, it is an attitude of humility; humility before Jesus in whom he sees God. Not only that he is humble before Jesus, but also that he recognizes the divine authority of Jesus, for no one could make him clean, not even the hospital. It is his faith in Jesus’ ability to save him that is actually going to move Jesus with pity and make him stretch out his hand to touch him in order to cure him. We admire this leper’s courage and faith to go to Jesus without fear to seek his cure.


Reflection(continued)

There are still many lepers in our society today. In fact, we are all lepers somehow since we are all sinners and sin does the same effect on us. It makes us unclean; it cuts us from the relation with God and from the relation with the Church. Unfortunately, we are not even conscious of this, to need Jesus like the leper of the gospel. We also need to go and bend down before Jesus and ask for the forgiveness of our sins for us to be cured, to be fine. We sometimes forget that we too suffer from the consequences of our sins when we are sick or when we are troubled, when things do not move well with us. We need to go to Jesus in order to be forgiven.

The Church puts at our disposal the sacrament of reconciliation to grant us God’s forgiveness, but how often do we seek it?

The leper who was cured benefited from God’s grace. It is interesting to see his reaction afterwards: “He went away and began to publicize the whole matter.” (Mk 1: 45) He did spread the good news that way and made people know about Jesus. We too are very often beneficiaries of God’s grace, but do we also think of talking about what God has done for us or for our dear ones so as to express our thanksgiving or our gratitude to God? It is also another way to spread the good news, to contribute the work of evangelization, to make Jesus known, to lead people to Him.

During the mass, let us ask God to make us aware of our various leprosy and grant us the grace of humility so that like the leper of the gospel, we may be able to come to Jesus for healing, and thus be reconciled again with God and our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Call the parish office well in advance so that class arrangements can be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:
Anyone wishing to have his or her wedding celebrated at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral must contact the parish office 9-12 months prior to the celebration and talk to a priest for pre-wedding counseling. Please visit our website www.cathedralvi.org or call us at 340-774-0201. The Sacrament of Marriage is generally celebrated on a Saturday between the hours of 11:00AM and 2:00PM. Please contact the parish priest if you would like a different time for your wedding. (Note that Saturday mornings are reserved for cleaning and decorating the cathedral.)

VISITING AND ANNOINTING THE SICK:
If anyone in your family is sick or shut-in, please inform the parish office so that we can pray for them and arrange to visit them. Please note that the hospital does not notify us when Catholics are in the hospital. Please call the parish office to inform us of a Catholic in the hospital who needs to have a priest visit. Funeral Masses at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral are held on the designated day at 9:30AM. Please make arrangements with the Church office before the funeral home to assure availability of the date requested. The Funeral Program should read “**Christian Burial**” on the cover. REFLEXIÓN

“Si lo deseas, puedes limpiarme”.
Marcos 1:40

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

La liturgia de este domingo se centra en la lepra y en la actitud de quien lleva la llaga de la lepra a quien generalmente llamamos leproso.

De hecho, en la época del Antiguo Testamento, antes de la venida de Jesús, la lepra era considerada una enfermedad vergonzosa, consecuencia del pecado y del castigo de Dios. Cualquiera que padeciera esta enfermedad era declarado impuro por el sacerdote y, por tanto, excluido de la comunidad. Cuando debía aparecer donde había gente, gritaba “inmundo, inmundo”, para que la gente huyera de él y le dejara pasar. Por lo tanto, podemos ver que la lepra estaba separando a los leprosos de toda relación con Dios y con sus semejantes. En resumen, los leprosos ya no podían vivir una vida humana auténtica a causa de su enfermedad. Ya no podían interactuar con la gente de la sociedad como antes. Así, podemos imaginar cómo se sentirían aún más sabiendo que iban a sufrir ese destino durante toda su vida, ya que su enfermedad era incurable. Es en este contexto que debemos entender al lepe del evangelio que viene a Jesús, se arrodilla ante él y le dice: “Si quieres puedes limpiarme”. (Mc 1,40) Hay que tomar nota de esta actitud del leproso.

Para el leproso que no debe aparecer en público, venir ante Jesús y arrodillarse, rogándole que lo limpie, es una actitud de humildad; humildad ante Jesús en quien ve a Dios. No sólo que sea humilde ante Jesús, sino también que reconozca la autoridad divina de Jesús, pues nadie podría limpiarlo, ni siquiera el hospital. Es su fe en la capacidad de Jesús para salvarlo lo que realmente hará que Jesús se compadezca y le haga extender la mano para tocarlo y curarlo. Admiramos el coraje y la fe de este leproso para acudir a Jesús sin miedo a buscar su curación.

Todavía hoy hay muchos leprosos en nuestra sociedad. De hecho, todos somos leprosos de alguna manera ya que todos somos pecadores y el pecado tiene el mismo efecto en nosotros. Nos hace impuros; nos separa de la relación con Dios y de la relación con la Iglesia. Lamentablemente ni siquiera somos conscientes de esto, de necesitar a Jesús como el leproso del evangelio. También necesitamos ir a inclinarnos ante Jesús y pedirle perdón de nuestros pecados para que seamos curados, para estar bien.


