





**MEDITATION**

Close friendship with God brings lost life back to us. Many are those who have lost happiness. Some have lost an anointing to do certain things. Some people are in the grave of a particular life style that they don't know how to come out of it. Failure has put someone in the grave of "it cannot happen again." Some find themselves in the grave of "it is not possible" even though the fact remains that with God all things are possible.

The act of divine friendship is an initiative of God himself. This type of friendship we are talking about here is the one that brings dead beings in graves back to life. (cf. Ez. 37:12) In order to enjoy this divine friendship, one needs to cry for "the spirit of the living God"(cf. Ez. 37:14) This is because "anyone who does not have the spirit of Christ does not belong to him." When the spirit of Christ finds its way into you, Saint Paul in his letter to the Romans 8:10 tells us that, "although your bodies are dead because of sin, your spirits are alive because of righteousness." We need to make close friends with Jesus to enjoy the good things that come with it. But you may not become a friend to Jesus if you have not yet realized or understood that LIFE is about **being concerned with Spiritual Things**. It is important to note that the Spiritual Self controls the Corporeal, the bodily or the physical self. That is why we cannot but agree with St. Paul that, "the concern of the flesh is death, but the concern of the spirit us life and peace." (cf. Romans 8:6)

Lazarus is grateful to his sister Martha for her friendship with Jesus. It is because of which that he got the opportunity to come out of the premature death he went through to enjoy some more life. Remember that Martha had responded to the friendship of Jesus many years back. Her friendship with Jesus brought her siblings in contact with Jesus. It implies that my friendship with Jesus has a ripple effect on my family members and close associates.

In this period of Lent, **let us use what we have to make friends with Jesus**. According to Luke 10:38-42 Martha saw that Jesus needed to eat in order to continue his ministry so she decided to use her resources (money, cooking skills) to make friends with Jesus.

**MEDITATION** (continued)

For instance, not everyone knows how to sing well. You know how to sing well. Jesus would love to be a friend to you as you use your voice to make singing at Mass a beautiful one. Remember Jesus says in Matthew 25: 40 that whatever you do for these brothers of mine you do for me. So, your acts of charity will create a good bond of friendship between you and Jesus.

The end product of it all is that Jesus will cause what we have lost and what is dead in our lives to come back to us like Martha who had her dead brother come back to life. In fact, God will bring us home in the Land of Israel: that is to say where we truly belong in life as the prophet Ezekiel has declared as a promise of God in the first reading of today (cf. Ez. 37: 12-14).

**PASTORAL SERVICES FOR THE COMMUNITY**

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:**

Baptisms are generally held on the last Sunday of the month. Requests for a different date and time will be honored to the extent possible. Parents and sponsors who have not yet received the required baptismal instruction are expected to do so by attending our baptismal preparation program. Call the parish office well in advance so that class arrangements can be made.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:**

Anyone wishing to have his or her wedding celebrated at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral must contact the parish office 9-12 months prior to the celebration and talk to a priest for pre-wedding counseling. Please visit our website www.cathedralvi.org or call us at 340-774-0201. The Sacrament of Marriage is generally celebrated on a Saturday between the hours of 11:00AM and 2:00PM. Please contact the parish priest if you would like a different time for your wedding. (Note that Saturday mornings are reserved for cleaning and decorating the cathedral.)

If anyone in your family is sick or shut-in, please inform the parish office so that we can pray for them and arrange to visit them. Funeral Masses at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral are held on the designated day at 9:30AM. MEDITACIÓN

La estrecha amistad con Dios nos devuelve la vida perdida. Muchos son los que han perdido la felicidad. Algunos han perdido una unción para hacer ciertas cosas. Algunas personas están en la tumba de un estilo de vida particular que no saben cómo salir de él. El fracaso ha puesto a alguien en la tumba de 'no puede volver a suceder'. Algunos se encuentran en la tumba de "no es posible" a pesar de que el hecho es que con Dios todas las cosas son posibles.

El acto de amistad divina es una iniciativa de Dios mismo. Este tipo de amistad de la que estamos hablando aquí es la que devuelve a la vida a los seres muertos en las tumbas. (cf. Ez 37:12) Para disfrutar de esta amistad divina, es necesario clamar por "el espíritu del Dios vivo" (cf. Ez 37, 14). Pero es posible que no te conviertas en un amigo de Jesús si aún no te has dado cuenta o entendido que la VIDA se trata de estar preocupado por las Cosas Espirituales. Es importante notar que el Ser Espiritual controla el yo corporal, corporal o físico. Es por eso que no podemos dejar de estar de acuerdo con San Pablo en que "la preocupación de la carne es la muerte, pero la preocupación del espíritu es la vida y la paz". (cf. Romanos 8:6)

El hermano Lázaro está agradecido a su hermana Marta por su amistad con Jesús. Es por lo que tuvo la oportunidad de salir de la muerte prematura por la que pasó para disfrutar de un poco más de vida. Recuerde que Marta había respondido a la amistad de Jesús muchos años atrás. Su amistad con Jesús puso a sus hermanos en contacto con Jesús. Implica que mi amistad con Jesús tiene un efecto dominó en los miembros de mi familia y asociados cercanos.

En este período de Cuaresma, usemos lo que tenemos para hacernos amigos de Jesús. Según Lucas 10:38-42, Marta vio que Jesús necesitaba comer para continuar su ministerio, por lo que decidió usar sus recursos (dinero, habilidades culinarias) para hacerse amiga de Jesús.

Por ejemplo, notodo el mundo sabe cantar bien. Sabes cantar bien. A Jesús le encantaría ser un amigo para ti mientras usas tu voz para hacer que cantar en Mass sea hermoso. Recuerda que Jesús dice en Mateo 25:40 que todo lo que hagas por estos hermanos míos lo haces por mí. Por lo tanto, sus actos de caridad crearán un buen vínculo de amistad entre usted y Jesús.

El producto final de todo esto es que Jesús hará que lo que tenemos lo que está muerto en nuestras vidas regrese a nosotros como Marta, que hizo que su hermano muerto volviera a la vida. De hecho, Dios nos llevará a casa en la Tierra de Israel: es decir, donde realmente pertenecemos en la vida, como el profeta Ezequiel ha declarado como promesa de Dios en la primera lectura de hoy (cf. Ez 37, 12-14).

Usa lo que tienes para hacerte amigo de Jesús.

Pray

Lord, when my prayer does not lead to the outcome for which I hoped, help me to let go and trust that Your way is the way of wisdom and that we humans do not always discern what is best.
