

REFLECTION

“Teach Me Your Ways, O Lord” Ps 25

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Very often we find ourselves in situations where we do not really know what to think, say or do, we do not know what is the will of God on us, what God wants of us. In these particular situations, the Psalmist prays by telling God: “Teach me your ways O Lord.. Good and upright is the Lord; thus He shows sinners the way. He guides the humble to justice and teaches the humble his way.” (Ps 25)

The people of the great city of Nineveh were misbehaving, committing all sorts of evils that showed their infidelities towards God. But some few ones, who saw how things were not going on fine in the city or in people’s behaviour, who saw the moral decadence of the people, prayed to God to save them. In response to their prayers, God raised the Prophet Jonah to go to Nineveh and announce his message to the people. Jonah went and did just that, saying: “Forty days more and Nineveh will be destroyed.” It was God’s warning to the people through the mouth of the prophet. We are told that “when the people of Nineveh believed God, they proclaimed a fast, and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth” as a sign of repentance and conversion. Their actions spoke louder than mere words so much so that “when God saw..how they turned from their evil way, he did no longer punish them as initially planned. God did not want them to die, but to change and live as they followed his way. Let us also ask God to teach us his ways.

In the time of John the Baptist, the people were also wayward. In preparation for the coming of Jesus the Messiah, John also announced the message of God to the people, asking them to change and receive baptism as a sign of conversion. Many people came and sought to be baptized. It was a sign of their conversion in order to carry out God’s will, to follow his way.

Reflection(continued)

In today’s gospel, we also see that when Jesus came to Galilee after John the Baptist’s arrest, he preached the same conversion: “This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel.” (Mk 1:16) To repent and believe in the gospel means to change and do what the gospel says.

In fact, true religion demands conversion, a positive change of behavior towards our brothers and sisters, and towards God. It presupposes that we do acknowledge our state of sinners in order to ask God to guide us on his way. When we come to church on Sunday or every day, when we listen to God’s word, it should change us, we must be transformed, something should change in our life. We cannot meet God and remain the same. Unfortunately, many come to church, listen to God’s word every day and yet remain the same in such a way that people begin to wonder whether we are really serious with our faith, or whether we are just church goers? We come to church angry with our husband, our wife, or with our children, relatives or friends and go out church still bearing a grudge against them. When we refuse to forgive or to talk to one another or to some people, are we still Christians that way? When we hear that God is a God of justice and we are aware that we are unjust towards some people, that we are keeping their rights, their good or salaries unduly, are we still Christians that way?

Dear Brothers and Sisters, it is not easy to be a Christian, a real converted Christian. That is why we should be praying, begging God to teach us his ways and to grant us the grace to carry out his will by doing good and what he expects from us.

Grant us a pure heart, to love our neighbors as ourselves. May the gift of your Holy Spirit enable us to see your presence in our sisters and brothers, that we may love each other with the same unconditional love with which you love us. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Call the parish office well in advance so that class arrangements can be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:
Anyone wishing to have his or her wedding celebrated at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral must contact the parish office 9-12 months prior to the celebration and talk to a priest for pre-wedding counseling. Please visit our website www.cathedralvi.org or call us at 340-774-0201. The Sacrament of Marriage is generally celebrated on a Saturday between the hours of 11:00AM and 2:00PM. Please contact the parish priest if you would like a different time for your wedding. (Note that Saturday mornings are reserved for cleaning and decorating the cathedral.)

VISITING AND ANNOINTING THE SICK:
If anyone in your family is sick or shut-in, please inform the parish office so that we can pray for them and arrange to visit them. Please note that the hospital does not notify us when Catholics are in the hospital. Please call the parish office to inform us of a Catholic in the hospital who needs to have a priest visit. Thank you!

Funeral Masses at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral are held on the designated day at 9:30AM. Please make arrangements with the Church office before the funeral home to assure availability of the date requested. The Funeral Program should read “Christian Burial” on the cover. If you would like a different time, please contact the parish priest. Viewings will not take place inside the cathedral. Funerals generally are not held on weekends (Saturday or Sunday). REFLEXIÓN

“Enséñame tus caminos, oh Señor” Sal 25

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Muy a menudo nos encontramos en situaciones en las que no sabemos realmente qué pensar, decir o hacer, no sabemos cuál es la voluntad de Dios sobre nosotros, qué quiere Dios de nosotros. En estas situaciones particulares, el salmista ora diciéndole a Dios: “Enséñame tus caminos, oh Señor... Bueno y recto es el Señor; así muestra el camino a los pecadores. Él guía a los humildes hacia la justicia y les enseña su camino”. (Sal 25)

Los habitantes de la gran ciudad de Nínive se portaban mal, cometiendo toda clase de maldades que demostraban sus infidelidades hacia Dios. Pero algunos pocos, que vieron que las cosas no iban bien en la ciudad o en el comportamiento de la gente, que vieron la decadencia moral de la gente, oraron a Dios para que los salvara. En respuesta a sus oraciones, Dios resucitó al profeta Jonás para que fuera a Nínive y anunciara su mensaje al pueblo. Jonás fue e hizo precisamente eso, diciendo: “Cuarenta días más y Nínive será destruida”. Fue la advertencia de Dios al pueblo por boca del profeta. Se nos dice que “cuando el pueblo de Nínive creyó a Dios, proclamaron un ayuno, y todos, grandes y pequeños, se vistieron de cilicio” como señal de arrepentimiento y conversión. Sus acciones hablaban más que meras palabras, hasta el punto de que “cuando Dios vio... cómo se habían apartado de su mal camino, ya no los castigó como inicialmente había planeado. Dios no quería que murieran, sino que cambiaran y vivieran siguiendo su camino. Pidamos también a Dios que nos enseñe sus caminos.

En tiempos de Juan el Bautista, el pueblo también era descarriado. En preparación para la venida de Jesús el Mesías, Juan también anunció el mensaje de Dios al pueblo, pidiéndoles que cambiaran y recibieran el bautismo como signo de conversión. Mucha gente vino y buscó ser bautizada. Fue un signo de su conversión para realizar la voluntad de Dios, para seguir su camino.

En el evangelio de hoy, también vemos que cuando Jesús vino a Galilea después del arresto de Juan el Bautista, predicó la misma conversión: “Este es el tiempo del cumplimiento. El reino de Dios está cerca. Arrepientete y cree en el evangelio”. (Mc 1:16) Arrepentirse y creer en el evangelio significa cambiar y hacer lo que dice el evangelio.

REFLEXIÓN continuada

De hecho, la verdadera religión exige conversión, un cambio positivo de comportamiento hacia nuestros hermanos y hermanas y hacia Dios. Presupone que reconozcamos nuestro estado de pecadores para pedirle a Dios que nos guíe en su camino. Cuando venimos a la iglesia el domingo o todos los días, cuando escuchamos la palabra de Dios, ella debe cambiarnos, debemos ser transformados, algo debe cambiar en nuestra vida. No podemos encontrarnos con Dios y seguir siendo los mismos. Desafortunadamente, muchos vienen a la iglesia, escuchan la palabra de Dios todos los días y, sin embargo, permanecen iguales de tal manera que la gente comienza a preguntarse si realmente tomamos en serio nuestra fe o si solo asistimos a la iglesia. Venimos a la iglesia enojados con nuestro esposo, nuestra esposa, o con nuestros hijos, parientes o amigos y salimos de la iglesia todavía guardando rencor contra ellos.
