Jesus offers Himself in His Body and in His Blood for the Salvation of the World

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

In communion with the whole Church, we celebrate today the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ commonly called "Corpus Christi". In fact, it is the feast of Jesus who gives Himself as food and drink for the salvation of all the world.

May He grant us ple of Israel became wild towards Moses because they the grace to always prepare ourselves before mass were hungry and thirsty. God had to intervene after Moses' prayer and offered them food and drink. Sometimes, that is how we too do behave. When we are hungry or thirsty, we become wild and no longer listen. In the case of the people of Israel, they listened to God's word and answered with one voice: "we will do everything that the Lord has told us." They thus made a covenant with God, just as we do make covenants with Him too. Let us remember the number of promises we have already made to God since our baptism and our first holy communion. What is interesting to realize is that when the people of Israel made the promise to carry out God's will, God blessed them through Moses with the blood of sacrifice that he sprinkled on them. God blesses us too. But do we on our own part keep our promises to God?

In every culture, people offered sacrifices to God in one way or another with the blood of an animal to seek God's blessings. With the coming of Christ, it is no more Man who goes to God with an animal as sacrificial offering, but God who comes to Man through Christ. Jesus offers himself once and for all in his body and in his blood as sacrificial offering for the salvation of the world. On Holy Thursday, he asked his disciples to continue to offer this sacrifice for the salvation of the world in the eucharist in memory of Him. It is this unbloody sacrifice which, as the Author of the letter to the Hebrews puts it, "cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God" and which leads us to eternal life. (Heb.9:13-15) (Mark 14:22-26)

Meditation (continued)

In fact salvation is already acquired by Christ for all, but we still have to earn it individually. Jesus is offering himself to us, true enough! But we still have to fulfill some conditions in order to receive him with the graces and the salvation he offers us. We may ask ourselves what are those conditions?

We do attend mass every day or every Sunday. We come for communion very often in imitation of those who have prepared themselves to receive Holy communion. Do we ask ourselves whether we are well prepared to receive Holy Communion? It is not enough to receive communion, to eat and drink the body and blood of Christ. We should be in a state of grace for it to produce the fruits that we want. That is why we were told in catechism that we should prepare ourselves before mass by examining our conscience to see whether we have a sin that prevents us from receiving Holy communion or not. If yes, then we should go to confession to be one with God and with the Church before receiving Holy communion during holy mass. It is only under this condition that the Body and Blood of Christ that we receive can give us the graces we need or

Saints Peter & Paul Cathedral 250th Jubilee Gala & Dinner Dance



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are generally held on the last Sunday of the month. Requests for a different date and time will be honored to the extent possible. Parents and sponsors who have not yet received the required baptismal instruction are expected to do so by attending our baptismal preparation program. Call the parish office well in advance so that class arrangements can be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Anyone wishing to have his or her wedding celebrated at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral must contact the parish office 9-12 months prior to the celebration and talk to a priest for pre-wedding counseling. Please visit our website www.cathedralvi.org or call us at 340-774-0201. The Sacrament of Marriage is generally celebrated on a Saturday between the hours of 11:00AM and 2:00PM. Please contact the parish priest if you would like a different time for your wedding. (Note that Saturday mornings are reserved for cleaning and decorating the cathedral.)

VISITING AND ANNOINTING THE SICK:

If anyone in your family is sick or shut-in, please inform the parish office so that we can pray for them and arrange to visit them. Please note that the hospital does not notify us when Catholics are in the hospital. Please call the parish office to inform us of a Catholic in the hospital who needs to have a priest visit. Thank you!

FUNERAL MASSES:

Funeral Masses at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral are held on the designated day at 9:30AM. Please make arrangements with the Church office before the funeral home to assure availability of the date requested. The Funeral Program should read "Christian **Burial**" on the cover. If you would like a different time, please contact the parish priest. Viewings will not take place inside the cathedral. Funerals generally are not held on weekends (Saturday or Sunday). Thank you for your cooperation.

Jesús se ofrece en su Cuerpo y en Su Sangre para la Salvación del Mundo

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

En comunión con toda la Iglesia, celebramos hoy la solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo comúnmente llamado "Corpus Christi". De hecho, es la fiesta de Jesús que se da a sí mismo como alimento y bebida para la salvación de todo el mundo.

En verdad, el hombre siempre ha sido un hombre enojado, hambriento y sediento. Recordamos que en el desierto el pueblo de Israel se volvió salvaje hacia Moisés porque tenía hambre y sed. Dios tuvo que intervenir después de la oración de Moisés y ofrecerles comida y bebida. A veces, así es como nos comportamos nosotros también. Cuando tenemos hambre o sed, nos volvemos salvajes y ya no escuchamos. En el caso del pueblo de Israel, escucharon la palabra de Dios y respondieron a una sola voz: "haremos todo lo que el Señor nos ha dicho". De esta manera hicieron un pacto con Dios, tal como nosotros también hacemos pactos con El. Recordemos la cantidad de promesas que ya le hemos hecho a Dios desde nuestro bautismo y nuestra primera comunión. Lo que es interesante darse cuenta es que cuando el pueblo de Israel hizo la promesa de llevar a cabo la voluntad de Dios, Dios los bendijo a través de Moisés con la sangre del sacrificio que roció sobre ellos. Dios nos bendiga a nosotros también. Pero, ¿cumplimos nosotros por nuestra parte nuestras promesas a Dios?

En todas las culturas, la gente ofrecía sacrificios a Dios de una forma u otra con la sangre de un animal para buscar las bendicio nes de Dios. Con la venida de Cristo, ya no es el Hombre el que va a Dios con un animal como ofrenda de sacrificio, sino Dios quien viene al Hombre a través de Cristo. Jesús se ofrece a sí mismo una vez por todas en su cuerpo y en su sangre como ofrenda de sacrificio por la salvación del mundo. El Jueves Santo pidió a sus discípulos que siguieran ofreciendo este sacrificio por la salvación del mundo en la eucaristía en memoria de El. Es este sacrificio incruento el que, como dice el autor de la carta a los Hebreos, "limpia nuestra conciencia de obras muertas para adorar al Dios vivo" el que nos conduce a la vida eterna. (Heb.9:13-15) (Marcos 14:22-26) De hecho, Cristo ya ha adquirido la salvación para todos, pero todavía tenemos que ganárnosla individualmente. Jesús se ofrece a nosotros, jes cierto!
