

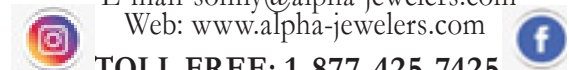

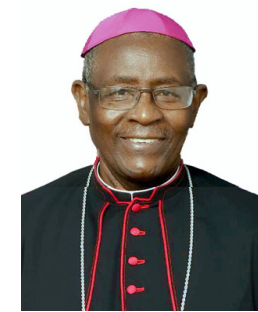
Please be aware that during the COVID-19 pandemic, we recommend the following practices:

First Sunday of Lent

First Reading: Deuteronomy 26:4-10
Moses describes the offering of praise for God's deliverance of Israel.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 91:1-2,10-11,12-13,14-15
A prayer for God's protection

Second Reading: Romans 10:8-13
Paul teaches that we are saved by faith.

Gospel Reading: Luke 4:1-13
In the desert, Jesus is tempted by the devil.

Background on the Gospel Reading

In each of the three Synoptic Gospels, after his baptism, Jesus is reported to have spent forty days in the desert, fasting and praying. In Luke and in Matthew, the devil presents three temptations to Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power to appease his hunger, he offers Jesus all the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will worship him, and he tempts Jesus to put God's promise of protection to the test. In each case, Jesus resists, citing words from Scripture to rebuke the devil's temptation.

Each temptation that Jesus faces, offers insight into the spirituality we hope to develop as we keep the forty days of the Season of Lent. We can trust God to provide for our material needs. We worship God because God alone has dominion over us and our world. We can trust God to be faithful to his promises. Jesus' rejection of the devil's temptations shows that he will not put God to the test. Grounding himself on the Word and authority of Scripture, Jesus rebukes the devil by his confidence in God's protection and faithfulness.

This Gospel highlights for us one of the central themes of the Season of Lent. **We are dependent upon God for all that we have and all that we are.** Anything that leads us to reject this dependency or to distrust its sufficiency is a temptation from the devil.

Luke ends his report of Jesus' temptation in the desert by noting that the devil departs for a time. The implication is that the devil will return. Jesus knows that he will be tempted again in the Garden of Gethsemane. The depth of Jesus' trust in God is shown most fully when Jesus rejects the temptation to turn away from the task God has given to him. Jesus' final rebuke of the devil is his sacrifice on the Cross.

Jesus' responses to the temptations of the devil teach us how we can respond to temptation. As we start our journey through Lent, **this Sunday's Gospel calls us to adopt the same confidence that Jesus had in the face of temptation:** God's word alone will suffice, God's promise of protection can be trusted, and God alone is God.

Pope Francis' Lenten Message 2025

Pope Francis urged Christians to examine their consciences in Lent by comparing their daily lives to the hardships faced by migrants, calling it a way to grow in empathy and discover God's call to compassion.

"It would be a good Lenten exercise for us to compare our daily life with that of some migrant or foreigner, to learn how to sympathize with their experiences and in this way discover what God is asking of us so that we can better advance on our journey to the house of the Father," the Pope wrote in his message for Lent 2025.

The message, signed Feb. 6, before the Pope was hospitalized Feb. 14 for treatment of double pneumonia, was released by the Vatican Feb. 25. Reflecting on the theme "Let us journey together in hope," the Pope said that Lent is a time to confront both personal and collective struggles with faith and compassion.

Comparing the Lenten journey to the Israelites' exodus from slavery in Egypt, he recalled "our brothers and sisters who in our own day are fleeing situations of misery and violence in search of a better life for themselves and their loved ones."

"A first call to conversion thus comes from the realization that all of us are pilgrims in this life," he wrote. "Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and hopelessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone?"

Pope Francis also emphasized the importance of journeying together, saying Christians are called to walk "side by side, without shoving or stepping on others, without envy or hypocrisy, without letting anyone be left behind or excluded." Christians, he said, should reflect on whether they are open to others or focused only on their own needs.

The Pope called on Christians to journey together in hope toward Easter, living out the central message of the Jubilee Year: "Hope does not disappoint."

Another Lenten call to conversion, he said, is to embrace hope and trust in God's promise of eternal life, made possible through Christ's resurrection. Pope Francis encouraged Christians to consider whether they truly live in a way that reflects hope, trusting in God's promise of eternal life, seeking forgiveness and committing themselves to justice, fraternity and care for creation.

"Christ," he wrote, "lives and reigns in glory. Death has been transformed into triumph, and the faith and great hope of Christians rests in this: the resurrection of Christ!"

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are generally held on the last Sunday of the month. Requests for a different date and time will be honored to the extent possible. Parents and sponsors who have not yet received the required baptismal instruction are expected to do so by attending our baptismal preparation program. Call the parish office well in advance so that class arrangements can be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Anyone wishing to have his or her wedding celebrated at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral must contact the parish office 9-12 months prior to the celebration and talk to a priest for pre-wedding counseling. Please visit our website www.cathedralvi.org or call us at 340-774-0201. The Sacrament of Marriage is generally celebrated on a Saturday between the hours of 11:00AM and 2:00PM. Please contact the parish priest if you would like a different time for your wedding. (Note that Saturday mornings are reserved for cleaning and decorating the cathedral.)

VISITING AND ANNOINTING THE SICK:

If anyone in your family is sick or shut-in, please inform the parish office so that we can pray for them and arrange to visit them. Please note that the hospital does not notify us when Catholics are in the hospital. Please call the parish office to inform us of a Catholic in the hospital who needs to have a priest visit. Thank you!

FUNERAL MASSES:

Funeral Masses at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral are held on the designated day at 9:30AM. Please make arrangements with the Church office before the funeral home to assure availability of the date requested. The Funeral Program should read "**Christian Burial**" on the cover. If you would like a different time, please contact the parish priest. Viewings will not take place inside the cathedral. Funerals generally are not held on weekends (Saturday or Sunday). Thank you for your cooperation.

Primer Domingo de Cuaresma

Primera lectura: Deuteronomio 26:4-10
Moisés describe la ofrenda de alabanza por la liberación de Israel por parte de Dios.

Salmo responsorial: Salmo 91:1-2,10-11,12-13,14-15
Una oración por la protección de Dios

Segunda lectura: Romanos 10:8-13: Pablo enseña que somos salvos por la fe.

Lectura del Evangelio: Lucas 4:1-13
En el desierto, Jesús es tentado por el diablo.

Antecedentes de la lectura del Evangelio:
En cada uno de los tres Evangelios sinópticos, después de su bautismo, se informa que Jesús pasó cuarenta días en el desierto, ayunando y orando. En Lucas y Mateo, el diablo presenta tres tentaciones a Jesús. El diablo tienta a Jesús para que use su poder para apaciguar su hambre, le ofrece todos los reinos del mundo si lo adora y lo tienta para que ponga a prueba la promesa de protección de Dios. En cada caso, Jesús resiste, citando palabras de las Escrituras para reprender la tentación del diablo.

Cada tentación que enfrenta Jesús ofrece una perspectiva de la espiritualidad que esperamos desarrollar al guardar los cuarenta días del Tiempo de Cuaresma. Podemos confiar en que Dios proveerá para nuestras necesidades materiales. Adoramos a Dios porque solo Dios tiene dominio sobre nosotros y nuestro mundo. Podemos confiar en que Dios será fiel a sus promesas. El rechazo de Jesús a las tentaciones del diablo muestra que no pondrá a Dios a prueba. Basándose en la Palabra y la autoridad de las Escrituras, Jesús reprende al diablo con su confianza en la protección y fidelidad de Dios.

Este Evangelio destaca para nosotros uno de los temas centrales del Tiempo de Cuaresma. Dependemos de Dios para todo lo que tenemos y todo lo que somos. Todo lo que nos lleva a rechazar esta dependencia o a desconfiar de su suficiencia es una tentación del diablo.

Lucas termina su relato de la tentación de Jesús en el desierto señalando que el diablo se va por un tiempo. La implicación es que el diablo volverá. Jesús sabe que será tentado nuevamente en el Huerto de Getsemaní. La profundidad de la confianza de Jesús en Dios se muestra más plenamente cuando Jesús rechaza la tentación de alejarse de la tarea que Dios le ha encomendado. La última reprimenda de Jesús al diablo es su sacrificio en la cruz.

Las respuestas de Jesús a las tentaciones del diablo nos enseñan cómo podemos responder a la tentación. Al comenzar nuestro viaje a través de la Cuaresma, el Evangelio de este domingo nos llama a adoptar la misma confianza que Jesús tenía frente a la tentación: solo la palabra de Dios bastará, se puede confiar en la promesa de protección de Dios y solo Dios es Dios.
