

Gospel Reading: John 10:27-30 Jesus describes his care for his sheep.

Background on the Gospel Reading The fourth Sunday of Easter is also called Good Shepherd Sunday. In each of the three lectionary cycles, the Gospel is taken from the tenth chapter of the Gospel of John. This chapter of John's Gospel follows Jesus' healing of the man born blind and the rejection of this miracle by Jewish leaders who question Jesus' authority to heal. Jesus responds to this challenge to his authority by calling himself the Good Shepherd. He is criticizing the Pharisees and other Jewish leaders. Already, the Pharisees and other Jewish leaders are so angered that they attempt to stone and arrest Jesus (see John 10:31 and 10:39). This controversy with the religious leaders continues until Jesus' death.

(Background on the Gospel continued)

Its power to describe the relationship between Jesus and his followers transcends direct experience with sheep. The image speaks to us about the protection, security, and care that shepherds represent for their sheep.

Today's Gospel speaks powerfully about the familiarity and intimacy between Jesus and his disciples, expressed as recognizing and knowing another's voice. Today's Gospel also speaks to the relationship between Jesus and the Father. In the Gospel of John, Jesus identifies so closely with the Father that he tells us that they are one not just close, but actually one. To know **Jesus is to know the Father.** Jesus doesn't just bring us closer to the Father, Jesus puts us directly into contact with God the Father, removing all distance between us. Our relationship with Jesus is an invitation to share in the life of God.



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are generally held on the last Sunday of the month. Requests for a different date and time will be honored to the extent possible. Parents and sponsors who have not yet received the required baptismal instruction are expected to do so by attending our baptismal preparation program. Call the parish office well in advance so that class arrangements can be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Anyone wishing to have his or her wedding celebrated at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral must contact the parish office 9-12 months prior to the celebration and talk to a priest for pre-wedding counseling. Please visit our website www.cathedralvi.org or call us at 340-774-0201. The Sacrament of Marriage is generally celebrated on a Saturday between the hours of 11:00AM and 2:00PM. Please contact the parish priest if you would like a different time for your wedding. (Note that Saturday mornings are reserved for cleaning and decorating the cathedral.)

VISITING AND ANNOINTING THE SICK:

If anyone in your family is sick or shut-in, please inform the parish office so that we can pray for them and arrange to visit them. Please note that the hospital does not notify us when Catholics are in the hospital. Please call the parish office to inform us of a Catholic in the hospital who needs to have a priest visit. Thank you!

FUNERAL MASSES:

Funeral Masses at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral are held on the designated day at 9:30AM. Please make arrangements with the Church office before the funeral home to assure availability of the date requested. The Funeral Program should read "Christian Burial" on the cover. If you would like a different time, please contact the parish priest. Viewings will not take place inside the cathedral. Funerals generally are not held on weekends (Saturday or Sunday). Thank you for your cooperation.

Cuarto Domíngo de Pascua

Primera Lectura: Hechos de los Apóstoles 13:14,43-52 Pablo y Bernabé predican la buena nueva entre los gentiles y son expulsados por los judíos.

Salmo Responsorial: Salmo 100:1-2,3,5 Un cántico de alabanza a Dios, nuestro pastor.

Segunda Lectura: Apocalipsis 7:9,14b-17 Juan describe su visión de las alabanzas que los santos cantan al Cordero.

Lectura del Evangelio: Juan 10:27-30 Jesús describe su cuidado de sus ovejas.

Antecedentes de la Lectura del Evangelio

El cuarto domingo de Pascua también se llama Domingo del Buen Pastor. En cada uno de los tres ciclos leccionarios, el Evangelio se toma del capítulo diez del Evangelio de Juan. Este capítulo del Evangelio de Juan sigue la curación del ciego de nacimiento por parte de Jesús y el rechazo de este milagro por parte de los líderes judíos, quienes cuestionan la autoridad de Jesús para sanar. Jesús responde a este desafío a su autoridad llamándose el Buen Pastor. Critica a los fariseos y a otros líderes judíos. Estos, indignados, intentan apedrear y arrestar a Jesús (véase Juan 10:31 y 10:39). Esta controversia con los líderes religiosos continúa hasta la muerte de Jesús.

En un momento de tensión y conflicto en el Evangelio de Juan, la lectura del Evangelio de hoy es la respuesta de Jesús a la pregunta: "¿Eres tú el Mesías?". Jesús responde, en esencia, diciendo: "Si tienes que preguntar, entonces no eres de mis ovejas". Entonces Jesús afirma su unidad con el Padre. Al concluir estas palabras, Juan informa que los judíos intentan apedrear a Jesús por blasfemia, pero él escapa del arresto.

Quizás estemos menos familiarizados con las metáforas de oveja y pastor que aquellos a quienes Jesús se dirigió. La imagen de Jesús como el Buen Pastor y la comunidad de seguidores como sus ovejas ha perdurado a lo largo de los siglos como una imagen fundamental en nuestra tradición de fe.

Jesús no solo nos acerca al Padre, sino que nos pone en contacto directo con Dios Padre, eliminando toda distancia entre nosotros. Nuestra relación con Jesús es una invitación a compartir la vida de Dios.
