The Church Is Catholic With A Variety Of Gifts

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

We celebrate today the feast of Pentecost which reminds us of the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples, making everyone listen to the word of God in his own language. What a miracle. This is the real beginning of the church. This is when the church became "Catholic" in the true sense of the terms, that is, universal, open to everyone. The Jews thought that the church was their private prop-erty, and that all the others who were non-Jews were strangers and did not have the same rights in the strangers and did not have the same rights in the church. The Pentecost event which conferred the Holy Spirit to everyone made each person understand the word in his own language showed that the church was for all and that all people have equal rights in the church. It was difficult for the Jews in hand with others in a spirit of complemenof the time to understand this. It is the event of tarity. Pentecost which makes them see that the church is UNIVERSAL, CATHOLIC, OPEN TO EVERY-BODY.

In our world today, the church is established in many parts of the world; but some people think that it is their property because it is in their village or in their region, or in their country. They are not open to accepting strangers nor other languages in the church. They think they should be the ones to decide everything in the church because it belongs to them. The Feast of Pentecost helps us to under-stand that we are all God's children and each of us is important and has a place in His church. He wants all men and women to be saved and come to the knowledge of the Truth. We are all called to be one in the Church, despite the diversity of our origins, languages, and cultures, and even graces.

The Pentecost-event makes us also realize that there is a diversity of graces that God grants to people. We do not all have the same rights. As St. Paul men-tions in the first letter to the Corinthians. There are different kinds of gifts, but they are granted by the same spirit not only for us, but for the benefit of all.

Meditation (continued)

We are meant to be complimentary. God does not give everything to one person; He gives a bit to each one of us so that we should use them for ourselves and for the good of the community. We should therefore not be egotistic with our gifts but put them at the service of all. That is what St. Paul means to say when he writes to the Corinthians: "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ." We constitute many parts of the one Body, the Church. Though many we are one and the harmony of the one Body depends on all the parts that we are. That is why it is impor-tant to help one another and to live un comple-mentarity with our various gifts. But are even aware of our own gifts so as to thank God for them and make use of them for the church or for others? If we are aware of our gifts, do we

Let us beg God to forgive us for not always being open to those who come to our church and for not using our gist for those who need our help. May He grant us the grace to be

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,
