

MEDITATION

Let Us Live In Communion and Love Like The Trinity

Dear Brothers and sisters in Christ,

We celebrate today in communion with the whole Church, the feast of the Holy Trinity, that is the feast of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In fact, we believe in one God who is in these three persons. He is the one whom we call whenever we make the sign of the cross at the beginning of our prayer. We mean to say that the one whom we want to address now is the God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and not any other one.

In the world, people believe in different gods. When we talk about God in the world, we do not always refer to the same person. That is why we have to be careful and begin our prayer with the sign of the cross to clearly express the God whom we are calling and to whom we want to talk. If you call God He will come to you; if you call other gods or Satan or the Devil, they too will come to you. We have to be careful.

The feast of today reveals to us who God is. We do discover that He is essentially relation and communion. The Father is in relation with the Son, and the Holy Spirit. All three are in relation with one another and at the same time in communion with one another, that is, in union with one another. They are essentially relational and live in perfect unity. That is what characterizes our God, and which should also characterize us as we are made in the image and likeness of God.


As image of God, we come into the world in a trinitarian relation: the father, the mother, and the child. All three are supposed to live always in relation with one another in order to really be in the image and likeness of the Trinity who created us. In the same way, all three are supposed to live in communion, that is in unity with one another in order to resemble the Trinity. But can we really say that we are in the image of the Trinity? When we look at our various families, we see that sometimes, we do not even reflect the Trinity in its relational nature because the father and the mother are not in relation with each other, or some children are not in relation with the parents.

Meditation (continued)

When things are this way, we cannot say that we are in the image and likeness of God. In the same way, when we are not in communion or in union with one another, we cannot say that we are in the image and likeness of God. It is when we look back at our lives that we notice that we are not really in the image and likeness of God and that we still have to make some effort in order to be in his image and likeness.

Beyond the relational and communion aspects that characterize the Trinity, there is LOVE. For true, what is more important to keep in mind about the Trinity, is the love that unites all the three persons. The Father loves the Son and the Holy Spirit and vice versa. As image of God, we are also to love one another in order to reflect God. Here again we are found wanting because as Saint Paul said to the Romans 8:14, we are sons of God if we "are led by the Spirit of God", but unfortunately, we do not usually allow ourselves to be led by the Spirit of God every day and in every circumstance. We want to rely on ourselves, on our intelligence, on our means, and on our relations, to decide by ourselves and do things by ourselves. Yet if we allow the Spirit of God to lead us, we will think and act out of love, we will do things out of love in order to be in the likeness of God.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, on this day of the Trinity, let us try to be in the image and likeness of our God - Trinity who is essentially relational, communion and LOVE. May we also be good relational people who live in communion with others and manifest God's love to others. In this way, we would deserve to share God's glory in heaven for ever and ever.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are generally held on the last Sunday of the month. Requests for a different date and time will be honored to the extent possible. Parents and sponsors who have not yet received the required baptismal instruction are expected to do so by attending our baptismal preparation program. Call the parish office well in advance so that class arrangements can be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Anyone wishing to have his or her wedding celebrated at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral must contact the parish office 9-12 months prior to the celebration and talk to a priest for pre-wedding counseling. Please visit our website www.cathedralvi.org or call us at 340-774-0201. The Sacrament of Marriage is generally celebrated on a Saturday between the hours of 11:00AM and 2:00PM. Please contact the parish priest if you would like a different time for your wedding. (Note that Saturday mornings are reserved for cleaning and decorating the cathedral.)

VISITING AND ANOINTING THE SICK:

If anyone in your family is sick or shut-in, please inform the parish office so that we can pray for them and arrange to visit them. Please note that the hospital does not notify us when Catholics are in the hospital. Please call the parish office to inform us of a Catholic in the hospital who needs to have a priest visit. Thank you!

FUNERAL MASSES:

Funeral Masses at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral are held on the designated day at 9:30AM. Please make arrangements with the Church office before the funeral home to assure availability of the date requested. The Funeral Program should read "Christian Burial" on the cover. If you would like a different time, please contact the parish priest. Viewings will not take place inside the cathedral. Funerals generally are not held on weekends (Saturday or Sunday). Thank you for your cooperation.

Meditación
por: Padre Joseph Nguele Toko**Vivamos en comunión y amemos como la Trinidad**

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo, Celebramos hoy en comunión con toda la Iglesia, la fiesta de la Santísima Trinidad, es decir, la fiesta de Dios Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. De hecho, creemos en un solo Dios que está en estas tres personas. Él es a quien llamamos cada vez que hacemos la señal de la cruz al comienzo de nuestra oración. Queremos decir que a quien queremos dirigirnos ahora es al Dios que es Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo, y no a ningún otro. En el mundo la gente cree en diferentes dioses. Cuando hablamos de Dios en el mundo, no siempre nos referimos a la misma persona. Por eso tenemos que tener cuidado y comenzar nuestra oración con la señal de la cruz para expresar claramente al Dios a quien llamamos y con quien queremos hablar. Si llamas a Dios, él vendrá a ti; Si llamas a otros dioses o a Satán o al Diablo, ellos también vendrán a ti. Tenemos que ser cuidadosos.

La fiesta de hoy nos revela quién es Dios. Descubrimos que Él es esencialmente relación y comunión. El Padre está en relación con el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo. Los tres están en relación unos con otros y al mismo tiempo en comunión unos con otros, es decir, en unión unos con otros. Son esencialmente relacionales y viven en perfecta unidad. Eso es lo que caracteriza a nuestro Dios, y que también debe caracterizarnos a nosotros, ya que estamos hechos a imagen y semejanza de Dios.

Como imagen de Dios, venimos al mundo en una relación trinitaria: el padre, la madre y el hijo. Los tres deben vivir siempre en relación unos con otros para ser realmente imagen y semejanza de la Trinidad que nos creó. De la misma manera, los tres deben vivir en comunión, es decir, en unidad unos con otros para parecerse a la Trinidad. Pero ¿podemos realmente decir que somos a imagen de la Trinidad? Cuando miramos a nuestras diversas familias, vemos que a veces ni siquiera reflejamos la Trinidad en su naturaleza relacional porque el padre y la madre no están en relación entre sí, o algunos hijos no están en relación con los padres. Cuando las cosas son así, no podemos decir que somos imagen y semejanza de Dios. De la misma manera, cuando no estamos en comunión o unión unos con otros, no podemos decir que somos imagen y semejanza de Dios. Es cuando miramos atrás en nuestras vidas que notamos que realmente no somos a imagen y semejanza de Dios y que todavía tenemos que hacer algún esfuerzo para poder ser a su imagen y semejanza.

NUESTRA IGLESIA Y NUESTRA ESCUELA SON AMBIENTES SEGUROS:

Todos estamos comprometidos con la protección de los niños en nuestras instituciones.

Si nota algún comportamiento nocivo hacia nuestros hijos, no dude en ponerte en contacto con nosotros lo antes posible. gracias.

Meditación continua

Más allá de los aspectos relacionales y de comunión que caracterizan a la Trinidad, está el AMOR. En verdad, lo más importante a tener presente acerca de la Trinidad, es el amor que une a las tres personas. El Padre ama al Hijo y al Espíritu Santo y viceversa. Como imagen de Dios, también debemos amarnos unos a otros para reflejar a Dios. Aquí nuevamente nos encontramos faltos porque como decía San Pablo a Romanos 8:14, somos hijos de Dios si "somos guiados por el Espíritu de Dios", pero lamentablemente no solemos dejarlos llevar por el Espíritu de Dios cada día y en toda circunstancia. Queremos confiar en nosotros mismos, en nuestra inteligencia, en nuestros medios y en nuestras relaciones, para decidir por nosotros mismos y hacer las cosas por nosotros mismos. Sin embargo, si permitimos que el Espíritu de Dios nos guíe, pensaremos y actuaremos por amor, haremos las cosas por amor para ser a semejanza de Dios.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo, en este día de la Trinidad, tratemos de ser a imagen y semejanza de nuestro Dios - Trinidad que es esencialmente relacional, comunión y AMOR. Que seamos también buenas personas relacionales que viven en comunión con los demás y manifiesten el amor de Dios a los demás. De esta manera, mereceríamos compartir la gloria de Dios en el cielo por los siglos de los siglos.
