



MEDITATION

RELFECTION FOR THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF **EASTER** BY FR. DOMINIC UKAGBA

Readings: Acts 6:1-7, Psalms 32 (33), 1Peter 2:4-9 Gospel: John .14:1-12

Theme: Be Generous With Your God Given Talents

This Sunday is also called, "CANTATE SUNDAY" or singing Sunday (Cantate Domino), derived from today's introit as is assigned for this day from the Roman Rite Missal.

We hear from the first reading of today (Acts .6:1-7), how the early Christians through the instrumentality of the Apostles, chose the seven Deacons who would be at the service of the table for the daily distribution of food, so that the Apostles would concentrate themselves to Prayer, and to the Ministration or the preaching of the Word of God. It gave the deacons the possibility of helping the Priests in the work of Evangelization, and making specification of duties and talents ,too. The lay Christians on their part bring their gifts and gather in support of the work of God, the Apostles inspired by the Holy Spirit, break and interpret the word of God to the people in an honest and sincere manner without distraction, and the deacons appointed, help to distribute the material need or welfare to the people in just distribution, and fairness, not in pride. Anyone who has the true spirit to work for God must be called, trained, prayed over, and sent, as we saw today in the first reading. Anyone who calls himself or herself is not of the sheepfold, and the fruit of his or her arrogant words and works will show such a person as not belonging to Christ. Through Baptism, all Christians are called to know and serve God in different capacities, and we must kind ,generous and truthful with such gifts, so as to win other souls to God ,not for us to be seen. God chooses and qualifies those he wants into His royal family (1Peter 2:4-9). And anyone who puts his trust in God shall never be disappointed. To the unbelievers, God chose the rejected stones by builders, but He makes them a corner stone to be agents of His Gospel message. The Apostles themselves were ordinary people of the society not really valued, but God chose them to be the earthenware of the Gospel treasures. See it to yourselves that you are called ,and seek God's face in all you demand He will count you among the royal priesthood of all the believing Christians.

MEDITATION (continued)

Do not be troubled by you sins of many years, God will forgive them when you truly asks for His mercy and pardon, now is a favorable time to trust God, there are still many rooms in His Father's Kingdom as He promised, and He has risen from the dead to go and prepare the place for anyone who may come to believe in His name and sincerely do His will. He, Jesus, is the only way to God the Father, no one can by-pass Him through other means to go to heaven, and that is one of the reasons why we must believe in Him and trust His works always, in all we do as Christians.(John 14:6.11-13).

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

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Baptisms are generally held on the last Sunday of the month. Requests for a different date and time will be honored to the extent possible. Parents and sponsors who have not yet received the required baptismal instruction are expected to do so by attending our baptismal preparation program. Call the parish office well in advance so that class arrangements can be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Anyone wishing to have his or her wedding celebrated at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral must contact the parish office 9-12 months prior to the celebration and talk to a priest for pre-wedding counseling. Please visit our website www.cathedralvi.org or call us at 340-774-0201. The Sacrament of Marriage is generally celebrated on a Saturday between the hours of 11:00AM and 2:00PM. Please contact the parish priest if you would like a different time for your wedding. (Note that Saturday mornings are reserved for cleaning and decorating the cathedral.)

FIVE STEPS TO HEAVEN ACCORDING TO SAINT THERESE OF LISIEUX

How to reach Heaven? For Thérèse of Lisieux, as the Church prepares to celebrate the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ on May 18.2023, there is nothing better than to take the "spiritual elevator" directly. Here are the five floors to climb.

In Thérèse of Lisieux, everything is finally a bit upside down. While the traditional vision of holiness is com-

pared to climbing a steep mountain, little Thérèse had the intuition to reach Heaven in the opposite way: instead of climbing the steps of the "rough staircase of perfection", she wants to take... the elevator. No wonder: it was in her time that the elevator appeared as a technological invention that made everyone dream:
"I want to look for a way to go to Heaven by a small, very straight, very short way, a small brand new way. We are in

a century of inventions, now it is no longer necessary to climb the stairs, in the homes of the rich an elevator replaces it advantageously. I would also like to find an elevator to lift me up to Jesus, because I am too small to climb the rough stairs of perfection.

Then I looked in the holy books for the indication of the elevator, object of my desire, and I read these words coming out of the mouth of the Eternal Wisdom: If someone is very small, let him come to me.

MEDITACIÓN

Lecturas: Hechos 6:1-7, Salmos 32(33), 1Pedro 2:4-9, Evangelio Juan: 14:1-12

Tema: Sed generosos con nuestro Dios

Este domingo también se llama 'CANTATE SUNDAY' o domingo cantando (Cantate Domino), derivado del introito de hoy, como se asigna para este día del Misal del Rito Romano. Escuchamos de la primera lectura de hoy (Hechos 6:1-7), cómo los primeros cristianos, a través de la instrumentalidad de los Apóstoles, eligieron a los siete diáconos que estarían al servicio de la mesa para la distribución diaria de alimentos, para que los Apóstoles se concentraran en la oración y en la ministración o la predicación de la Palabra de Dios. Dio a los diáconos la posibilidad de ayudar a los sacerdotes en la obra de evangelización, y también de especificar deberes y talentos. Los cristianos laicos por su parte traen sus dones y se reúnen en apoyo de la obra de Dios, los Apóstoles inspirados por el Espíritu Santo, quebrantan e interpretan la palabra de Dios a la gente de una manera honesta y sincera sin distracciones, y los diáconos nombrados, ayudan a distribuir la necesidad material o el bienestar a las personas en una distribución justa, y justicia, no en el orgullo. Cualquiera que tenga el verdadero espíritu para trabajar para Dios debe ser llamado, entrenado, orado y enviado, como vimos hoy en la primera lectura. Cualquiera que se llame a sí mismo no es del redil, y el fruto de sus palabras y obras arrogantes mostrará que tal persona no pertenece a Cristo. A través del Bautismo, todos los cristianos están llamados a conocer y servir a Dios en diferentes capacidades, y debemos ser amables, generosos y veraces con tales dones, para ganar otras almas para Dios, no para que seamos vistos. Dios escoge y califica a aquellos que quiere para su familia real (1 Pedro 2: 4-9).). Y cualquiera que ponga su confianza en Dios nunca será decepcionado. Para los incrédulos, Dios escogió las piedras rechazadas por los constructores, pero Él las convierte en una piedra angular para ser agentes de Su mensaje del Evangelio. Los apóstoles mismos eran personas comunes de la sociedad que no eran realmente valoradas, pero Dios los eligió para ser la loza de los tesoros del Evangelio.

Then I came, guessing that I had found what I was looking for and wanting to know, O my God! what you would do to the little one who would answer your call, I continued my search and here is what I found: - As a mother caressés her child, so I will comfort you, I will carry you on my breast and I will swing you on my knees! Ah! never have more tender, more melodious words come to rejoice my soul, the elevator which must raise me to Heaven, they are your arms, O Jesus! (History of a soul,

THE FIVE FLIGHTS OF STARIRS TO HEAVEN Therese has this intuition that despite her smallness, she can aspire to holiness by taking the elevator which are the arms of Jesus. This is how she discovered her to reach Heaven. As Jacques Gauthier explains in his article for Aleteia, Thérèse found her joy in "letting herself be carried by her God. Her only merit is... not to have any," he writes. So, in concrete terms, how can we follow her? By

taking the five floors of her "spiritual elevator": FLOOR 1 HAVING THE SPIRIT OF CHILD-

Thérèse understood: to go to Heaven, we must become like children. But beware, her "little way" of spiritual childhood is anything but infantilism! It is a matter of cultivating a childlike spirit, that is to say, desiring the greatest things, but relying entirely on God. It is finally throwing oneself into his arms as a child throws himself into his mother's arms. God is for Therese the first, last and only recourse.

FLOOR 2 TRUSTING BLINDLY IN THE FA-

"I have always found, when I have compared myself to the saints, that there is between them and me the same difference that exists between a mountain that is lost in the heavens and a dark grain of sand trodden under the feet of passers-by," she writes. But instead of being discouraged, little Thérèse knew how to achieve holiness: by not letting go of the Father.

Paradoxically, as she grew up, it was not a question of taking on independence, but of trusting blindly in God and expecting everything (and without complexes) from God. The more we surrender to him, the more we open ourselves to his love and the more we climb towards

FLOOR 3 WELCOME WHAT HE COMES

Therese grasped it. She was introduced by her sister Mary to the value of small things - those that seem to have no value - to the real price they have when done with fidelity and love. For the Carmelite, it is through them and in the present moment that one can climb even higher to reach Heaven. How can this be done? One must "do ordinary things in an extraordinary way," she advises.

FLOOR 4 CHOOSE TO STAY SMALL

Do not want to be great - not a great mystic, not a great saint, not someone who raises the dead, casts out spirits, evangelizes, etc. For Teresa, pride can be hidden in any desire for greatness. For her, the key is to be like a "little nothing". It is not easy to reach this level, because to remain small and to be more and more small is not an invitation to childishness or passivity. It is to rely on one's weakness to bear witness to the love of God! It is to let oneself be loved freely in humility! Finally, through this assumed weakness, it is to offer oneself fully to God.

FLOOR 5 TASTE THE MERCY OF GOD

Thérèse understood it well: it is the refusal of his mercy that hurts Jesus the most. The key is not to do much, but to love much. Through her "little way", Therese shows the true face of God: a face of goodness, tenderness and mercy. "I assure you that the good God is much better than you think. He is content with a look, with a sigh of love... For me, I find perfection very easy to practice, because I have understood that there is only need to take Jesus by the heart..." (LT 191) According to Teresa, in order to ascend to Heaven, it is a matter of staking everything on divine mercy and replacing the image of the vigilant God with the image of a merciful God who is only "love and mercy!" (LT 266)

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
