**MEDITATION**

“The work of the spirit cannot be confined by anyone.”

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today’s liturgy, we see that Jesus continues to use the same methodology like the previous Sundays to teach his disciples. He seizes the opportunity of their mistakes to make corrections and to teach. A keen look at them will help us see our own mistakes and understand the mind of Christ and his teaching. Firstly, we would ask ourselves what error warranted Christ’s correction?

“Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us.” This is John speaking to Jesus. He thought Jesus would praise him for doing that, but to his greater surprise, he noticed that Jesus was not for him. This makes us think of today’s first reading from the Book of Numbers which tells us a similar story. In fact, Eldad and Medad are two elders who were left in the camp and were not in the gathering; and yet they also received the spirit and were able to prophesy in the camp, just like the sixty-eight elders who were at the gathering with Moses and on whom the spirit came to rest. When a young man noticed this, he went quickly to Moses to tell him: “Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.” This was an indirect complaint. Another young man by name Joshua who was Moses’ aide said : “Moses, my lord, stop them!” But we are told that Moses answered them: “ are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets! Would that the Lord might bestow his spirit on them all!”

The above two stories show that man is often jealous of his brother or sister unnecessarily, simply because he does not want to see him or her do the same things, have the same qualities, the same strength, the same or more graces from God. As we saw last Sunday, man has a natural tendency to dominate others, to feel greater than others. That is why he wants to have what others do not have.

**Meditation** (continued)

He seeks to be the only one to have or to do certain things. These are the types of attitude that Jesus does not want from his people. That is why he said in response to John who wanted to prevent the man who was driving out demons in his name: “Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me.” That is the correction Jesus makes. At his place would we have done the same? I wonder! Our society is becoming more and more permissive because we do not correct and teach our children, nor each other. We may ask the question: What else did Jesus teach?

“Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin cut it off. It is better for you to enter life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna ... If your foot causes you to sin, cut it off ...” (Mk 9:45-48) Two great teachings emerge from these words. Firstly, we should never be the cause of the spiritual downfall of anyone. In other words, we should never lead someone either actively or passively to sin, to do what is against God’s commandment or will. Unfortunately, we are many who do so. Because we do not go to Church, we prevent others from going by subtle means. Because we do not get on well with somebody, we don’t want our children or our friends to move with him or her. This type of attitude is not Christian.

The second cause of sin may not be somebody else, but us. In this case we should be able to identify the real cause of our sin in us and remove it. This demands some discernment to identify that cause, some humility to admit and regret it, and some courage to remove it or cut it off. This radical change is not easy because of our habits which have become second nature, and which give us some pleasures at times, and yet , it is necessary because as Jesus said, “ it is better ... to enter into life maimed or crippled than with two hands (or two feet) to go into Gehenna.” (Mk9:43-45) Each of us knows what are the things that easily lead him or her to sin. Let us ask God to grant us the grace to be able to cut them off from our lives in order not to be candidates for Gehenna.

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:**

**Meditación**

**“La obra del espíritu no puede ser limitada por nadie.”**

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

En la liturgia de hoy, vemos que Jesús sigue utilizando la misma metodología que los domingos anteriores para enseñar a sus discípulos. Aprovecha la oportunidad de sus errores para hacer correcciones y enseñar. Una mirada atenta a ellos nos ayudará a ver nuestros propios errores y entender la mente de Cristo y su enseñanza. En primer lugar, nos preguntamos qué error justificó la corrección de Cristo.

“Maestro, vimos a alguien que expulsaba demonios en tu nombre, y tratamos de impedirlo porque no nos sigue”. Este es Juan hablando a Jesús. Pensó que Jesús lo elogiaría por hacer eso, pero para su mayor sorpresa, se dio cuenta de que Jesús no estaba de su lado. Esto nos hace pensar en la primera lectura de hoy del Libro de los Números que nos cuenta una historia similar. De hecho, Eldad y Medad son dos ancianos que se quedaron en el campamento y no estaban en la reunión; y sin embargo, también ellos recibieron el espíritu y pudieron profetizar en el campamento, al igual que los sesenta y ocho ancianos que estaban en la reunión con Moisés y sobre los cuales reposó el espíritu. Cuando un joven se dio cuenta de esto, fue rápidamente a Moisés para decirle: “Eldad y Medad están profetizando en el campamento”. Esta era una queja indirecta. Otro joven llamado Josué que era ayudante de Moisés dijo: “¡Moisés, mi señor, deténlos!” Pero se nos dice que Moisés les respondió: “¿Están celosos por mí? ¡Ojalá que todo el pueblo del Señor fuera profeta! ¡Ojalá que el Señor les diera su espíritu a todos!”

Las dos historias anteriores muestran que el hombre a menudo tiene celos de su hermano o hermana innecesariamente, simplemente porque no quiere verlo hacer las mismas cosas, tener las mismas cualidades, la misma fuerza, las mismas o más gracias de Dios. Como vimos el domingo pasado, el hombre tiene una tendencia natural a dominar a los demás, a sentirse superior a los demás. Por eso quiere tener lo que los demás no tienen. Él busca ser el único en tener o hacer ciertas cosas. Estos son los tipos de actitudes que Jesús no quiere de su pueblo. Por eso, le dijo en respuesta a Juan que quería impedir que el hombre que expulsaba demonios en su nombre lo hiciera: “No se lo impidáis. No hay nadie que haga un milagro en mi nombre que pueda al mismo tiempo hablar mal de mí”. Esa es la corrección que hace Jesús. ¿En su lugar habríamos hecho lo mismo? ¡Me pregunto! Nuestra sociedad se está volviendo cada vez más permisiva porque no corregimos ni enseñamos a nuestros hijos, ni a los demás. Podemos preguntarnos: ¿Qué más enseñó Jesús?

**meditación continua**

“A cualquiera que haga pecar a uno de estos pequeños que creen en mí, mejor le sería si le pusieran una gran piedra de molino alrededor del cuello y lo arrojaran al mar. Si tu mano te hace pecar, córtala. “Es mejor para ti entrar en la vida manco que ir con dos manos a la Gehena... Si tu pie te es ocasión de caer, córtalo...” (Mc 9,45-48) De estas palabras se desprenden dos grandes enseñanzas. En primer lugar, nunca debemos ser causa de la caída espiritual de nadie. En otras palabras, nunca debemos llevar a nadie, ni activa ni pasivamente, a pecar, a hacer lo que está en contra del mandamiento o de la voluntad de Dios. Desgraciadamente, somos muchos los que lo hacemos. Como no vamos a la Iglesia, impedimos que otros vayan por medios sutiles. Como no nos llevamos bien con alguien, no queremos que nuestros hijos o nuestros amigos se muden con él o ella. Este tipo de actitud no es cristiana. La segunda causa del pecado puede no ser otra persona, sino nosotros mismos. En este caso deberíamos ser capaces de identificar la causa real de nuestro pecado en nosotros y eliminarla. Esto exige un poco de discernimiento para identificar esa causa, un poco de humildad para admitirlo y arrepentirse, y un poco de valor para eliminarlo o cortarlo. Este cambio radical no es fácil por nuestros hábitos que se han convertido en una segunda naturaleza y que nos dan placer a veces, y sin embargo, es necesario porque como dijo Jesús, “es mejor... entrar en la vida manco o cojo que con dos manos (o dos pies) ir a la Gehena” (Mc 9,43-45). Cada uno de nosotros sabe cuáles son las cosas que lo llevan fácilmente a pecar. Pidamos a Dios que nos conceda la gracia de poder cortarlas de nuestra vida para no ser candidatos a la Gehena.
