Third Sunday of Easter

First Reading: Acts 2: 14, 22-23

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 16: 1-2, 5, 7-11

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1: 17-21

Gospel: Luke 24: 13-35

MEDITATION

All priests and religious throughout the world pray the Liturgy of the Hours each day. The second reading from this Sunday's Office of Readings, a part of the Liturgy of the Hours, is the following passage from St. Justin Martyr who lived from 100AD – 164 ÅD. It is a detailed explanation of the Mass from the early Church at that time. This is a good reflection for us because it shows how similar the Mass we celebrate today is to that of the early Church. Additionally, it offers insight into the significance of the breaking of the bread in the Road to Emmaus Gospel reading this Sunday.

From the first apology in defense of the Christians by Saint Justin Martyr The celebration of the Eucharist

No one may share the Eucharist with us unless he believes that what we teach is true, unless he is washed in the regenerating waters of baptism for the remission of his sins, and unless he lives in accordance with the principles given us by Christ. We do not consume the eucharistic bread and wine as if it were ordinary food and drink, for we have been taught that as Jesus Christ our Savior became a man of flesh and blood by the power of the Word of God, so also the food that our flesh and blood assimilates for its nourishment becomes the flesh and blood of the incarnate Jesus by the power of his own words contained in the prayer of thanksgiving.

The apostles, in their recollections, which are called gospels, handed down to us what Jesus commanded them to do. They tell us that he took bread, gave thanks and said: Do this in memory of me. This is my body. In the same way he took the cup, he gave thanks and said: This is my blood. The Lord gave this command to them alone. Ever since then we have constantly reminded one another of these things. The rich among us help the poor and we are always united. For all that we receive we praise the Creator of the universe through his Son Jesus Christ and through the Holy Spirit.

On Sunday we have a common assembly of all our members, whether they live in the city or the outlying districts. The recollections of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read, as long as there is time. When the reader has finished, the president of the assembly speaks to us; he urges everyone to imitate the examples of virtue we have heard in the readings. Then we all stand up together and pray.

On the conclusion of our prayer, bread and wine and water are brought forward. The president offers prayers and gives thanks to the best of his ability, and the people give assent by saying, "Amen." The eucharist is distributed, everyone present communicates, and the deacons take it to those who are absent.

The wealthy, if they wish, may make a contribution, and they themselves decide the amount. The collection is placed in the custody of the president, who uses it to help the orphans and widows and all who for any reason are in distress, whether because they are sick, in prison, or away from home. In a word, he takes care of all who are in need. We hold our common assembly on Sunday because it is the first day of the week, the day on which God put darkness and chaos to flight and created the world, and because on that same day our savior Jesus Christ rose from the dead. For he was crucified on Friday and on Sunday he appeared to his apostles and disciples and taught them the things that we have passed on for your



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Parents and sponsors who have not yet received the required baptismal instruction are expected to do so by attending our baptismal preparation program. Call the parish office well in advance so that class arrangements can be made.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Anyone wishing to have his or her wedding celebrated at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral must contact the parish office 9-12 months prior to the celebration and talk to a priest for pre-wedding counseling. CATECHESIS

WHAT IS MORTAL SIN?

If we define sin as an offense committed against God, why do we speak of mortal sin? If God is love, why does sin cause death and what kind of death is it?

"It is well known what the flesh does: misconduct, impurity, debauchery, idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, rivalry, jealousy, anger, intrigues, divisions, sectarianism, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I have warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God," St. Paul harangues in his letter to the Galatians (Gal 5:19-21). In The City of God, St. Augustine goes so far as to define sin as "love of self to the point of contempt for God," as opposed to charity, "love of God to the point of contempt for self. In its Catechism (CCC §1849), the Church characterizes sin as "a failure to show true love for God and neighbor" and distinguishes between "venial" sin, from the Latin venialis, that is, "forgivable" sin, and "mortal" sin, which cuts off love for God completely.

Tercer Domingo de Pascua

Primera lectura: Hechos 2: 14, 22-23 Salmo responsorial: Salmo 16: 1-2, 5, 7-11 Segunda lectura: 1 Pedro 1:17-21 Evangelio: Lucas 24: 13-35

MEDITACIÓN

Todos los sacerdotes y religiosos de todo el mundo rezan la Liturgia de las Horas cada día. La segunda lectura del Oficio de Lecturas de este domingo, una parte de la Liturgia de las Horas, es el siguiente pasaje de San Justino Mártir que vivió desde 100 dC hasta 164 dC. És una explicación detallada de la Misa de la Iglesia primitiva en ese momento. Esta es una buena reflexión para nosotros porque muestra cuán similar es la Misa que celebramos hoy a la de la Iglesia primitiva. Apartir de entonces, ofrece una visión del significado de la fracción del pan en la lectura del Evangelio Camino a Emaús este domingo.

De la primera disculpa en defensa de los cristianos por San Justino Mártir La celebración de la Eucaristía

Nadie puede compartir la Eucaristía con nosotros a menos que crea que lo que enseñamos es verdad, a menos que sea lavado en las aguas regeneradoras del bautismo para la remisión de sus pecados, y a menos que viva de acuerdo con los principios dados por Cristo. No consumimos el pan y el vino eucarísticos como si fuera comida y bebida ordinaria, porque se nos ha enseñado que así como Jesucristo nuestro Salvador se hizo hombre de carne y hueso por el poder de la Palabra de Dios, así también el alimento que nuestra carne y sangre asimilan para su alimento se convierte en la carne y la sangre del Jesús encarnado por el poder de sus propias palabras contenidas en el Oración de acción de gracias.

Los apóstoles, en sus recuerdos, que se llaman evangelios, nos transmitieron lo que Jesús les ordenó que hicieran. Nos dicen que tomó pan, dio gracias y dijo: Haced esto en memoria mía. Este es mi cuerpo. De la misma manera que tomó la copa, dio gracias y dijo: Esta es mi sangre. El Señor les dio este mandamiento a ellos solamente. Desde entonces nos hemos recordado constantemente estas cosas. Los ricos entre nosotros ayudan a los pobres y siempre estamos unidos. Por todo lo que recibimos alabamos al Creador del universo a través de su Hijo Jesucristo y por el Espíritu Santo.

El domingo tenemos una asamblea común de todos nuestros miembros, va sea que vivan en la ciudad o en los distritos periféricos. Los recuerdos de los apóstoles o los escritos de los profetas se leen, siempre que haya tiempo. Cuando el lector ha terminado, el presidente de la asamblea nos habla; Insta a todos a imitar los ejemplos de virtud que hemos escuchado en las lecturas. Entonces todos nos levantamos juntos y oramos.

Al concluir nuestra oración, el pan, el vino y el agua se adelantan. El presidente ofrece oraciones y da gracias lo mejor que puede, y la gente da su consentimiento diciendo:

NUESTRA IGLESIA Y NUESTRA **ESCUELA SON AMBIENTES SEGUROS:**

Todos estamos comprometidos con la protección de los niños en nuestras instituciones. Si nota algún comportamiento nocivo hacia nuestros hijos, no dude en ponerse en contacto con nosotros lo antes posible. Gracias.

"Amén". La eucaristía se distribuye, todos los presentes se comunican y los diáconos la llevan a los ausentes.

Los ricos, si lo desean, pueden hacer una contribución, y ellos mismos deciden la cantidad. La colección se pone bajo la custodia del presidente, quien la utiliza para ayudar a los huérfanos y viudas y a todos los que por cualquier razón están en apuros, ya sea porque están enfermos, en prisión o lejos de casa. Distinguishing the forms of sin

The distinction of sins according to their gravity is already present in Scripture, when Saint John invites "if someone sees his brother commit a sin that does not lead to death" to pray so that "God may give him life" and specifies that "there is a sin that leads to death, but it is not for this one that I say to pray. All unrighteous conduct is sin, but not all sin leads to death" (1 In 5:16-17). Thus, if "mortal sin destroys charity in the heart of man by a grave infraction of God's law [and] turns man away from God, who is his ultimate end and beatitude, preferring to Him an inferior good, venial sin allows charity to subsist, even if it offends and wounds it" (CCC §1855).

Three conditions make the fault fall on the side of mortal sin: it must have as its object "a serious matter"; it must be "committed in full awareness" and it must be "deliberate", as Saint John Paul II states in his apostolic exhortation Reconciliatio et paenitentia. The "serious matter" is announced in the Old Testament, when God dictates the Decalogue to Moses (Ex 20:1-18) and is then taken up by Christ Himself in the face of the rich young man: "You shall not commit murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness. Honor thy father and thy mother. And also: Love your neighbor as yourself. (Mt 19:18-19).

This is the very image of the disobedience of Adam and Eve, whose acceptance of the fruit presented by the serpent in spite of the divine prohibition consists of an entirely free personal act. Indeed, the human being is not a malleable toy subjected to the Evil One who manipulates him and forces him to turn away from God: when we sin, we freely consent to temptation, like Adam and Eve who reached out their hand to eat the fruit that the serpent offered them in the garden. Let us not be discouraged, St. Paul himself lamented: "I do not do the good I would like to do, but I commit the evil I would not like to do" (Rom 7:19).

By refusing a reconciliation with God, that is to say a return to grace which requires the renunciation of this situation, man makes choices in complete freedom which commit his whole life, here below and at the moment of his death. How can we imagine that someone who has deliberately rejected God all his life can choose to plunge entirely into His love, in His presence, on the day of the encounter? As St. Augustine continues, "As a deserter of eternal life, he was condemned to an equally eternal death, unless he was freed by grace" (Cit. XIV, XV). It is therefore the sinner who condemns himself.

The Council of Trent reminded us, however, that while it is an inexhaustible grace, the absolution offered at confession is not a subterfuge for sinning with impunity (Catechism of the Council of Trent, 11 (IV):

The faithful must be warned that such a great facility for forgiveness, so extensive in terms of faults, and so unlimited in terms of time, should not make them freer to indulge in sin, nor slower to repent. In the first case they would obviously be convinced of an insulting contempt for this Divine Power, and consequently they would be unworthy of God's Mercy. In the second case there would be great fear that they would be surprised by death.
