





DOCTRINE CORNER

UNDERSTANDING THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE AND RECONCILIATION

Introduction: After my homily on Sunday 3rd Sunday of Lent (March 20th 2002), it became clear to me that many persons do not use this sacrament because they do not understand it and are confused with the protestant concept of confessing directly to God and not by the instrumentality of the Priest. We wish therefore during the remaining weeks of Lent, to bring to your understanding what this sacrament is all about; why this sacrament, its effects and its celebration.

The various names of the Sacrament: Taking the importance and centrality of this sacrament in the Christian pilgrimage of faith it has many names which in themselves designate clearly what this sacrament stands for. 1. Sacrament of Conversion: it makes present through an outward sign — which is the absolution of the priest Jesus' call to repentance as the first step in returning to the Father from whom one has strayed by sin; 2. Sacrament of Penance: Penance is the work you do to show your sorrow and compensate for the lack caused by your sin when you confess your sins;3. Sacrament of Confession: This is the disclosure of your sins to a priest which is the essential element of this sacrament. 4. Sacrament of Forgiveness: When the Priest absolves the person who comes to confession God grants him or her pardon and peace; 5. Sacrament of Reconciliation: the person who comes to confession becomes again one with God, with the Church and with his or her neighbour since Sin brought a rupture in this love relationship.

Why do we have a Sacrament of Reconciliation after Baptism? In Baptism we are made holy and the new life Christ won for us by his suffering, death and resurrection is in us. When we commit a mortal sin (a sin that we know and will to do) we are excluded from this new life. To have this new life we need this sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. As long as we are in this world, we are always in need of this Sacrament because our nature is stained by the Original Sin of Adam and Eve, and despite our redemption in Christ we always have the tendency to turn to sin. This inclination to sin is called concupiscence. This is the struggle of conversion directed towards holiness and eternal life to which the Lord never ceases to call us. Jesus' call to conversion is an essential part of his proclamation of the Kingdom of God. Baptism is the principal place for the first and fundamental conversion. This call to conversion continues to be made in the lives of the Christians as they continue their pilgrimage of faith in this world. The second conversion is an uninterrupted task for the whole Church who "clasping sinners to her bosom, is at one holy and always in need of purification and follows constantly the path of penance and renewal. St. Peter's conversion after he had denied his master three times bears witness to this. This is the conversion that is sought through this sacrament. This second conversion also has a community dimension, as it is clear in the Lord's call to the whole Church to Repent.

This call aims at the conversion of the heart, interior conversion – which urges expression in visible signs, gestures and works of penance. It entails the desire and resolution to change one's life, with hope in God's mercy and trust in the help of his grace. It is accompanied by salutary pain and sadness; the affliction of the spirit (animi cruciatus) and repentance of heart (compunction Cordis).

Conversion first of all is the work of the grace of God who makes our hearts return to him and ours is just to response to this grace already present in us. It is in discovering the greatness of God's love that our hearts are shaken by the horror and weight of sin and begins to fear offending God by sin and being separated from him. The human heart is converted by looking upon him whom our sins have pierced – Jesus Christ the only Son God. (To be continued)
