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Preparing Your Home for Market

DISASSOCIATE YOURSELF FROM THE PROPERTY This is one of the hardest obstacles to overcome. Think of your home as a product to be marketed.
DE-PERSONALIZE Take personal pictures down; pack up personal items that may be potentially controversial or politically/morally/socially unacceptable, collectibles, trophies, awards, & framed certificates.
DE-CLUTTER Remove everything from the kitchen & bathroom counters, tubs/showers; also remove everything from the front & sides of the refrigerator. Less is more.
<i>PAINT NEUTRAL COLORS</i> Not everyone can see past bold colors. Repair & caulk trim, doors, & windows. If possible, remove any popcorn ceilings.
REARRANGE CLOSETS & CABINETS Thin out clothes, shoes, & towels to show maximum storage (i.e.: nothing stacked on the floor).
RENT A STORAGE UNIT If possible, put extra furniture & items into storage.
STAGE YOUR HOME This is extremely important to aid in the marketing of your home. Updated lighting & higher wattage bulbs will make the house more cheery & bright.
MAKE EVERYTHING SPARKLE It's time to cleancarpets, porches, laundry rooms, garages, ovens, tile & grout, & windows etc.
CONCEAL THE CRITTERS Remove all pet odors, litter boxes, pet hair, & toys. Have an action plan for removing pets during showings (not every potential buyer is a dog or cat lover).
STEP BACK & LOOK WITH NEW EYES Ask yourself, or better yet, your friends and/or family if there is anything that they see could improve your homes marketability.
