If she doesn't get her audience laughing within five minutes of her lecture, something is wrong. Arlene also has a passion for history but not the dry facts kind. She likes the intimate information of what women were doing during the early decades of our country. While we know the general history, we can also appreciate the day-today events of our lady ancestors.

Arlene's focus on guilting moves through the eras of the Revolutionary War, to the Great Depression. She has a collection of antique and vintage quilts that she uses to illustrate her lectures. Soon she will be a published author.



Fee: \$600 for a 6 hour class and \$350 for a 3 hour class. Travel fee is \$0.535 per mile

I am available for both Zoom and in person classes. A Six hour class can be split into two days if that is more convenient. I can accommodate up to 25 students in a class.

I am a proponent of the "Slow Stitch Movement" and love to do handwork. My aim is to remind guilters of the joy of handwork. Sometimes we get so caught up with trying to make so many patterns and projects that we forget how much we enjoy just getting a needle and thread in our hands and create using only our hands and minds. These workshops will remind you of those times. This is my Slow Stitching journey.

WORKSHOPS AVAILBLE:

BIG STITCH HAND QUILTING. In this class, you will be introduced to the basics of Big Stitch hand quilting, the materials needed, how to baste, how to tie and set a knot, and the modified rocking stitch used for Big Stitch quilting. Also, I will cover variations of the rocking stitch, how to mark your quilt, and we will have a practice session. Throughout the class, we will talk about how Big Stitch hand quilting can be incorporated into your quilting design or used to highlight your quilt top. Pattie will also show the many examples she used in her own quilts. No hand quilting experience needed, you'll learn everything you need in this class. This is a 6 hour class. Fee: \$600 plus \$10 fee per student required for a premarked top.

HAND QUILTING IS NOT A FORGOTTEN ART. It is a fast, easy, and relaxing way to embellish a quilt and can be combined with machine guilting to accent a guilt in many ways. You will be introduced to the basics of hand guilting, the materials needed, how to baste, how to tie and set a knot, and the rocking stitch. The skills I teach in the Big Stitch Hand Quilting class are also taught in this class with an emphasis on traditional hand quilting. This is a 6 hour class. Fee: \$600.00 and \$10 fee per student required for a premarked top

BEGINNING SASHIKO: Learn to do the traditional and beautiful Japanese art of Sashiko. This is a functional embroidery that started as a practical mending stitch for textiles and became an art into itself. Learn the running stitch technique and how to use the patterns, threads and supplies used by Japanese stitchers. We will start on a set of 3 coasters that use the basic patterns that can be adapted to decorate garments, quilts, or decorative projects for the home. We will do the stitching in class and Pattie will give you instructions to follow so you can finish the project at home. This is a 3 hour class with a \$15.00 kit fee payable to the teacher.

VISIBLE MENDING THE BORO WAY: This is the companion workshop to my Visible Mending the Boro Way lecture. Thread bare jeans, a hole in your favorite jacket, a worn spot in your tote bag, all these can be the springboard for creativity. Mend your garments and accessories with simple embroidery and Sashiko stitches. Learn to do inside and outside applique along with other darning techniques using the running stitch, buttonhole stitch, and simple Sashiko stitches. This can be a 3 hour or 6 hour class. The 6 hour class will include making 3 beginning Sashiko patches and requires a \$15.00 kit fee payable to the teacher.

MAKE A JAPANESE RICE BAG, KOMEBUKURO: This simple bag has been used for centuries to carry rice from the market to the table. Anyone with basic sewing skills can learn to make one. The first part of the class will concentrate on tracing some traditional Sashiko patterns and embellishing them with Sashiko stitching. In the second part we will sew together the outside of the bag, the lining and the tabs to thread with rope handles. This can be done by hand or by machine. If you are new to Sashiko or need a brush up in your skills, Pattie will go over the stitches for you and will teach you how to trace and stitch the Sashiko pattern. This is a 6 hour class and the patterns are included.

JAPANESE HAND CLOTHS, HANA FUKIN: In Japan you will not see napkins in restaurants nor paper towels in restrooms. Japanese carry around a Hana Fukin, a small cloth used for this. Learn to make a traditional hand cloth and decorate it with simple Sashiko stitches to create a flower and fan design. If you have basic sewing skills, you will be able to stitch this easy and useful item. This is a 3 hour class and requires a \$15.00 kit fee payable to the teacher.



I teach free motion quilting on a domestic machine. I offer both process and project classes: intro to free motion quilting, various types of fills classes, feathers, ruler work, grids, garment and home décor projects, and a fun project using sheer fabric.

My classes are encouraging and light hearted and I use tech gear so that every student can see exactly what I am doing. I love to teach and inspire students to find their own way to joyful and confident free motion guilting.

I also offer 4 lectures. I am in the Roseville/Folsom area and I am happy to teach and lecture online or in person. All of my class and lecture offerings and pricing are available on my website: quiltskipper.com.

Jenny is a fiber artist, author and teacher. Her work focuses on free motion guilting on whole cloth and has juried into international guilt shows, art shows and galleries. Jenny teaches and lectures on free motion guilting wherever she is invited. She claims the title "Encourager-in-Chief" as she believes that every quilter has the skills to free motion guilt some of their own work. She lives in northern California with her husband and Australian Shepherdess. Her boys have left the nest and she now has a fine 2-room studio.

Life With a Border **Around It**

In this lecture, I share a very eclectic collection of quilts. I start with some quilts from my great grandmother, grandmother, and mom, and then move on to my own guilting and designing journey. As I share my quilts, I also share stories about the guilts or stories that inspired the quilts. If I can teach you something or make you smile, all the better. And don't be surprised if I throw in a song or two.



This workshop is a little different in that you don't need to bring your sewing machine (unless you want to) and there isn't a project you need to finish. I teach a variety of techniques for using DeColourant on fabric and demonstrate how to use all the different tools I have acquired. I then let you play with my toys and give you any assistance you might need or want for the rest of the workshop.

I provide all the DeColourant you need during the workshop, and send you home with a small container at the end.

Taking Out the Dye



Notan Design

Notan in Japanese means light dark harmony. The technique taught in this workshop is based on a version of Notan involving cut paper. We'll be using the same technique, only with fabric. After the initial instruction, participants will experiment first with paper, and then with fabric to create Notan designs. Participants can choose whether to just play making blocks, or to choose a pattern and create a small quilt using blocks they have made. This works really well with fabrics that basically look the same on both sides like batiks; however it can be done with fabrics that have a right side and a wrong side.



You just Cut-Sew-Square Up, Oh , and did I mention, no pins are used to sew your curves. There are many patterns to choose from, or you can choose one of the free patterns. I love to see quilters go outside the box and try new things.

I also offer programs for guilds, Here are the three that I have, This is Me and My Quilts, I Love a Challenge and Sew Many Curves. I am happy to work with you to find the right fit for your group, whether you are small or large guild.

Class Description

- This class is perfect for beginner quilters as well as more advanced students interested in learning this raw-edge applique technique.
