The display set-up has all been co-

On Sunday at the end of the show the "Take-down" team arrives and repackages all the quilts and returns them to the pick-up locations or by mail.

We at NCQC would like to continue to encourage the guilds to participate in this rewarding activity. The event is an opportunity to showcase the talent in our guilds. It is also an opportunity for Northern California quilters to enter a contest with affordability and ease. Begin planning which quilt you will enter next year and come to see them October 17th to the 20th. Enjoy the show we have prepared for you this year.
