




Steps - Preliminary


- Decide on the type of book
- Pick a publisher
 - IngramSpark
 - Print on Demand
- Select a topic





Steps – The Quilts

- Solicit quilts
- Write text that goes with the quilts
 - Used at least one quilt by every member who submitted a quilt.
 - Solicit or make quilts to fill in needs.

- Get permissions
 - From Members
 - From Designers


We gave away 23 books to designers.





Steps - Photograph


• Photograph quilts with high resolution.

We gave away 9 books for marketing.

Results - \$3,414 so far

From October 2020 – June 2021


- * 125 books sold to members/friends
- * 363 books sold online (Amazon/B&N)
- * 8 books sold through stores
- * 32 books given out free (designers, marketing)

Net income = \$2,630

From June 2021 – December 2022

- * 21 books sold at craft fairs
- * 31 books sold through online vendors
- * 23 books sold through stores/shows
- * 1 book donated

Net income = \$784
