
The Uncirculated 2022-W American Eagle silver dollar is scheduled for a noon Eastern Time June 1 release.

The product, at \$67 per coin, is listed on the Mint's website as having no product or mintage limit or household ordering restrictions.

The Uncirculated 2022-W American Eagle silver dollar, which is one of the Mint's product options listed for advance ordering through enrollment, is posted as "Currently Unavailable" on the enrollment page online here.

"Currently Unavailable," according to the website, means "We are currently out of this item, but more may be available later. If you provide your email address or cell number using the 'REMIND ME' button, you will receive any back-in-stock messages we send related to this product."

WHAT'S OLD IS NEWS

One Year Type Coins

One year type coins are always popular with collectors and usually priced accordingly. Some well known one year type coins are 1859 Indian Head cent w/o shield, 1853 Seated Quarter & Half Dollar with arrows and rays, 1866/67 Shield Nickel with rays. Mintages are not low by any means, but demand keeps the price much higher than would otherwise be. One surprising bargain is the 1883 no cents Liberty Head Nickel with many available for \$20 in AU. It was notoriously known as the Racketeer nickel, plated with gold and passed as \$5.

Strike Doubles

In the world of varieties and errors the Double Die takes on an almost legendary status. The famous 1955 Lincoln cent double die can sell for well over \$1500.00. Such large premiums can make for frenzied excitement and sometime bad judgment on the part of the unwary collector.

A confusing and common doubling is STRIKE DOUBLING. Sometimes called Machine Doubling a strike double is not a double die as the die is not doubled. The doubling occurs in the strike process. It's a simple matter of a few loose screws in the stamping equipment causing the die to shift slightly as the die come together with the planchet.

This shifting drags metal with it causing a flat shelf like appearance in the devices. True double dies will be more rounded and there maybe a split in the serifs. Strike doubles are common and should not demand a premium.

The Silver Lining

What's up with the economy? The Ukraine war, Covid, Supply Chain shortages, Gas Price crisis, Inflation and lay-offs have some people nervous. Economic uncertainty has gold up over \$1850 again. For most the bumps in the road will not have any effect on their wallet. For others that will not be the case. The coin market has been hot for a year now. Key issues setting record prices and new mint products coming out all the time have kept collector and investor interest up.

For some time dealers have been complaining that choice rare coins have been absent from the market. The price of gold and the questionable economic environment could bring those sought after items out of investor/collector safe deposit boxes and back into the market.

Pawcatuck Valley Coin Club Elections

According to our Bylaws, nominations for Elections are carried out in May and Elections are held in June of that calendar year.

Section B - Elections

Nominations shall take place at the May general meeting. Nominees running unopposed may be elected by acclamation. Should there be two or more nominees for an office or offices, elections shall be held by written ballot. Ballots shall be provided within one week of nominations. Ballots may be silent vote by paper or by show of hands. If mailed, ballot shall specify date by which it must be returned. Any ballot postmarked after the specified date shall not be counted. Voting and results will commence and will be announced at the June meeting.

<u>Section C - Voting Eligibility & Procedures</u>

All dues paying members are eligible to vote. In addition to electing officers, members shall be entitled to vote for other club business at board's discretion. A simple majority shall constitute a binding resolution, except as noted elsewhere in these by-laws.


