Topic: American Slavery & The Liberty Cap Date: January 11 Presented by Jeff Pritchard

The Liberty Cap has been an enduring image on U.S. coinage since the 1790s and appears on some of our most popularly collected U.S. coins. Originally the symbol of manumission (slaveholders freeing slaves) this presentation examines three historical numismatic vignettes in which the intersection of the Liberty Cap with American slavery is poignant, thought-provoking, and at times, tragically ironic. Jeff Pritchard is a lifelong numismatist and retired financial planner. He has authored numerous articles and books on both personal finance and numismatics. Most recent articles have appeared in *The Gobrecht Journal* and the *CPG Coin & Currency Market Review*. Jeff has done prior presentations for NumismaTalks, as well as for Newman Numismatic Symposiums. He is a member of the American Numismatic Society, American Numismatic Association, Liberty Seated Collectors Club, Pacific Coast Numismatic Society, and the Seattle Coin Club.
