July Webinars:

Topic: Paper Money Oddities

Date: July 11

Presented by Joseph Boling

This presentation covers a variety of errors and environmental issues that can affect paper money, such as ink starvation errors, offset errors, other printing defects associated with the several steps in creating US notes, and color changelings.

Joseph Boling began collecting numismatic items in the 1950s, and is a specialist in Japanese numismatic emissions and world counterfeit paper money. He lived in Japan 1957-60 and 1983-85, first with his US Air Force father and later during his own 28-year Army career. He has also lived in Morocco, Germany, and Vietnam for a total of twelve years.

His Japanese coins were sold at auction in Hong Kong in 1989, and the most significant of the banknotes there in 2001. His Japanese bonds and shares, composing one of the world's finest private collections, were sold in 2006. His most recent book (as author) is *World War II Remembered: History in Your Hands, a Numismatic Study*, written with C. Frederick Schwan, 864pp, 1995. He has also edited several books, most recently *Forging Secrets: Faces and Facts Inside the Nazi Operation Bernhard Scheme*, for which he also wrote the technical chapter.

Colonel Boling has been the ANA's chief exhibit judge for 26 of the past 33 years. He has trained ANA judges since 1986. He has taught at the ANA's summer seminar since 1999, teaching, co-teaching, or guest lecturing in over a dozen courses. In 2007 the ANA Goodfellows established the Joseph E. Boling Award for Excellence in Judging, now awarded annually to a judge selected by the ANA chief judge and a representative of the Goodfellows. He was elected to the ANA's Hall of Fame in 2023.

Topic: Israel Commemorative Coins By Series

Date: July 25

Israel has issued over 600 commemorative coin types, so collecting them can seem daunting. Breaking them down by series makes it easier to collect, either by specializing in certain series or creating a type set across all series. However, few catalogs organize the coins this way.

ANA Medal of Merit and Glenn Smedley Award winner **Simcha Kuritzky** has given numerous presentations nationally, online, and to local clubs. As president of the American Israel Numismatic Association, he is currently updating their Israel coin catalog, including some innovative ways of arranging the listings.

August Webinars:

Topic: LIVE from the World's Fair of Money® – Silver Coinage of the Tetrarchy: All Hail the Argenteus!

Date: August 8

Presented by Kirk Van Brunt

Diocletian is famous for many accomplishments, one of which was the creation of the Tetrarchy. Another was the resurrection of high quality silver coins in the form of the Argenteus. Why? What was the emperor thinking? This presentation explores this question and examines the history and purpose behind the coin. The Argenteus was not only a surprising pivot back to the silver coinage of old, but it signaled an interesting shift in the art and portraiture of Roman coins. For the collector, though, the Argenteus presents a confusing array of types, mints, and rarities. This presentation will attempt to bring some order to the chaos and hopefully ignite renewed appreciation and respect for this often underappreciated coin.

Kirk Van Brunt, a lifelong collector of ancient coins, is the owner of Argenteus Rare Coins, which specializes in Roman and Greek coinage. Since his graduate school days in early Christian history, he has possessed an abiding passion for all things Diocletian and a fascination with his impact on the history of the Roman empire and the Christian church. In addition to numismatics, Kirk is a writer and recently signed a book deal with Penguin Random House Canada for his forthcoming novel.

Topic: Gobrecht's Ladies - Seated Liberty Coinage Past, Present and Future

Date: August 22

Liberty Seated coinage is fascinating yet often misunderstood and overlooked. In this lecture we will delve into the design history of the series including the inspiration of the Britannia motif, the symbolism of the goddess of liberty and her accourrements using examples from ancient coinage and art. We will then pivot to the design history including the life of Christian Gobrecht and his rivalries in the mint. Finally, an overview of the series including rarities, oddities and collecting strategies.

Russ Bega began collecting US coins when he was 8 years old after a trip to his local coin shop in Northern Colorado. He was previously employed by Heritage Auction Galleries, before departing on a decade long career as a US Army Infantry Non Commissioned Officer. In 2021 he joined the Harlan J. Berk team in Chicago, IL. His specialty is Liberty Seated coins and 19th century numismatics.

Monday Morning Brief for July 8, 2024: A new dime design?

The dime didn't change during the Bicentennial, but could feature a new design for 2026, and the CCAC is going to be looking at some possibilities in two weeks.

It only took a few words in a public notice for my imagination to kick into a higher gear. The Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee will be meeting in two weeks for a two-day session. Nothing unusual there, so let's look at the agenda. It mentions coin change for the Semiquincentennial, already shown to be a hot topic, so it's sure to generate a little excitement again. It was the phrase "Review and discussions of the candidate designs for the 2026 Semiquincentennial Dime" that got the heart pounding.

It even overshadowed an error in the notice, that the meeting would start at 10 p.m. instead of 10 a.m. That's forgivable, so let's get back to that dime.

While the Semiquincentennial is known as the nation's 250th birthday, the year is also the 230th anniversary of the nation welcoming 10-cent coins. Of course, the denomination's design has changed in that time, but not in my lifetime. This is groundbreaking.

When we celebrated the U.S. Bicentennial, the smaller denominations were left off the guest list. The Lincoln cent, Jefferson five-cent coin and Roosevelt dime rolled along, business as usual. Nobody gave them a second glance in change, and a lot more change was circulating in 1976 than will be in 2026.

This notice of a "proposed" (can't get ahead of myself here, though the thought is tempting) change is long overdue. While Lincoln has looked basically the same in the nearly 50 years since the Bicentennial, the cent's composition changed, and the reverse of the coin has changed a few times (several in 2009). The Jefferson 5-cent coin went through its Westward Ho phase in 2004 and 2005, ending up in 2006 with an obverse portrait change that was more drastic than the reverse changes, in some opinions.

For the circulating Roosevelt dime, only the date has changed since the design's installation, and 2026 will mark its 80th anniversary. With the freedom available under the act calling for the <u>Semiquincentennial</u> redesigns, what changes are coming, and where on this coin?

Whatever changes are made will be temporary, just like they were 50 years ago. They will be circulating coins, and we can already slow the roll on the idea that they will be worth hundreds of thousands of dollars. They will be different, but that's all, because there will be millions of them. They will just provide an interesting change of pace in any folder of the collector who now sees row upon row of the same design in a dime album or folder.

When 2027 rolls around, the design will revert, but for how long? The plot thickens.


