Please keep the number of coins you wish to auction to no more than 5. If you are able, please identify the following information for each coin:

- The coin year and mint
- The coin denomination
- The coin grade (and any other coin feature—toning/marking/etc)
- The opening bid for the coin

For example, if you have a 1952D Franklin Half—BU, and you'd like to start bidding at \$15.00:

1952D Franklin Half BU (FBL) \$15.00

And please include your name for your list. I'm old and have a harder time remembering names. It would be embarrassing for me to be looking at a list, and then say to myself—"This is great. But who the hell's list is this?"

Again, please limit the number of coins you'd like to auction to 5. And please have those lists to me no later than 26 February. I should be able to compile those lists to a single auction list by then and have the newsletter out to you by the 1st of March.

Market Analysis: Double-struck 1923 Peace dollar impressive in December sale

Heritage's Dec. 21 online Showcase auction titled "The Misfits Collection of U.S. Error Coinage" totaled \$840,591 across 253 lots, and the session included some real showstoppers.

Among the most impressive, and expensive, was a 1923 Peace dollar that was double struck with the second strike off center. The doubling is seen in two profiles and sets of rays on the obverse, and two heads of the eagle on the reverse.

Mike Byers explained in his book *World's Greatest Errors*, "When a blank planchet is struck by the dies, the normal procedure is for the feeders to eject the struck coin out of the collar and into a chute." A malfunction where the struck coin is not ejected means that the coin might receive a second strike, or even more, from the dies.

This one was graded Mint State 64 by Numismatic Guaranty Co. and sold for \$18,000.

Market Analysis: 44 of the 'Top 100 U.S. Coins'

One of the most eclectic offerings within Heritage's January Florida United Numismatists auctions was the Schwenk Family 100 Greatest Coins Collection. The collector ultimately offered 44 coins from the Whitman publication *The 100 Greatest U.S. Coins*.

Tops in the offering was a famed 1943 Lincoln cent struck on a bronze planchet rather than the zinc-coated steel planchet that was supposed to be used in 1943. The collection's example is graded About Uncirculated 50 by Professional Coin Grading Service and sold for \$240,000.

Today, around 20 Philadelphia Mint examples are known, joined by around seven from the San Francisco Mint and a sole Denver Mint representative. Many deceptive counterfeits exist, making third-party certification essential.

Heritage said on the Schwenk Collection, "To own only one, two or three coins from the 100 Greatest list is an accomplishment to define a collection. To have 44 such coins is a remarkable feat."
