Late Entry Policy – Day County 4-H

Late Entries are defined as any project, display or livestock that is not entered in Fair Entry for the Day County Fair by the deadline of 11:59 pm, Monday, July 27.

Missing the entry deadline does not exclude members from showing projects and participating in all 4-H contests during the Day County Fair. However, late entries are not eligible for consideration for special awards such as Grand/Reserve Champion livestock awards, Best of Show and Judge's Choice.

State Fair Qualification Requirements

In order to qualify to exhibit a **DISPLAY** exhibit at the State Fair, 4-H members **MUST** exhibit and receive a ribbon placing with a minimum of one (1) display exhibit in a recognized lot listed in the SD State Fair Book.

In order to qualify to exhibit in an **ANIMAL** species at the State Fair, a 4-H exhibitor, at a South Dakota County Achievement Days/Fair 4-H Show (at local level) must exhibit and receive a ribbon placing with a minimum of one (1) animal in that species in a recognized class listed in the South Dakota 4-H State Fair Book.

- Shows and classes that are at the county level only and not listed in the South Dakota 4-H State Fair Book shall not count as qualifying to exhibit at State Fair.
- 4-H exhibitors are able to exhibit different animals at the County Level than at the State Fair for biosecurity purposes.

- In order to qualify to exhibit at the State 4-H Horse Show, youth must first compete in a county level 4-H horse show. They must enter the same classes at the county level that they plan to enter at the state level. No minimum ribbon placing is required, but participation in each class entered is mandatory. If a youth cannot attend their own county horse show, they may compete in another county's show to meet this requirement.

Display Exhibit Judging

- ✿ **4-H Display Exhibit Entry Qualification** In order to qualify to exhibit a display exhibit at the State Fair, a 4-H exhibitor, at a South Dakota County 4-H Achievement Days/ Fair must exhibit and receive a ribbon placing with a minimum of one (1) display exhibit in a recognized lot listed in the South Dakota 4-H State Fair Book .
- ✿ Display Judging will take place Wednesday, August 5th from 4-7 PM. It is strongly recommended that 4-Hers interview judge projects.
 - Exhibit projects not being interview judged may be dropped off with Exhibit Cards and [Display Exhibit Entry Form](#), or Special Forms attached, at the Pavilion on August 5th from 3:30-5 PM.
- ✿ Exhibit Cards will be printed at the Extension Office. Exhibit Cards will be available for pickup on or before July 31st. All cards must be picked up and attached prior to judging at fairgrounds.
- ✿ A **Display Exhibit Entry Form** must be filled out & included with all Display exhibits **NOT** being interview judged. All project areas requiring a “special” entry form such as Clothing, Food Preservation & Photography exhibits will need “special” forms attached.

Food Preservation—A [Food Preservation Entry Form](#) must be filled out and attached to the exhibit for judging. All exhibits must include a current score card label with altitude classification, the recipe and the source of the recipe.

Photography—The [Photography Entry Form](#) requests information about the camera as well as information regarding how and why the 4-H member chose the photograph’s content. It is similar in size to the Display exhibit form and should be taped to the back of the foam board attached to the photograph.

Hobbies and Collections—Display exhibits require a written Exhibit Summary Report that can be in a 3-ring binder or folder. The summary report should share information about the hobby/collection and can include pictures.

Interview Judging

Interview judging of your 4-H projects is a process that greatly enhances your 4-H evaluation experience. The process involves a caring judge interviewing you about your project. Interview judging gives you a sense of personal involvement and helps to make project work more educational.

The evaluation of the exhibit is done by you and the judge together. Basing a decision on your project goals and the general exhibit standards, the judge decides how much progress has been made and what ribbon you will receive. You can explain your own starting point; take note of the progress you have made and explain your future goals. Benefits of interview judging are improved communication skills, recognizing your personal success and progress, encouragement to try new ideas and learning from the experience of the judge. The benefits to the judge are to help you feel good about your project and find out what you want to achieve while providing a learning experience.



BEST OF SHOW AND JUDGE’S CHOICE AWARDS

Judges will be selecting these awards at the conclusion of Display Exhibit Judging. All purple ribbon exhibits will be considered for these awards. The Interview and Display Exhibit Form will be important for projects in contention for these awards.

Sanitary Regulations—All animals must be free from all contagious diseases such as ringworm, pink eye, lump jaw & warts. If warts have been removed surgically, the scars must be healed by the time of the fair.

The Webster Vet Clinic has set aside the following times for 4-H families to bring their animals for a health inspection prior to attending the Day County Fair.

***Health Inspections are free of charge. All vaccines or deworming are regular cost.*

✿ **Wednesday, August 5 – 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM**

✿ **Thursday, August 6 – 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM**

Health Inspection Form -Health Inspection Form is available on the Day County 4-H webpage. The form **MUST** be filled out prior to arriving at the Vet Clinic. Poultry must be from Polonium Free facility or be tested showing Polonium free. Health Papers from a previous show will not be acceptable.

Sheep and Goats—must have official USDA premise of origin tags known as Scrapie tags. RAMS TEST: Rams, six months of age & older, must have blood tested negative by the ELISA test for Brucella-ovis within 30 days of entry for out of state or 60 days in state or come from a certified Brucella-ovis free flock.

ANIMAL OWNERSHIP AND IDENTIFICATION

In order to be eligible for exhibiting at the Day County Fair and SD State Fair, ALL animals must be identified by 11:59 on June 1, 2026. **NO LATE NOMINATIONS OR ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

Due by June 1:

- Animal Ownership
- Animal Identification in 4-H Online
- Animal Lease Form (if applicable)
- DNA Samples turned into the Extension Office with payment

Due by July 1: Youth Livestock Literacy certification

Due by July 27: Day County Fair Entries with REGISTRATION PAPERS (if applicable)

Due by August 1: State Fair Entries with REGISTRATION PAPERS (if applicable)

INTEGRITY PLEDGE -

The 4-H Livestock Integrity Pledge takes the refreshing approach of placing trust in 4-H parents and youth. We trust that our parents want 4-H to serve as a place for their youth to develop into contributing members of society—builders not takers. We trust that our youth want to be true 4-H'ers—desiring a good exhibition experience and willing to demonstrate personal responsibility.

This pledge is a required component of SD4-H's livestock education program. Prior to agreeing, please read, consider, and adopt the Livestock Integrity Pledge's principles in your livestock management plan and show preparations. The Integrity Pledge is a requirement when entering projects in Fair Entry for the DCF.

Registration Papers -

To be eligible for all Purebred or Registered Market or Breeding Shows (Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goat, Breeding Meat Goat, Breeding Sheep, and Swine), 4-H exhibitors are required to upload a copy of the animal registration papers (in their name or immediate family name) to their entry in Fair Entry by August 1, 2026. Registration paper must reflect ownership as of June 1 if purchased. **NOTE:** In leasing situations, exhibitors must upload registration papers to their entry in Fair Entry by August 1. The same animal owner name listed on the SD 4-H Animal Lease Form should appear on the registration paper; therefore, the registration paper does not need to be in the exhibitor's name.

Animals must be shown at the State Fair in the breed lot indicated in 4-H Online. If an exhibitor does not upload a registration paper (or other supporting document) with their

State Fair Entry, that animal must be entered in the commercial/crossbred division at the State Fair. It is recommended that exhibitors have the original paper copy of the registration paper in hand during check-in at both the county event and State Fair. This is recommended practice for any animal exhibition.

Animal Replacement Rule -

ANIMAL REPLACEMENT RULE Infrequently, animals that are registered for the County and State Fair become unavailable by Fair time. Usually this relates to herd health preferences, severe animal illness/injury, or premature death.

Animal substitutions will be allowed through the species check-in at County and State Fair.

- The replacement animal must be identified in the family's 4-H Online account by June 1st.
- Except for Breeding Sheep, replacements are allowed on a species basis. Breeding sheep are only allowed to substitute a ram for a ram and an ewe for an ewe.
- Due to stalling limitations, substitute animals will not be allowed on the fairgrounds. Only animals that are shown are allowed to stall at the fairgrounds
 - Any animal that is substituted at State Fair will have a DNA sample pulled at the State Fair.

DAY COUNTY LIVESTOCK SHOWS

BUCKET CALF: There will be a Day County Bucket calf class for beef and dairy. The calf must be spring born or young enough that there is not a 4-H class for them.

****Showing in the county bucket calf class DOES NOT qualify an exhibitor to show beef/dairy at the State Fair.**

A Livestock Committee will be formed by the 4-H Educator for the purpose of assisting with stalling of animals, barn management during the Day County Fair, scheduling, check-in, show orders, show management, judge recommendations, and educating youth by assisting with judging schools and clinics. Committee members will lead by example and promote positive animal husbandry, show ethics as laid out in the SD 4-H Livestock Integrity Pledge.

The final decision regarding judges and show orders will be made by the 4-H Youth Educator. All livestock show orders will be determined based on the guidelines found in the State Fair Book with an exception regarding the minimum number of animals required for each class/division.

COUNTY HORSE SHOW

Horse show rules are based on the State Horse Show Guidelines. To receive grand & reserve champion showman in horse, an exhibitor you must have won a purple ribbon in showmanship at the Day County Horse show. If a member participates in another county's horse show, the member is not eligible for county trophies. The

judge will be informed prior to the Horse Show that he/she will need to place top five of the Senior Showman from the Western Showmanship classes. The winner will show in the Round Robin at the Day County Fair.

HORSES AT THE DAY COUNTY FAIR

4-Hers that participated in the 2026 Day County 4-H Horse Show, or 2026 SD 4-H Rodeo are eligible for a premium at the livestock and premium sale. Horses must be stalled overnight at the fairgrounds during achievement days. Check-in for horses may begin Thursday, and all horses must be stalled by **5:00 PM Friday, August 7, 2026**. A health certificate must be turned into the Extension fair office at check-in. During the premium sale, 4-Hers must wear their 4-H fair shirt or western attire as required by 4-H horse show or rodeo guidelines. Horses will be led through the sale, not ridden. The safety of spectators, 4-Hers and their horses is important. Please note the following:

- ✿ 1 Horse per exhibitor
- ✿ Trucks and trailers should not enter the Fairgrounds. Please unload horses and supplies outside the gates and lead horses to the barn.
- ✿ Please clean up after your animals to and from the barn if needed.
- ✿ Horses will not be ridden through the fairgrounds. To access the horse arena, 4-Hers must use the south path between the horse barn and arena.
- ✿ Equipment used at the horse arena must be picked up and put away after each use. Gates are to always remain closed.

COMPANION ANIMAL

The companion animal show will be held Thursday, August 6th at 9:00 AM at the Day County Fair Grounds. All exhibitors will bring their animals to the show on the day of the event and take them home at the conclusion of the show.

DOG

The dog show will be held August 11th with Senior Showmanship held July 15th at the Day County Fair Grounds. All exhibitors will bring their animals to the show on the day of the event and take them home at the conclusion of the show.

4-H SHOWMANSHIP—for Beginner, Junior & Senior members will be held in Swine, Beef, Dairy & Meat Goat, Sheep, Rabbit, Poultry, Dairy, Dog, and Companion Animal during, before or following the judging of each respective species. You must show your own animal. Grand & Reserve Champions will be picked if deserved in each species with all other participants receiving ribbons.

ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP—**Large Animal Round Robin** will be held on Sunday, August 9th beginning at 12:30 pm. The event will include the following species: Dairy Cattle, Horse, Sheep, Swine and Beef Cattle. **Small Animal Round Robin** will be held Sunday, August 9th, 15 minutes following the conclusion of the Large Animal Round

Robin. The event will include the following species: Meat Goat, Dairy Goat, Dog, Rabbit and Poultry.

Judges will be requested to name the top 5 senior members in the respective showmanship species shows. The senior Dog & Horse winners will be selected at their respective shows. Each competitor is to show all the species in the Round Robin Contest starting with their own animal. If they choose not to show an individual species, they will receive a zero for that rotation. The rotations will be 2 minutes in length. One overall Showman will be selected & will receive a personalized belt buckle sponsored by a Day County business.

Members are eligible to win both contests and may participate in one or both contests per year. The top Senior Showmanship winner will be given the right to participate in the event. If this individual has won Round Robin in prior years or is the showmanship winner in two or more species, the next ranked winner in the senior division will be given the opportunity to participate.

DAY COUNTY 4-H LIVESTOCK SALE

✿ It will be the members' responsibility to pick up and complete the Livestock Sale Form. Sale Forms are due to the 4-H Office during official CHECK IN times. All changes/updates must be turned in by 4:00 pm, Saturday, August 8th.

Sale Weigh-Ins on Sale Day (Sunday) morning are as follows:

- *Market Beef: 8:00 AM.*
- *Market Sheep, Swine & Meat Goats: follow.*

The scale closes at 9:00 AM. If you are not present to weigh-in your livestock, you forfeit your right to sell a premium.

Jorgensen Meats and The Meathouse have set aside time to process animals sold in the 4-H Sale. Please let buyers know that animals purchased can be sent to either location on Monday, August 10 for processing. Thank you.

4-H exhibitors earning Grand Champion and Reserve Champion awards for Breeding/Market Beef, Breeding/Market Sheep, Breeding/Market Meat Goat, Breeding/Market Swine, Dairy Cattle and Dairy Goat and Horse/Rodeo seniors who have graduated from high school are invited to participate in the Inaugural Day County 4-H Sale of Champions. 4-Hers earning top awards can sell one (1) premium and one (1) animal in the Sale of Champions. The Sale of Champions will be first with all species.

If there is any question about the weight of an animal, it must be raised at the time the animal is weighed! Our scale is inspected by Webster Scale annually just before the opening of the Day County Fair. Please express your appreciation to Webster Scale.

4-H LIVESTOCK SALE

1. 4-H members who exhibited Swine, Meat Goat, Sheep, Beef, Horse, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats and have successfully complied with all 4-H show rules and policies are eligible to sell one (1) premium and two (2) market animals in the Day County 4-H Livestock & Premium Sale. **This includes animals sold in the Sale of Champions.
2. If a 4-H member is selling premium at the Day County Fair, members must stall the animal on the Fairgrounds during the Day County Fair unless they are at another 4-H event. They must have had approval from the executive committee prior to the Fair.
3. The animal and the premiums will be sold separately—both at the auction.
4. The premium will be sold first with all bidding done at auction.
5. The animal will then be auctioned by weight.
6. Only two market animals per 4-H member can be sold at the sale. Breeding animals cannot be sold as market animals.
7. If members have more than one animal to be sold in a species, the second animal will be sold after each exhibitor has the opportunity to sell one.
8. If selling a premium and/or the animal, the exhibitor must be present during the premium sale unless reasonable cause is presented to the 4-H leaders Executive Board, prior to the fair, by the exhibitor.
9. A thank-you must be written to the buyer and delivered to the office before livestock premium checks will be disbursed. The county office will mail the thank you at the exhibitor's request. A deadline of *September 15* will stand for thank you notes to be completed. Members who do not meet this deadline will forfeit their premium check as well as the opportunity to sell a premium in the upcoming year's 4-H Premium Sale. The funds will be returned to the Day County Leaders Association.
10. Premium and Livestock checks will be available to exhibitors as soon as all funds from the sale have been collected. Proof of a thank you is required to receive the check.

ANIMAL RELEASE: At the conclusion of the sale, exhibitors must complete the checkout process with the Species Committee Chair. All livestock pens and alleyways are to be cleaned and manure piled at the end of the building as directed. All tack and supplies should be removed. Thank you for your cooperation and hard work!

STATE FAIR LIVESTOCK ENTRY INFORMATION

**Review pages 5-7 of the State Fair Book for all livestock project area changes, stalling information state fair rules and regulations.

Market Beef—Heifers must weigh at least 900 pounds at State Fair weigh-in to be eligible for entry in the State Fair Market Heifer Class. Steers will be judged according to breed & weight with the lightest steers proceeding to the heaviest. Steers weighing LESS than 1,000 pounds will not be eligible for entry in the State Fair Market Steer Class.

Swine—Swine will be divided into weight classes. Swine weighing less than 230 pounds/over 300 pounds at State will be allowed to exhibit, however, they are ineligible to receive a purple ribbon & compete for an award. Clipped pigs must have hair at least ¼ inch long for State Fair.

Market Lamb Sheering—It is strongly recommended that all market lambs be shorn prior to arriving at the SD State Fair.
