Common Ground began at St. Mary's on September 23rd, 2021. We decided to meet on the 2nd Thursday of each month from 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM to make 30 lunches. Coffee and snacks are offered to those who volunteer. Volunteers stay after making lunches to chat in community and share a cup of coffee (hence: Common Ground.) All in the community are invited to participate.

To date we have had a total of 35 volunteers, 34 parishioners and one member of the community at large who has attended St. Mary's recently and in the past. We have provided 150 sack lunches over 5 months to the Food and Care Coalition.

In January, Common Ground was able to provide the monthly 30 sack lunches from Volunteer donations. Beginning in February we will be making 50 lunches per month. We hope to increase the sack lunches even more, hoping for total donations and more parishioners and folks from our surrounding community.

Goals: We are waiting for Covid to lessen enough where we can serve volunteers soup and sandwiches etc. as we grow. The possibilities for this ministry to grow are exciting.

A big thank you to all who have volunteered time and donations. We have a kitchen full of ingredients for healthy lunches and we have had financial donations for this to be possible as well. Way to Go St. Mary's!
