Priest-in-Charge Report

We are also having a pretty fun time with Lent Madness, so that's also good.

The Ash Wednesday services were well attended and Natalie took beautiful pictures both at the Mardi Gras party and at the Ash Wednesday service that were in the newsletter and we can also publish on our website.

The Mardi Gras party was very fun, I love being in the kitchen and being part of preparing everything. I am looking for feedback on what we can do better or differently next year.

Senior Warden Report

Treasurer's Report

Income

- Pledge contributions were in line with the January monthly budget.
- Plate contributions were above budget for the month of January by approximately \$800.
- Grant income for January was received as expected.
- Overall, income year-to-date was ahead of budget by \$1.2k.

Expense

- Copier costs were over-budget by almost 1k; however, most of this expense pertained to additional printing needs during Advent and Christmas.
- Natural gas expense was well above budget, but other utilities were in line with or under budget.
- The organist and parish administrator expenses were over budget, but some expenses incurred in December were paid in January. Payroll was one of these expenses. There was a \$2.8k deficit for the month of January. Several expenses incurred in December were paid (and recorded) in January. Nonetheless, the results were in line with the budget.
