TIPS FOR PARTICIPANTS IN ZOOM MEETINGS


- Turn off notifications on your computer and remove distractions.
- Check your sound and video prior to joining or join early to check them online.
- In small meetings, keep your video on unless you are away from the computer or otherwise occupied. In large meetings, only turn on your video when speaking.
- Keep yourself muted, and only unmute when you are recognized by the chair to speak or are making an interrupting motion.
- Try to keep you comments brief.
- Focus on what's happening in the meeting while on camera.

INTERVIEW WITH A REGISTERED PARIAMENTARIAN

Biographical Questions

- Q As a kid, what were you like?
- A. Loved competition! Growing up in a big family made for a ton of fun filled days. We had plenty of playtime. We had very loving and protective parents. Our parents introduced us to a love for learning, because they believed education gave us better opportunities in life.
- Q When your friends/family find out that you are a professional parliamentarian what do they say or ask?
- A. First, they'll congratulate me and then they'll say what do you do?
- Q How would (someone) describe you?
- A. I hope they would describe me as a person who cares about family and friends. I hope they would add that I'm fun loving and a great host.
- Q. What might (someone) be surprised to know about you?
- A. I'm not sure, I think people consider me open minded.
- Q. What do you do when you aren't involved with Parliamentary Procedures?
- A. My all-time favorite is spending time with my wife Donna, seeing my kids and their families, then traveling, discovering new places, hanging out with friends and family, gaming, music, art, photography and volunteering.

- Q. Tell me how you first got involved in with Parliamentary procedures?
- A. I served in many roles for my fraternity. Sharon Wells, past president of PQNY, was instrumental in providing an opportunity for me to further my parliamentary procedure studies by becoming a member of the National Association of Parliamentarians.
- Q. What has surprised you most about working with other Parliamentarians?
- A. What surprised me the most was the level of interest that so many other people had in learning more about parliamentary procedure.
- Q. What would you tell someone who is thinking about becoming a RP / PRP?
- A. I would tell them not to take the journey alone, attaining the RP/ PRP certification is much more satisfying when you work in groups. This approach gives you an opportunity to give and get feedback to overcome your weak areas and strengthen the areas where your knowledge is strong.

Parliamentary life (cont.)

- Q. What (if any) specific advice or recommendations does he have for youth parliamentarians?
- A. I would tell them to have fun while learning, practice as much as possible by serving as a parliamentarian and then teach others when the opportunity presents itself.
- Q. The interest in RONR seems to be growing. Why do you think that is?
- A. I believe it's growing because in the New York City area, District Director Rob Robinson was instrumental in building awareness of NAP and their resources.
- Q. What do you wish other people knew about Parliamentary Procedures?
- A. I wish more people were self-motivated to pursue learning about parliamentary procedures and how to apply them to their organizations. I believe that once they expose themselves to how to best use parliamentary procedures, they would see the immense time saving benefits parliamentary procedures could bring when used effectively.
- Q. What would you say are some of your strongest beliefs about Parliamentary Procedures?
- A. My strongest belief about parliamentary procedures is that practice is the most important part of learning and applying parliamentary procedures. I also believe that when an organization embraces parliamentary procedures, better decisions would be made and improve member engagement.
- Q. If you could change one thing about Parliamentary Procedures, what would it be?
- A. I can't think of anything I would change about parliamentary procedures now because of my limited experience. Who knows, maybe down the road I'll have an idea or two.
- Q. What do you think will change about parliamentary procedures over the next five years?
- A. Perhaps artificial intelligence created to monitor meetings and provide instant feedback to presiding officers could be something that would bring about change.
- Q. As a parliamentarian what is the most challenging responsibility / job you have ever taken?
- A. My current role as national parliamentarian for lota Phi Theta Fraternity, Inc.®. My current focus is building awareness of the advantages of using parliamentary procedure and creating more parliamentarians within the organization.

Specific to RONR

- Q. What is your favorite and least favorite motions and why?
- A. My favorite motion is the motion to amend. The motion to amend supports the idea that we are always pursuing perfection and allowing ourselves open to other options when deciding on a course of action. My least favorite motion is the motion to postpone indefinitely, it's the most dilatory and misused motion in my opinion.
