The Aspiration:

- To redirect the course of history by re-embedding a biblical view of work into the standard curriculum, from pre-school through high school, equipping students to serve God and to love people by engaging in work of all kinds (both present and future) as the very work of God.

The Problem:

- If students fail to understand biology, art and math within the larger context of a biblical view of God, Creation, Humanity, Moral Order and Purpose, they will tend to become “Christian dualists,” seeing the Bible as relevant to their personal and private lives, or the affairs of the church, but not relevant to business, law or civil service. Because of this, most students as adults will leave their faith at home, rather than take it to work with them, and the world suffers because of this.
- Students often fail to see their current school assignments and activities as God’s present work for them, and this hinders them from experiencing purpose and meaning in school.
- Christian schools often see “biblical worldview integration” as a goal, when it is actually a means to a much larger end. The WRAP clarifies that larger end.

The Solution:

- Christian educators are in a unique position to build into the minds and hearts of students the understanding that all legitimate work is the work of God. Schools can embed “theology of work” into the curriculum, at all levels, in ways that are *systemic*, *intentional* and *repeatable*. They can create curriculum maps in which a biblical concept of work dovetails seamlessly with all course content, without adding a new course to the teachers’ load.
- Christian educators can go a long way toward eliminating SSD [the “Sacred-Secular Divide”] in the next generation by enabling students to engage in God’s purposes for humans in the full spectrum of creation, fulfilling the First Commission of Gen. 1:26-28 in harmony with the Great Commission of Matthew 28:18-20.

The Means:

- The WRAP teacher training comes in 3 “sizes,” or “options.” Each option covers the same basic ideas and tools, but requires differing amounts of time, effort and cost. These 3 options are described below, and their respective costs. Teachers at a particular WRAP school may take either Option A, B or C, as determined by the school Head in consultation with the Worldview Matters® coach. Determining factors may be economic, the teachers’ loads, and/or teaching experience.
- No matter which option the teachers take (A, B or C), participants will meet regularly with fellow staff members and the school Head for discussion, at a time and frequency determined by the school Head in consultation with the Worldview Matters® coach.
- No matter which training option is taken, the school Head will have an individual video conference (or telephone conversation) with the Worldview Matters® coach, at least once per month for at least 30 minutes.
- Participants will complete required readings, and apply specific teaching tools in classroom settings. All written assignments will be reviewed and commented upon by the Worldview Matters® coach.
- Secondary level students (if the school has a middle school or high school program) will complete a course in “Theology of Work” using a text provided by Worldview Matters®, as part of either a Bible class, a worldview class, a personal finance class, an economics class, an introduction to careers class or a business class, taught by the respective classroom teacher. The cost of the materials is \$35 per student. (For more about this text, visit www.maximizemeaning.blogspot.com.)

Training Option A:

- Participants will read a 180-page e-text titled, *God’s Pleasure At Work*, and view the short video clips contained in this e-text. Each participant will also fill out a 48-page Participant Guide accompanying this e-text.
- Participants will meet together with all other teachers for the viewing of 12 video lectures by Dr. Christian Overman and having group discussions with the other teachers and administration.
- Participants will use 6 lesson planning tools introduced throughout the course. A copy of each lesson plan and a brief description of how the lesson went will be sent to the Worldview Matters® coach for review and individualized comments. The coach will send these documents back to the participant as well as to the Head of the school.
- Participants will read a 54-page booklet, called *The Lost Purpose for Learning*.
- The cost of this option is \$174 per person, which covers \$35 for the books and materials plus \$139 for the services of the Worldview Matters® coach to review and comment on individual lesson plans. (Shipping costs, if applicable, are additional.)

Training Option B:

- *Participants taking this route will be awarded 10 CEUs approved by the Association of Christian Schools International [ACSI] in either Biblical Studies or Educational Studies. This option also fulfills the ACSI requirement for a course in the philosophy of Christian education.*
- During the academic school year, participants will read a 181-page text titled, *Assumptions That Affect Our Lives*, a 347-page text titled, *LifeWork*, and 2 articles, submitting written “reflection and response” papers for each book and article. Participants will also complete a short Bible study on the topic of education.
- Participants will view 12 video lectures by Dr. Christian Overman.
- Various lesson planning tools will be introduced, and the participants will use these tools in classroom settings (or with family members). A copy of lesson plans and a brief description of how the lesson went will be sent to the Worldview Matters® coach, who will review and make individualized comments and send these documents back to the participant as well as to the Head of the school.
- Participants will read a 54-page booklet, called *The Lost Purpose for Learning*.
- The cost of this option is \$270 per person, which covers \$72 for the materials (shipping costs are additional) and \$198 for the services of the Worldview Matters® coach to review and comment on individual lesson plans and papers related to readings.

Training Option C:

- *The requirements for Option C are the same as the requirements for Option B. The only difference is participants receive 5 university credits from Seattle Pacific University, in addition to being awarded 10 CEUs approved by the Association of Christian Schools International [ACSI] in either Biblical Studies or Educational Studies. Both Option B and Option C fulfill the ACSI requirement for a course in the philosophy of Christian education.*
- The cost of Option C is \$567 per person, which covers \$72 for the materials (payable to Worldview Matters®, shipping costs additional) and \$495 tuition (payable to Seattle Pacific University).

¹ Under certain circumstances, it may be possible for 1.5 CEUs to be awarded if the individual school works this out independently with ACSI.

The WRAP is a 2 Year Process (minimum):³

Once the Head of the school determines which option (A, B, or C) is best suited for the various individual members of the faculty and administration [some may take Option A, others may take Option B or C], the following phases will be implemented:

Phase 1: (during year 1)

- The key leader of the school (headmaster/superintendent/associate principals) complete the training with a small number of “Key Players” selected by the administration. “Key players” could be department heads, curriculum supervisors, board members, etc.

Phase 2: (during year 2)

- All other teachers receive training through Option A, B or C.
- Those in the Key Players group (that is, those who completed the course in year 1 with the administration) will begin the process of curriculum mapping.
- Secondary level students (at grade 10 or 11) will use the *God’s Pleasure At Work* e-text as either a Bible class, a career-prep class, or introduction to economics course. (This is the same e-text teachers use for Option A.)

After Year 2:

- The process of curriculum mapping begins in year 2 with the “Key Players,” and continues with the other teachers who completed the training in Year 2. This process is usually done independently of Worldview Matters®, with the “Key Players” and administration serving as coaches.

³Schools wanting to continue working with Worldview Matters® beyond 2 years have this option, if desired. This should be discussed with the Worldview Matters® coach near the end of the 2nd year.

Benefits of the WRAP:

- **Students** will connect meaning and purpose with their lives, and their studies. They will understand that no matter what occupational path they may take, whether in business, civil service, or homemaking, they will be doing God's work, for His glory.
- **Parents** will be delighted, which translates into increased value and greater return on their investment in their children, not to mention the investment in the school.
- **Teachers** will know they are shaping history by helping students to realize a life of significance and purpose, and this will bring greater meaning and fulfillment to the daily work of coming generations.
