American Academy of Dental Science.

Instituted in Boston

October 19 1867.

Freamble.

In view of the quat importance of the art of Deutistry to the human vace, and for the purpose of promoting the theoretical and practical knowledge of the same, as well as for elevating the standard of the science, and the requirements of practitioners of the perfersion, we, the undersigned, do hereby agree to establish an institution for cultivating and advancing a knowledge of Dentistry among its members, subject to the following Constitution, and to such By-Lous as shall from time to time be adopted.
