A Message from our President and Founder

I'm honored to present our 2024 Impact Report, a reflection of our collective efforts to make a meaningful difference in the lives of brain tumor patients and their families. The past year has been one of growth and transformation, and I'm incredibly proud of the progress we've made together.

WINKS continues to support individuals and families facing brain tumor diagnoses through our vital programs. The Empathy in Action Program has expanded, offering emotional, logistical, and financial assistance. We've distributed 131 Brain Tumor Power Packs to healthcare facilities and awarded \$22,500 in grants to help alleviate the financial burden of a diagnosis.

We've also strengthened our organizational capacity to meet growing demand, hiring a part-time program manager and increasing our volunteer team to 19 members. This expanded infrastructure will help us better support the increasing number of families who need us.

While our work continues to evolve, we are faced with the challenge of scaling our impact to meet the rising demand for services. As a volunteer-led organization, we are aware that financial sustainability is key to achieving long-term growth and stability. Our goal is to transition to a full-time leadership structure, allowing us to further amplify our impact and continue offering life-changing support to those in need.

Looking forward, we are committed to building a sustainable future for WINKS. Through strategic partnerships and continued community engagement, we are actively working to diversify our funding sources and ensure that our mission remains strong for years to come.


Empathy in Action Grants




WINKS provided the following life-changing support to brain tumor patients and their families in 2024:


- 131 Brain Tumor Power Packs supplied to newly diagnosed patients
- 15 additional informational packets provided to patients currently in treatment
- 15 Empathy in Action Grants, totaling \$15,000, providing needs-based support for ordinary and necessary living expenses
- 12 EIA Transportation Grants, totaling \$7500, providing the funds for patients to attend specialist appointments and treatment.





Everything we do is made possible through partnerships with local organizations.

We collaborate with healthcare organizations across Hampton Roads to provide Brain Tumor Power Packs to newly diagnosed patients and facilitate support groups for patients and their families. Additionally, we partner with local and national organizations to fund our Empathy in Action Grants, raise awareness about the impact of brain tumors, and address the needs of brain tumor patients in the region. In 2024, WINKS joined forces with over 15 organizations, providing more than \$22,000 in need-based grants and distributing 131 Brain Tumor Power Packs.

Kari's Story

When Kari was diagnosed with a brain tumor, she turned to WINKS for help.

In August, Kari applied for an Empathy in Action Grant to cover daily expenses and relocate to more affordable housing. Living alone, with only limited support from family and a home care provider, **Kari struggled to meet her basic needs and access the help she needed**.

Recognizing the urgency of her situation, WINKS arranged for President and Founder, Sam Hunter, to visit Kari at home in September.

What began as a quick visit to deliver the grant turned into a two-hour conversation, as Sam recognized Kari's need for emotional connection. The experience deepened Sam's commitment to WINKS' mission, reinforcing the importance of providing both practical and emotional support to those facing brain tumor diagnoses.

Thanks to the grant, Kari was able to move into more affordable housing, lifting a significant financial burden. Now focused on regaining her strength, Kari is excited to give back to WINKS and sharing the kindness and support that transformed her life.



While brain cancer may affect fewer than 1% of the population, the **impact** on those who face it is profound. WINKS is dedicated to meeting the **urgent needs** of these individuals, ensuring they receive the **resources**, **care**, **and support** they deserve.
