## Message from the President

t's that beautiful, busy time of year again! Car-covering pollen has subsided and the neighborhood is teeming with life (bullfrogs croaking, deer everywhere including inside our fully shrubbedlined fence in the backyard, and occasional possum, racoon, fox and owl sightings). In a classic case of correlation vs. causation, either the good weather or porta-potty placement increases the use of the beach property. We have noticed an increased interest in the beach by CNU students and

other non-residents and we are monitoring the situation. NNPD made a few late-night visits to the property last summer and we can ask for increased patrol (to go along with speed enforcement on Country Club). We will also mention it to our friends at the neighborhood relations office at CNU.

Last quarter I warned of a potential big-ticket project at the beach (please see an update from our

Improvements Committee). As part of that, we explored establishing a sister 501(c)(3) corporation to our current civic association which is a 501 (c)(7). The process is expensive, takes at least six months and isn't guaranteed to be approved by the IRS. Ultimately, we chose to pause since we are pursuing a much more frugal solution to repair and replace the Bulkhead Retaining Wall. We will still need your generous support to replenish our operating and reserve funds and apologize that those donations

are not tax deductible (and if you are an attorney who would like to assist us with that in the future, please let us know).

Our three traditional Spring events went well. Thank you to the usual suspects who assisted during the clean-up, along with some new helping hands. The Easter Egg Hunt had slightly less participation than the past few years but still enough to gather up over a thousand eggs in just a few minutes (take note not to arrive

late!). The multihouse yard sale had 16 participants and there seemed to be a lot of interest.

Mark vour calendars for the Family Picnic on Saturday the 21sth of June at 5pm. I failed to deconflict this with my brother-in-law's wedding so I will miss seeing everyone and helping with the grill. There will be music, standard cook-out fare of hamburgers and hot dogs (vegetarian options too) and beverages.

Volunteers to set up, cook and clean up are always appreciated. Look for the Riverside Event signs, our website and social media for updates.

Some miscellaneous thoughts from an old, retired (forked by the government I served for 39 years) curmudgeon: I shouldn't encourage signs soliciting business around the neighborhood, but house washing really does make a house look better.

# Beach Bulkhead/ Retaining Wall Plan Made

The RCCA Improvements Committee has thoroughly investigated the potential designs and associated costs of repairing or replacing the failing beach bulkhead retaining wall. After much research on the part of Mac Collins and the board, an affordable approach has been determined.

As has been the tradition established by Wolf Elber since the creation of the RCCA, a volunteer team is emerging to accomplish this task originally considered beyond our capabilities. The first step of phase one will be the rental of equipment to test the approach of our team, which includes retirees who have construction experience. This phase addresses the existing failed structure that extended the painted wall at the south end of the beach to protect the shoreline by preventing erosion of the embankment during storms. The goal is to have phase one substantially complete prior to the peak storm season in late summer/early fall.


By doing this maintenance "in-house," it is expected we will have enough in our current reserve fund to complete the first phase. Of course, our reserve will then need replenishing to cover the potential cost associated with a future major storm. Please consider making an additional donation to re-


