Plant-Driven Gardening

After weeks of unmitigated heat and humidity, we residents of Riverside have blissfully entered the fabled early August respite of open window nights and tolerable daytime temperatures. A native Virginian once referred to this as the "sailing break," the time to hoist one's sails on the open estuaries of Hampton Roads, or even the Gulf Stream. We can now confidently gather our friends and family and set out for a local day trip to Hampton's Grandview Nature Preserve, Virginia Beach's First Landing, or a picnic stroll under the welcoming canopy of the Noland Trail. It is also a perfect time to start thinking about your fall garden.

In upcoming issues of the Riverside News, I will discuss the necessity of distilling Riverside's various archetypal landscapes – grassland, woodland edge, meadow, forest – into garden design. For too long an ideological contest between native plant enthusiasts and traditional horticulturalists has created confusion.

Instead, this column will focus on designing plant communities which utilize both native and exotics in richly layered plantings, based on aesthetic appeal and enhanced ecological function. Formal or informal, stylized or naturalistic, designed plant communities thrive due to species interactions that evoke a coherent site-specific response. This column aims to help Riverside gardeners better understand plant behavior and plant-driven solutions to elevate their work in harmony with the natural world.







Riverside Beach Water Quality

Its been hot in Hampton Rodes, and with that comes the threat of swim advisories due to bacteria contamination. Huntington Beach was closed recently due to bacteria there exceeding state water quality standards.

Although just upstream from Huntington, Riverside Beach rarely has a problem. The James River Association, which monitors 34 beaches in the area, samples our water weekly from May 21st to September 1st, and posts the results on The Swim Guide. Dave Singletary notes that the although the beach itself is good, the creek flowing into the river can have issues, so best to keep your dogs away from it. Riverside's beautiful piebald deer is looking healthy. It has a genetic condition which gives it its white coat with brown spots, but also causes malformed legs and feet, scoliosis of the spine and other organ issues. About 1% of the deer population has this genetic mutation.

Beach Retaining Wall

The beach retaining wall is almost complete. Mac Collins and his crew successfully secured the wall at a fraction of the originally quoted price. And as you can see, nothing, not even a ruptured Achilles tendon, slows Mac down.



Homegrown National Park

The ongoing RCCA Native Landscaping Project at the beach is an example of a much more ambitious national program to convert a portion of suburbia's thousands of acres to small native plant gardens. The goal is to increase the diminishing population of insects that thrive on and pollinate the world of plants. These insects and seeds go on to support birds and small creatures making up the precious web of life. The "HNP" website is worth a look to see how we can make a meaningful difference while enhancing the beauty of our yards.
