Safety Issues at Moores and Shoe


There have been recent safety concerns expressed on the neighborhood Facebook page about the Intersection of Moores and Shoe Lane. Traffic coming into the neighborhood wanting to turn left onto South Moores is often met with someone going around a car waiting to turn left on North Moores.

This intersection has been looked at multiple times by city officials. Installing a four-way stop has been suggested, but National traffic standards strongly discourage four-way stops, and in fact, recommend replacing them whenever possible. Looking at the next intersection at Shoe and Country Club, with its four-way stop, shows us just some of the issues. It seems very few actually manage to stop at it.

A stop light could be installed, but doing so would add an average of one minute commuting time for all our residents, which is likely to be very unpopular. Another option would be to install a traffic circle. The one at CNU has our residents well trained as to how to navigate them. And, because traffic circles come in many sizes (an example of a small one can be seen in Port Warwick), and the intersection is so large, it may be possible to fit one in with little to no impact to the neighbors on the corner.

Another alternative could be installing curb bump outs to funnel traffic, preventing cars from passing. And perhaps the cheapest approach would be to paint lines and put up a sign indicating No Passing.

We have asked the city to investigate what could be done to make this intersection safer. They have offered to put up a new traffic monitor to gather data to help do that. In the meantime, calling 311 to express your concerns really does work.

We will have live music provided by Slack Dog Po, games, a balloon artist, a catered dinner, most likely of BBQ, sides, dessert and beverages, including the adult kind! Parking will be available on Central Parkway (the No Parking signs will be covered) for this event, which is open to all Riverside residents at no charge, but donations are welcome.

Your Improvements Committee at Work

Preserving the bridge, tables, and benches: Thanks to the good efforts of our own Dave Scoggins (owner Phoenix Painting) and his painting crew, the wooden structures at the beach are now cleaned and coated with several coats of clear wood finish and look great. RCCA bought the material directly at wholesale price and labor was a donation from Dave.

Cutting the grass in our common areas: Thanks goes to **John Maliniak** for keeping the corner lot at Central Parkway and Riverside Drive and the mowed area of the beach native plant garden looking neat and trim. He took the initiative a few years ago and continues to provide this valuable service at no cost to the RCCA.

Split Rail Fence Repair: Someone drove into the corner post of the split rail fence at the beach gate parking area and destroyed several rails. This is the second such event. Please be careful when parking in that area. The best idea is to ride a bike or walk to the beach if possible. Young drivers (high school age) were observed hitting the fence and driving off. Young folks are encouraged to walk or ride bikes as it is only a mile or so from the furthest areas of the neighborhood.

Trash removal from the beach: RCCA property is zoned as a park so does not have the trash pickup service from the city, so we pay to have it removed. You can help by packing out trash and recycle whenever you drive (cars or golf carts) to the beach.

Wolf's Run Rock Wall: We must be patient with the progress of the beautiful rock wall we started this spring. We should be able to start again in early September after

the busy summer schedules of our volunteer mason and the crew calm down. Like many of our projects, the labor is supplied by volunteers which in this case happens to be highly skilled so it is saving the RCCA a lot of dues money that can be used for other projects (like the inevitable cost of tree removal).

Tree removal: Dead trees on RCCA property that threaten RCCA resident's structures are removed as part of the RCCA budget. This year we removed trees from Central Parkway and will soon do the same at our properties behind Mistletoe and Lakeside drives.



On August 1st the RCCA hosted our local police for the National Night Out event. It was well attended, with residents enjoying time to talk directly to police about their concerns.





Martha's Way Update

Howard Huege, the president of the Mariners' Museum, has provided an update on the construction of Martha's Way.

Newport News has approved the construction drawings, and City Council has authorized the City Manager to enter into a maintenance agreement with the museum. This agreement defines who is responsible for what across the whole Martha's Way Trail, and has been completed.

The next steps are now working to securing permits and lining up contractors to begin construction.

The first phase will be the widening of the curve in Museum Parkway coming off of Kettle Pond into Riverside. The permit process is tough to apply a timeline to, but slow and steady progress is being made.




