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Safety Issues at Moores and Shoe

The City has completed gathering traffic data for the Moorse/Shoe lane intersection. From that, they have put together three preliminary plans for the neighborhood to consider. The drawings are drafts and subject to change.

Painted Bump Outs:

This options uses painted hatching to decrease the travel area of the intersection. Advantages include minimal


HOOPLOS IN A SHOE LIM

change to curb side parking, since the hatching extends 20' from the crosswalk, and code does not allow parking 20' from an intersection. The 15' striped radius gives the illusion of a tighter corner which is intended to reduce turning speeds. Pedestrian crossing time in travel lanes will be reduced, and, in theory, motorists should act like there is one lane in each direction,

eliminating the issue of vehicles going around a turning vehicle. The disadvantage of this option is that it is just paint, so motorists could ignore it and go around turning traffic anyway.

Mini-Roundabout:

Raised concrete splitter islands would be installed on Shoe and painted on Moores, due to less width. It's anticipated



that no residential property would be affected. Traffic circles are designed to increase safety by slowing traffic and decreasing angle collisions, which are more injurious. Given the roundabout at CNU, Riverside residents should be more comfortable with the roundabout concept than most. While the likelihood of being Tboned decreases with a (see page 10)

Improvements Committee Report

Fall Native Plants: The native landscape at the beach is now going to sleep for the winter. Our purple asters, swamp sunflowers, blue mist flowers and goldenrod have put on a good show for late summer and fall, but are fading to brown and, along with our other plants, becoming the winter homes and food for native insects and birds. We leave the dead plant matter in place until later in the spring for this purpose.

On the corner by the brick pumping station, you may notice the beautiful winterberry bushes showing off their red berries for several months before the birds decide they are just ripe enough for a winter snack.

Split rail Fence: The car-damaged corner post and three rails have now been replaced. We also improved the wheel mechanism on the gate.

Creek Rock Wall: Our volunteers mixed another 1,200 pounds of concrete to assist our neighborhood mason, Kevin Jordan, in adding the next section to the wall. Each twenty-bag section takes about 4 to 5 hours of physical labor. Many thanks to Kenny Stump and David Singletary who rose to the occasion on a recent Saturday morning.

Enhanced Security Camera System: A minigrant application for funds to pay for enhancing our beach security system has been submitted to the Neighborhood Watch Coalition Board. If the grant is approved, the purchase will be made by the Police Department.

CNU Neighborhood Relations

No CNU Neighbor Relations meeting has been scheduled for this year. If you have problems or concerns, you are encouraged to attend the annual meeting on Jan 4th. A CNU official will be there to answer your questions. You are encouraged to attend!

Treasurer's Report Q4 2023

Of the 864 homes that are within the official boundaries of the Riverside, approximately 25% decide to become members by donating at least \$10.

The attached year-to-date budget summary shows where our donations are applied. Most of our expenses are reoccurring and predictable and related to supporting our community beach utilities, maintenance, special projects such as the creek wall, fencing and landscaping as well the several RCCA social events.

The newsletter essentially pays for itself via advertising contributions. The balance of our revenue comes from the generous contributions of our members.

We try to keep our yearly expenses in line with that year's contributions, so our reserve remains somewhat constant or grows over time. We have kept overall 2023 expenses well below our budget, yet our reserve balance has de-

clined over \$5,000 since 2022. Our reserve is important since our greatest uncontrollable expense is tree removal and other maintenance due to storms and decay.

This year, without a storm, tree removal costs so far are \$5,400. With less than two months to go, our projected contributions are short by about \$4,400, but we are hopeful our members will come through as in the past.

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

roundabout, there is potential for increases in minor property damage collisions.

Eastbound Turn Lane/Westbound centerline hatching with no turn lane:

This option provides traffic storage for the heavier eastbound traffic turning left. It legitimizes through vehicles passing on the right of a turning car, while clearly defining westbound as one lane. The intersection is skewed so it is challenging to providing left turn lanes in both directions as far as sight lines are concerned. This option has a higher likelihood of compliance compared to a bump-out. It would also require loosing a significant amount of on-street parking.

Thanks to the Newport News Traffic Division for providing Riverside with three viable options to consider. As their planning firms up, the drawings will be updated.

At this point, we are looking for resident input. Posts on Nextdoor and Facebook will be open for comment. Comments can also be made on our website.
