Snow days off school were the best growing up, not sure what to think about "asynchronous" days that the NNPS kids just had.

Attendance at the Annual Meeting of Members and Community

Forum on Thursday January 9th was improved over the year prior, most likely motivated by a scheduled discussion of the Traffic Calming review process underway currently for a portion of Country Club. The City tried to make it understandable, as they also did a few weeks later at a meeting a Riverside Elementary, but it is challenging since they don't seem overly compelled to follow their own guide-lines. What we do know is that when a res-

ident expresses a concern, the City tries to balance the safety issues with all other considerations.

Nothing is set yet, and we are a long way from the second-to-last step, if it gets that far, for citizens to call in with their opinions after signs are posted. Having two City Councilmen in attendance may have helped convince the dedicated NNPD representatives to immediately increase law enforcement presence and ticketing. Officers issued 9 speeding citations the week after the annual meeting (vs. the 38 reported at the 2nd meeting which included areas outside of Riverside)

and traffic seems to have slowed. But please remember, traffic calming solutions like speed bumps wouldn't need to exist if we had unlimited law enforcement resources, and we know that isn't possible. Please be patient and let the process work. It is designed to let the citizens on Country Club who are most impacted start the process with a 75% majority. And for the rest of us, please share your opinion. It is representative government in action!

Thank you to all the officials from

City Hall, CNU, NNPD who addressed questions and concerns from the residents and to City Life Church for hosting us. We are truly grateful for the support you provide for the citizens of our special neighborhood.

We again failed to have a quorum required to conduct elections during the Annual Meeting of Members. The Board assumed responsibility to elect member-

ship for 2025, but we look forward to having enough in-person attendance and proxies to conduct a proper election next year.

Please note inside, a featured article by Treasurer and Improvements Committee chair Mac Collins. He details the need for a capital improvements project at the beach involving the damaged and deteriorating wall. We need to hire professionals for this one and potentially raise money beyond your normal generous donations. We welcome your expertise and advice, as we want to do this properly but economically.

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Beach Bulkhead/ Retaining Wall Compromised

A Major Capital Expense

The bulkhead/retaining wall that runs in front of the deck was designed and constructed in 1989 and repaired after hurricane Isabel in 2003. We are fortunate to have the original builder, local resident Jim Hopkins, as a consultant to teach us the lessons learned from observing the eroding effects of major storms over the years.

The missing section next to the neighbor's painted concrete wall was destroyed by a northeaster storm some years ago. The steep slope above it is beginning to collapse along with the supporting shrubs and trees. In addition, the section in front of the deck and benches has rotted and failed.

Because the beach is at the center of RCCA's mission to maintain it's property and encourage community engagement for our members, it must be preserved. We have initiated the process to design and build the best long-term solution to protect it from future flooding and storms. It's needed for the very survival of our community's most valuable asset. **Financing The Project**

The RCCA has accumulated a contingency fund by keeping annual expenses less than the generous do-

nations of our members, combined with the net advertising revenue from our quarterly newsletter. We

have been fortunate in past years not to have incurred major expenses, such as tree removal, and other damage from storms.

Additionally, most of our past infrastructure projects have been accomplished with volunteer labor and materials purchased directly from suppliers, or directly hiring inexpensive labor with oversite by the RCCA.



For this major capital improvement, that low-cost approach is not feasible due to the complexity, skill level and stringent design requirements. We are not yet certain of the cost of this critical project and hope to have budget estimates available soon to determine if we need to solicit additional funding from our membership.

Planned for the spring again on **Saturday**, **April 26**, the RCCA will coordinate advertising, but permits must be purchased by each participant at the Dresden police office. We will then add you to the neighborhood map of participating households.

The RCCA is organizing a cleanup effort on Saturday, April 5th from 9:00-12:00. Please help take care of our beautiful beach property and other areas of Riverside by bringing garden tools (rakes, loppers etc.) to clear brush and tidy up mulch beds after



out winter storms. We'll meet at the beach property at 9:00. Lunch will be provided for volunteers at 12:00. All are welcome, so feel to bring the family!

Easter Egg Hunt



On Saturday April 12, the RCCA will host our annual Easter Egg hunt starting at 10:00 at the beach. Each year, Riverside children attend and quickly recover the eggs carefully hidden by the Easter Bunny (and his helpers). This event is open to all Riverside residents and their

guests. There will be a supervised egg hunt for children (age 12 and under), entertainment, and treats. A special area for age 4 and under will be set up. In the case of inclement weather, this event will be moved to the Saturday before Easter, April 19th.



Lion's Bridge Dam Improvement

Riverside's only active City capital improvement project is coming to a close. On Feb. 24, the Lions Bridge Dam safety project passed its final walk thru with its primary construction contractor, Kokosing. They will be back later in the spring to reseed the slope and to plant wetland vegetation at the new shoreline. Kokosing is currently working on final record drawings. Construction closeout is expected at the end of May.


