Martha's Way Begins

As our Riverside neighbors who have walked down to Lions Bridge have seen, work on Martha's Way began a little over a month ago. Remember that Martha's Way, named in honor of Martha Goodson, serves two purposes: to provide a safer pedestrian route in between the Riverside community and the Lions Bridge and Noland Trail, and to provide a safer vantage point of the James River in front of Kettle Pond for everyone that visits the Lions Bridge.

It is easiest to think about Martha's Way in three parts or components:

1) Widen Museum Parkway through the curve in front of 101 Museum Parkway to Riverside Drive.

2) Build a boardwalk with two overlooks immediate-

ly adjacent to Lions Bridge.

3) Develop a walking path, Martha's Way, that will run parallel to Museum parkway, ending at the new boardwalk.

The Mariners' contractor for the project, Blair Brothers, has begun work on "Phase I" of Martha's Way: the widening of Museum Parkway and construction of the connecting path. This work can proceed while the work on Lions Bridge is underway. "Phase II," of Martha's Way, the construction of the boardwalk and overlooks, will begin upon the conclusion of the Lions Bridge work. We staggered the project in this way because there is a slight overlap between the footprints of the two construction projects that necessitated one project going first and the other going second. We wanted to be sure to minimize foot and other traffic during the Lions Bridge work.

Despite some weather delays, progress continues. Stay tuned for future updates as we draw closer to the completion of both the Lions Bridge work and the start of Phase II of Martha's Way!


