
LOCATION & GOOGLE MAPS

Tramvia Line T1, with the nearest stop at Statuto (15 minutes away), offers a quick route to Santa Maria Novella and Florence Airport.


Bakery: Enjoy freshly baked bread and pastries at Panificio S. Forno, a charming local bakery perfect for breakfast or snacks.
