

Grade Level: Elementary K-2

Objective: Understand the themes of self-improvement, teamwork, and positive transformation by identifying character traits and how they change throughout the story.

Materials Needed: A copy of "*Donkey Dell*" by Jaybie D., chart paper, markers, drawing paper, crayons/colored pencils, and character trait cards. Optional teamwork activity materials (e.g., building blocks, puzzles).

Introduction (10 minutes): Brief discussion on what it means to be stubborn. Ask if they know anyone who is stubborn and how that affects their behavior. Explain that today's lesson will be about a donkey named Dell who learns valuable lessons about self-improvement and teamwork.

Read Aloud (15 minutes): Read the book and pause at key points to ask predictive and reflective questions. "What do you think Dell will do next or how is he feeling right now?"

Discussion (10 minutes): Create a chart with three columns: Beginning, Middle, End. Fill in character traits with student input, discussing self-improvement and teamwork. "How did Dell change from the beginning to the end?" "Why is teamwork important?"

Activity (15 minutes): Pass out character trait card (e.g., determined, brave, stubborn) and draw a scene from the book that illustrates their character trait. Divide into small groups and give them a task that requires teamwork (e.g., building a tower with blocks). After the activity, discuss how they worked together and what they learned.

Conclusion (10 minutes): Share and discuss the drawings. Recap the lessons learned from "*Donkey Dell*." Emphasize the importance of self-improvement and working together.

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Extension Activities (Optional): Have students write a short story about a time they learned something new or worked as part of a team. Create a mural of scenes from "Donkey Dell" that show teamwork and self-improvement.
