Grade Level: Preschool to Kindergarten Ages 3-5

Objective: Introduction to the fun and tradition of Halloween. Encourage discussions about bravery, safety, and what to expect. Engage in art projects inspired by the book.

Materials Needed: A copy of "WHISKER WATCHERS" by Jaybie D. Drawing paper, crayons, construction paper, glue, scissors, flashlights (optional for a "nighttime" effect).

Introduction (5 minutes): Begin with a brief discussion about Halloween. Ask if they have dressed up for Halloween and/or if they are planning to this year. Explain that today's lesson is about special cats called the "WHISKER WATCHERS" who keep kids candy safe on Halloween.

Read Aloud (10 minutes): Read the book using expressive voices. Point to illustrations and ask interactive questions to keep the children engaged.

Discussion (10 minutes): Encourage sharing what they like about Halloween and simple safety tips (e.g., holding an adult's hand, using a flashlight). Discuss how the "WHISKER WATCHERS" help the children feel safe.

Activity (15 minutes): Re-read parts of the book and focus on the details that show safety (e.g., lights, ropes). Point these out and explain them simply and/or ask the children to point out safety features in the pictures. Provide drawing paper and crayons for children to draw their own "WHISKER WATCHERS" or other safe Halloween scene.

Conclusion (5 minutes): Share and discuss the drawings. Recap the thrill of Halloween and the importance of staying safe, emphasizing that Halloween is pretend and meant for fun.

Extension Activities (Optional): Have a mini-parade in the classroom to show off their drawings or simple costumes/face masks. Role-play saying "trick or treat" and receiving candy, emphasizing polite behavior. Reinforce safety, such as walking not running), staying together, looking both ways, holding hands, waiting to eat candy, etc.
