

That young man was B.J. Barnes. He lived with his mom (Lisa Barnes) and sister in Antioch, TN. During B.J.'s adolescent years, there were several occasions when Lisa would need to enlist the voice and authority of B.J. 's surrogate father, and that surrogate father was Bill Allen. The love, discipline and example Bill and his family displayed was transformational for young B.J.

B.J. completed the program in 2007 and today is an auto technician at Nelson Mazda. He and his wife Lori are the parents of two daughters Aravee, and Avella and are homeowners living in the Nashville area.

He has expressed his gratitude for the Family Foundation Fund mentoring program preparing him for his responsibilities as a husband and father B.J. shared, "it was the love and determination of his mother, the advocacy of his surrogate father, and life principles he learned as a FFF son, has resulted in a husband/father who is present and attentive to the care of his family.






MONTRELL TURNER

Diane Reynolds enrolled her son Montrell Turner into the Family Foundation Fund mentoring program in 1996, which was our "litmus test" for the FFF educational program. Until Montrel entered our program, all of the FFF sons attended public schools. One of the FFF board members was inspired to make the connection between Lighthouse Christian School (LCS) and the Cal Turner Family Foundation.

Montrel was the first FFF son to graduate from Lighthouse Christian School in May 2000. After graduation, he attended MTSU, after two





years at MTSU, he joined the U.S. Navy and served his country. While in the Navy, he completed his Bachelor's Degree from Ashford University.

He remained in the Navy five years, and after completion of his term moved back to Nashville and completed his Masters Degree in Criminal Justice from Bethel University.

Montrel and Jessica married in 2015, but unfortunately the marriage did not endure. He is currently employed for the Department of Veteran Affairs here in Nashville, TN.

Montrel attributes his faith and ability to overcome difficult situations to the principles he learned as a FFF son. "Never allow a mistake or misstep to define you. Always pray, believe and trust God in all things. Men are held responsible for the status of their households."



RICKIE MCDOWELL SR.

On Friday November 20th, I was honored to speak at the Life Celebration of Rickie McDowell Sr., affectionately known as "Big Rickie." Big Rickie completed his life journey with a wonderful celebration held at Immanuel Missionary Baptist Church. As I listened to friends and relatives speak about his life there was a recurring expression of his love, care for people, protection, and care for his family.

I met Big Rickie in 2014 when he approached me about his son Rickie Jr. becoming a Family Foundation Fund son. He said to me "Mr. Kirk, Coach Victor Wharton told me about your mentoring program and how the lives of young men growing up without a father are transformed and I want to know if you would accept me and my son into the FFF mentoring program? I am a father but I don't know anything about fathering and I don't want my son to have to experience the life I have lived. I was in prison for eleven years and have lived my life on the streets. I want to be there for my son. I just don't know anything about being a father." I took his request to the heavenly FATHER and the Most High's response was to father both he and his son, Rickie Jr."

Rickie Jr. graduated high school in 2019, unsure of what to do with his life, prayed and sought counsel with his father and I, and decided to pursue a career of armed service. However, in order to enlist in the U.S. Air Force he needed to lose forty pounds. By perseverance and dedication, today he is an Airman stationed in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Big Rickie would always refer to me as Papa Onnie, and I would always refer to him as son. His spirit has returned home to be with the FATHER, yet his legacy of humility, love and care for people will live on through his son, Rickie T. McDowell, Jr., United States Airman.

COLORADO

INTENTIONAL FATHERHOOD

How many of us understand that the characteristics of the human soul (defined: our mind, will, and emotions) comes directly through the bloodline of our earthly father. God the Father of mankind only fathered two souls: one being the soul of his first son, Adam (Eve's soul came out of Adam), the other one being his only "begotten Son" Yeshua (Jesus.)
