

Lesson Plan: "Life Lessons from 'The Falling Star Repairman"

Objective:

To help students understand and internalize important life lessons through discussions and activities based on the story "The Falling Star Repairman."

Lesson Plan:

1. Introduction (10 minutes)

4. Wrap-Up and Review (5 minutes)
