

Reasons to object:

- 1) Inappropriate design, layout and density adversely affecting residential amenity
- Height and bulk of proposed buildings would overshadow existing homes, blocking daylight and sunlight in breach of BRE guidance
- Noise and privacy issues from windows, balconies and terraces close to and overlooking existing residents
- Poor quality amenity and play space with limited sunlight, squeezed in around buildings and busy routes through the site
- Delivery and servicing access and parking inadequate for size of development
- 2) Detrimental impact on heritage assets and conservation areas
- Large bulky buildings between 3 and 14 storeys would have a detrimental impact on Brook Drive, Renfrew Road, Elliot's Row, Walcot Square, St. Mary's Gardens and West Square Conservation Areas
- Detrimental impact on setting of heritage assets: the Grade II Listed Water Tower and Cinema
 Museum building would be negatively impacted next to a 14-storey tower
- 3) Impact on surrounding Kennington area
- Tall and bulky design does not respond to character of low-rise surrounding area which is outside of the Elephant and Castle tall buildings cluster
- Sets precedent for more tall buildings across Kennington

4) The current planning application does not address all of the six issues that the Planning Inspector raised with the previous proposal at the site and are a material consideration for this planning application
