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Preparing for a flea treatment inside the home

When preparing for a flea treatment you must keep in mind that fleas will not be solved by just spraying the home, if animals are in the home the animals must be treated for fleas prior to treatment.

- Vacuum all floors throughout entire home
- Mop all hard surface floor with bleach water (Concrete floors must be mopped with bleach water twice prior to treatment)
- Vacuum or wash all cloth materials that fleas could harbor in such a throw blankets, pet beds, couches, beds ect.
- Clean areas with excessive pet hair (around baseboards, inside duct work, cracks in the flooring etc..)
- All items should be picked up off the floor and placed on a non upholstered surface
- Cover all opens containers (food on counters, pet food bowls, baked goods, etc..)

After treatment for fleas inside the home

- Do not vacuum carpeted areas for 14 or more days.
- Avoid heavy cleaning of hard surfaces
- Clean any pesticide residue with a damp rag
- If any dust is noticeable after treatment it is okay to clean with a damp rag
- Due to the hatching process, you may see fleas for up to 4 weeks after treatment.

Flea treatments require the house to be vacated for 6-8 hours after treatment has been applied to give the product time to dry. If product is still damp when you return to the home you may need to open the windows and run a fan. (most of the time this is not needed.)
