In this season of Lent we have been holding mid-week services on Wednesdays at 6:30pm. We have been using a setting of Compline (Prayer at Close of Day) from the Anglican tradition. Pr. Anderson has been preaching at these services on the Psalm from the previous Sunday. The service is about thirty minutes long and is a fine way to keep a holy Lent.

As we approach Holy Week we will of course do what we can to worship faithfully and safely.

Good Friday (4/2) in-person Holy Communion 6:30pm

Easter Sunday (4/4) in-person Holy Communion 9:00am and 10:30am

The usual Facebook/Web page services will be posted for the Sundays as usual. Plans are still in the works for posting something for the extra services in Holy Week.

We also will, of course, continue to use the sanitizing protocols that we have used all along for in-person worship: alternate pews roped off, three people per pew, masks required, social distancing, hand sanitizer readily available, and sanitizing between services. Pr. Anderson administers the Communion with mask and gloves and gold tongs so that the host (bread) is untouched until the communicant receives it. We do not currently offer the wine for Communion.

At its most recent meeting the Church Council received reports/acted on the following issues:

- 1). Repairs to the roof are scheduled to begin in early April.
- 2). The bell tower of the mountain chapel needs to be inspected to see if repairs are called for.
- 3). Council approved building use by an additional NA group and an AA group. There are weekly NA meetings now at St. Paul's on Saturdays and Sundays 6:00-8:00pm, and an AA meeting on Thursdays 7:00-8:30pm.
- 4). The worship schedule for Holy Week and Easter.
- 5). The desirability of having a scaled-back financial audit later this year.
- 6). We will look further into music resources for enriching worship as we pray for the healing of our organist and as we wait for the day when we might again be able to praise God with full-throated singing.
